Before me, the undersigned authority, personally appeared Ron Anderson, a person known by me to be competent and qualified in all respects to make this affidavit, who being by me first duly sworn, deposed as follows:

1. I am over 21 years of age, of sound mind, and have never been convicted of a felony or crime of moral turpitude. I am fully competent and qualified in all respects to make this affidavit.
2. The facts stated in this affidavit are within my personal knowledge and are true and correct.
3. I, Ron Anderson, am an individual residing in Austin, Texas.
4. I have previously provided an affidavit dated December 10, 2013 in this proceeding. This supplemental affidavit is intended to supplement that affidavit with additional information regarding the drought situation.
5. Annual evaporation from LCRA's five Highland Lakes (Buchanan, Inks, LBJ, Marble Falls and Travis) plus Lake Austin for 2010, 2011 and 2012 are presented below:

Year	Total Evaporation (acre-feet)
2010	183,923
2011	192,404
2012	144,759
2013	120,899

6. The projected total evaporation under extreme drought conditions (similar to 2011) if LCRA were to follow the 2010 Water Management Plan in 2014 would be approximately 135,000 acre-feet.


7. The probabilities of conditions being met for a declaration of Drought Worse than Drought of Record (DWDR) as of January 1, 2014 (including combined storage in lakes Buchanan and Travis falling below 600,000 acre-feet) are summarized as follows:


Scenario	DWDR by Aug. 31, 2014
