TCEQ hiring managers will be present to conduct interviews for the position(s) listed below. Candidates should bring a photo copy of their official transcripts and a completed State of Texas application. Candidates who meet the minimum qualifications may be provided an opportunity to interview.

Please note: This event is open to UTRGV-Edinburg and UTRGV-Brownsville students and alumni only. Eligible candidates will be considered for interview slots on a first-come, first-served basis the day of the event. Applications will not be accepted prior to this hiring event.

Condition of Employment:

TCEQ will verify Selective Service registration for males born on or after January 1, 1960. If exempt from Selective Service registration selected candidate must provide proof of exemption on first day of employment.

Offers of employment are contingent on the candidate having legal authorization to work for the TCEQ.

TCEQ will conduct a criminal history records search on candidates selected for posted vacancies.

Only applicants who are interviewed will receive written non-selection notification.

Environmental Investigator II (Harlingen), Posting X16001, \$3081.33 (monthly)

Job Description:

Performs technical work in the fields of environmental pollution for the Harlingen Regional Office of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ). Conducts technical inspections, surveys, and follow-up investigations; prepares reports which document field activities and observed conditions. Conducts environmental monitoring; and prepares technical papers regarding studies involving environmental subjects. Assists with the collection and analysis of environmental samples. Provides technical assistance to the public, regulated community, and other interested groups regarding the application of appropriate regulations.

Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) Codes: 72D, 8831, 8E000, and 9S100

Minimum Qualifications:

A bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university, with a major in a natural or physical science, engineering, environmental studies, or related field (COPY OF OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT REQUIRED WITH APPLICATION).

One year of full-time experience in the field of environmental activities directly related to the examples of work performed may be substituted for each year (30 semester hours) of the required education.

Special Requirements:

Moving up to 35 pounds of equipment/samples.

Climbing to heights of 40 feet without acrophobia.

Working more than 40 hours per week, as needed, to complete assignments, or to assist with emergency response efforts.

Traveling up to 50% of the time.
