AGREED ORDER
DOCKET NO. 2006-1614-DCL-E

I. JURISDICTION AND STIPULATIONS

At its _____ agenda, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("the Commission" or "TCEQ") considered this agreement of the parties, resolving an enforcement action regarding Azam Enterprises, Inc. dba Bluebonnet Cleaners ("Azam Enterprises, Inc.") under the authority of TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ch. 374 and TEX. WATER CODE ch. 7. The Executive Director of the TCEQ, through the Enforcement Division, and Azam Enterprises, Inc. appear before the Commission and together stipulate that:

1. Azam Enterprises, Inc. owns and operates a dry cleaning drop station at 3253 Southwest Freeway in Houston, Harris County, Texas (the "Facility").
2. The TCEQ has general authority to regulate the Facility pursuant to TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 374.051.
3. The Commission and Azam Enterprises, Inc. agree that the Commission has jurisdiction to enter this Agreed Order, and that Azam Enterprises, Inc. is subject to the Commission's jurisdiction.
4. Azam Enterprises, Inc. received notice of the violations alleged in Section II ("Allegations") on or about September 5, 2006.
5. The occurrence of any violation is in dispute and the entry of this Agreed Order shall not constitute an admission by Azam Enterprises, Inc. of any violation alleged in Section II ("Allegations"), nor of any statute or rule.
6. An administrative penalty in the amount of One Thousand Sixty-Seven Dollars (\$1,067) is assessed by the Commission in settlement of the violations alleged in Section II ("Allegations"). Azam Enterprises, Inc. has paid One Hundred Forty-Eight Dollars (\$148) of the administrative penalty and Two Hundred Fourteen Dollars (\$214) is deferred contingent upon Azam Enterprises, Inc.'s timely and satisfactory compliance with all the terms of this Agreed Order. The deferred amount will be

waived upon full compliance with the terms of this Agreed Order. If Azam Enterprises, Inc. fails to timely and satisfactorily comply with all requirements of this Agreed Order, the Executive Director may require Azam Enterprises, Inc. to pay all or part of the deferred penalty.

The remaining amount of Seven Hundred Five Dollars (\$705) of the administrative penalty shall be payable in six monthly payments of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) each and one final payment of One Hundred Five Dollars (\$105). The next monthly payment shall be paid within 30 days after the effective date of this Agreed Order. The subsequent payments shall each be paid not later than 30 days following the due date of the previous payment until paid in full. If Azam Enterprises, Inc. fails to timely and satisfactorily comply with the payment requirements of this Agreed Order, the Executive Director may, at the Executive Director's option, accelerate the maturity of the remaining installments, in which event the unpaid balance shall become immediately due and payable without demand or notice. In addition, the failure of Azam Enterprises, Inc. to meet the payment schedule of this Agreed Order constitutes the failure by Azam Enterprises, Inc. to timely and satisfactorily comply with all the terms of this Agreed Order.

7. Any notice and procedures which might otherwise be authorized or required in this action are waived in the interest of a more timely resolution of the matter.
8. The Executive Director of the TCEQ and Azam Enterprises, Inc. have agreed on a settlement of the matters alleged in this enforcement action, subject to the approval of the Commission.
9. The Executive Director recognizes that Azam Enterprises, Inc. has completed and submitted the required registration form to the TCEQ on September 11, 2006.
10. The Executive Director may, without further notice or hearing, refer this matter to the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas ("OAG") for further enforcement proceedings if the Executive Director determines that Azam Enterprises, Inc. has not complied with one or more of the terms or conditions in this Agreed Order.
11. This Agreed Order shall terminate five years from its effective date or upon compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreed Order, whichever is later.
12. The provisions of this Agreed Order are deemed severable and, if a court of competent jurisdiction or other appropriate authority deems any provision of this Agreed Order unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and enforceable.

II. ALLEGATIONS

As owner and operator of the Facility, Azam Enterprises, Inc. is alleged to have failed to renew the registration by completing and submitting the required registration form to the TCEQ, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 337.11(e) and TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 374.102, as documented during an investigation conducted on May 23, 2006.

III. DENIALS

Azam Enterprises, Inc. generally denies each allegation in Section II ("Allegations").

IV. ORDERING PROVISIONS

1. It is, therefore, ordered by the TCEQ that Azam Enterprises, Inc. pay an administrative penalty as set forth in Section I, Paragraph 6 above. The payment of this administrative penalty and Azam Enterprises, Inc.'s compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreed Order resolve only the allegations in Section II. The Commission shall not be constrained in any manner from requiring corrective action or penalties for violations which are not raised here. 2. The provisions of this Agreed Order shall apply to and be binding upon Azam Enterprises, Inc. Azam Enterprises, Inc. is ordered to give notice of the Agreed Order to personnel who maintain day-to-day control over the Facility operations referenced in this Agreed Order.
3. If Azam Enterprises, Inc. fails to comply with any of the Ordering Provisions in this Agreed Order within the prescribed schedules, and that failure is caused solely by an act of God, war, strike, riot, or other catastrophe, Azam Enterprises, Inc.'s failure to comply is not a violation of this Agreed Order. Azam Enterprises, Inc. shall have the burden of establishing to the Executive Director's satisfaction that such an event has occurred. Azam Enterprises, Inc. shall notify the Executive Director within seven days after Azam Enterprises, Inc. becomes aware of a delaying event and shall take all reasonable measures to mitigate and minimize any delay.
4. The Executive Director may grant an extension of any deadline in this Agreed Order or in any plan, report, or other document submitted pursuant to this Agreed Order, upon a written and substantiated showing of good cause. All requests for extensions by Azam Enterprises, Inc. shall be made in writing to the Executive Director. Extensions are not effective until Azam Enterprises, Inc. receives written approval from the Executive Director. The determination of what constitutes good cause rests solely with the Executive Director.
5. This Agreed Order, issued by the Commission, shall not be admissible against Azam Enterprises, Inc. in a civil proceeding, unless the proceeding is brought by the OAG to: (1) enforce the terms of this Agreed Order; or (2) pursue violations of a statute within the Commission's jurisdiction, or of a rule adopted or an order or permit issued by the Commission under such a statute.

8. The eighth part of the document provides a final summary and conclusion. It reiterates the key points of the document and expresses confidence in the value of the data-driven approach to organizational management.

9. The ninth part of the document includes a list of references and a list of figures and tables. The references cite the various sources of information used in the study, and the figures and tables provide visual representations of the data and results.

10. The tenth part of the document is a concluding statement that expresses the author's appreciation for the support and assistance provided by the organization and its staff throughout the course of the study.

6. This agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, which together shall constitute a single original instrument. Any executed signature page to this Agreement may be transmitted by facsimile transmission to the other parties, which shall constitute an original signature for all purposes.
7. Under 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.10(b), the effective date is the date of hand-delivery of the Order to Azam Enterprises, Inc., or three days after the date on which the Commission mails notice of the Order to Azam Enterprises, Inc., whichever is earlier. The Chief Clerk shall provide a copy of this Agreed Order to each of the parties.
