AGREED ORDER

I. JURISDICTION AND STIPULATIONS

At its \_\_\_\_\_ agenda, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("the Commission" or "TCEQ") considered this agreement of the parties, resolving an enforcement action regarding William B. Colwell dba Star Mart 3 ("Mr. Colwell") under the authority of TEX. WATER CODE chs. 7 and 26. The Executive Director of the TCEQ, through the Enforcement Division, and Mr. Colwell appear before the Commission and together stipulate that:

1. Mr. Colwell owns and operates a convenience store with retail sales of gasoline located at the intersection of Main Street and Elm Street in Waxahachie, Ellis County, Texas ("the "Facility").
2. Mr. Colwell's three USTs are not exempt or excluded from regulation under the Texas Water Code or the rules of the Commission.
3. The Commission and Mr. Colwell agree that the Commission has jurisdiction to enter this Agreed Order, and that Mr. Colwell is subject to the Commission's jurisdiction.
4. Mr. Colwell received notice of the violations alleged in Section II ("Allegations") on or about July 13, 2005.
5. The occurrence of any violation is in dispute and the entry of this Agreed Order shall not constitute an admission by Mr. Colwell of any violation alleged in Section II ("Allegations"), nor of any statute or rule.
6. An administrative penalty in the amount of One Thousand Eight Hundred Seventy-Five Dollars (\$1,875) is assessed by the Commission in settlement of the violations alleged in Section II ("Allegations"). Mr. Colwell has paid One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500) of the administrative penalty and Three Hundred Seventy-Five Dollars (\$375) is deferred contingent upon Mr. Colwell's timely and satisfactory compliance with all the terms of this Agreed Order. The



- deferred amount will be waived upon full compliance with the terms of this Agreed Order. If Mr. Colwell fails to timely and satisfactorily comply with all requirements of this Agreed Order, the Executive Director may require Mr. Colwell to pay all or part of the deferred penalty.
7. Any notice and procedures which might otherwise be authorized or required in this action are waived in the interest of a more timely resolution of the matter.
  8. The Executive Director of the TCEQ and Mr. Colwell have agreed on a settlement of the matters alleged in this enforcement action, subject to the approval of the Commission.
  9. The Executive Director recognizes that Mr. Colwell submitted documentation to the TCEQ indicating that all three USTs were successfully tested on June 27, 2005.
  10. The Executive Director may, without further notice or hearing, refer this matter to the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas ("OAG") for further enforcement proceedings if the Executive Director determines that Mr. Colwell has not complied with one or more of the terms or conditions in this Agreed Order.
  11. This Agreed Order shall terminate five years from its effective date or upon compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreed Order, whichever is later.
  12. The provisions of this Agreed Order are deemed severable and, if a court of competent jurisdiction or other appropriate authority deems any provision of this Agreed Order unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and enforceable.

## **II. ALLEGATIONS**

As owner and operator of the Facility, Mr. Colwell is alleged to have failed to monitor the UST system for releases at a frequency of at least once per month (not to exceed 35 days between each monitoring), in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 334.50(b)(1)(A) and TEX. WATER CODE § 26.3475(c)(1), as documented during an investigation conducted on June 8, 2005.

## **III. DENIALS**

Mr. Colwell generally denies each allegation in Section II ("Allegations").

## **IV. ORDERING PROVISIONS**

1. It is, therefore, ordered by the TCEQ that Mr. Colwell pay an administrative penalty as set forth in Section I, Paragraph 6 above. The imposition of this administrative penalty and Mr. Colwell's compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreed Order resolve only the allegations in Section II. The Commission shall not be constrained in any manner from requiring corrective action or penalties for violations which are not raised here. Administrative penalty

2. The provisions of this Agreed Order shall apply to and be binding upon Mr. Colwell. Mr. Colwell is ordered to give notice of the Agreed Order to personnel who maintain day-to-day control over the Facility operations referenced in this Agreed Order.
3. This Agreed Order, issued by the Commission, shall not be admissible against Mr. Colwell in a civil proceeding, unless the proceeding is brought by the OAG to: (1) enforce the terms of this Agreed Order; or (2) pursue violations of a statute within the Commission's jurisdiction, or of a rule adopted or an order or permit issued by the Commission under such a statute.
4. This agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, which together shall constitute a single original instrument. Any executed signature page to this Agreement may be transmitted by facsimile transmission to the other parties, which shall constitute an original signature for all purposes.
5. Under 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.10(b), the effective date is the date of hand-delivery of the Order to Mr. Colwell, or three days after the date on which the Commission mails notice of the Order to Mr. Colwell, whichever is earlier. The Chief Clerk shall provide a copy of this Agreed Order to each of the parties.
