At its _____ agenda, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, ("Commission" or "TCEQ") considered the Executive Director's Preliminary Report and Petition filed pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE ch. 7; TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ch. 361; and the rules of the TCEQ, which requests appropriate relief, including the imposition of an administrative penalty and corrective action of the respondent. The respondent made the subject of this Order is Charles D. Hodges dba North Western Excavation and Dirt Landfill, LLP ("Mr. Hodges").

The Commission makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. At the time of the violations Mr. Hodges operated unauthorized disposal facilities on real property located at 1016 Oak Grove Road, Fort Worth, Tarrant County, Texas (the "Site No. 1") and at 5200 East Loop 820 South, Fort Worth, Tarrant County, Texas (the "Site No. 2").
2. The Sites involved the disposal of municipal solid waste as defined in TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ch. 361.
3. During an inspection conducted on March 11, 2005, a TCEQ Dallas/Fort Worth Regional investigator documented that Mr. Hodges failed to prevent the disposal of municipal solid waste at an unauthorized facility. Specifically, as the operator of an unauthorized disposal facility located on property owned by the Texas Conference of Seventh Day Adventists ("Site No. 1"), Mr. Hodges received and disposed of approximately 121,000 cubic yards of construction debris including fresh asphalt, brush, wood 2" x 4"s, sheet particle board/plyboard, wall board/sheet rock, insulation material, air conditioning and heating conduit, concrete with iron rebar, plastic five-gallon buckets, plastic sheeting, a lead acid battery, used tires, asphaltic shingles and municipal trash.

4. During an inspection conducted on March 24, 2005, a TCEQ Dallas/Fort Worth Regional investigator documented that Mr. Hodges failed to prevent the disposal of municipal solid waste at an unauthorized facility. Specifically, as the operator of an unauthorized disposal facility located on property owned by Central Freight Lines, Inc. ("Site No. 2"), Mr. Hodges received and disposed of municipal solid waste which included brush, trees, construction debris, plywood, lumber, sheet plastic, plastic containers, tires, PVC pipe, iron T-posts, rebar, and other non inert materials.
5. Mr. Hodges received notice of the violations on or about May 29, 2005 and August 2, 2005.
6. The Executive Director filed the "Executive Director's Preliminary Report and Petition Recommending that the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality Enter an Enforcement Order Assessing an Administrative Penalty Against and Requiring Certain Actions of Charles D. Hodges dba North Western Excavation and Dirt Landfill, LLP" (the "EDPRP") in the TCEQ Chief Clerk's office on July 19, 2007.
7. By letter dated July 19, 2007, sent via certified mail, return receipt requested, and via first class mail, postage prepaid, the Executive Director served Mr. Hodges with notice of the EDPRP. According to the return receipt "green card," Mr. Hodges received notice of the EDPRP on July 20, 2007, as evidenced by his signature on the card.
8. More than 20 days have elapsed since Mr. Hodges received notice of the EDPRP, provided by the Executive Director. Mr. Hodges failed to file an answer to the EDPRP, failed to request a hearing, and failed to schedule a settlement conference.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. As evidenced by Finding of Fact Nos. 1 and 2, Mr. Hodges is subject to the jurisdiction of the TCEQ pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE ch. 7; TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ch. 361 and the rules of the Commission.
2. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 3, Mr. Hodges failed to prevent the disposal of municipal solid waste at an unauthorized facility. Specifically, as the operator of an unauthorized disposal facility located on property owned by the Texas Conference of Seventh Day Adventists ("Site No. 1"), Mr. Hodges received and disposed of approximately 121,000 cubic yards of construction debris including fresh asphalt, brush, wood 2" x 4"s, sheet particle board/plyboard, wall board/sheet rock, insulation material, air conditioning and heating conduit, concrete with iron rebar, plastic five-gallon buckets, plastic sheeting, a lead

acid battery, used tires, asphaltic shingles and municipal trash, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 330.5(c).

3. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 4, Mr. Hodges failed to prevent the disposal of municipal solid waste at an unauthorized facility. Specifically, as the operator of an unauthorized disposal facility located on property owned by Central Freight Lines, Inc. ("Site No. 2"), Mr. Hodges received and disposed of municipal solid waste which included brush, trees, construction debris, plywood, lumber, sheet plastic, plastic containers, tires, PVC pipe, iron, T-posts, rebar, and other non inert materials, in violation of TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 330.5(c).
4. As evidenced by Finding of Fact Nos. 6 and 7, the Executive Director timely served Mr. Hodges with proper notice of the EDPRP, as required by TEX. WATER CODE § 7.055 and 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.104(a).
5. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 8, Mr. Hodges failed to file a timely answer to the EDPRP, as required by TEX. WATER CODE § 7.056 and 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.105. Pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE § 7.057 and 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.106, the Commission may enter a Default Order against Mr. Hodges and assess the penalty recommended by the Executive Director.
6. Pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE § 7.051, the Commission has the authority to assess an administrative penalty against Mr. Hodges for violations of the Texas Health and Safety Code within the Commission's jurisdiction; for violations of rules adopted under such statutes; or for violations of orders or permits issued under such statutes.
7. An administrative penalty in the amount of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) is justified by the facts recited in this Order, and considered in light of the factors set forth in TEX. WATER CODE § 7.053.
8. TEX. WATER CODE §§ 5.102 and 7.002 authorize the Commission to issue orders and make determinations necessary to effectuate the purposes of the statutes within its jurisdiction.

ORDERING PROVISIONS

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY
ORDERS that:

1. Mr. Hodges is assessed an administrative penalty in the amount of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) for violations of the Texas Health & Safety Code ch. 361 and rules of the TCEQ. The payment of this administrative penalty and Mr. Hodges' compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Order completely resolve the matters set forth by this Order in this action. The Commission shall not be constrained in any manner from requiring corrective actions or penalties for other violations which are not raised here. All checks submitted to pay the penalty imposed by this Order shall be made out to the "Texas Commission on Environmental Quality." The administrative penalty assessed by this Order shall be paid within 30 days after the effective date of this Order and shall be sent with the notation "Re: Charles D. Hodges dba North Western Excavation and Dirt Landfill, LLP; Docket No. 2005-1040-MSW-E" to:

2. Mr. Hodges shall undertake the following technical requirements:
 - a. Immediately upon the effective date of this Order, Mr. Hodges shall cease accepting any additional waste material at Site No. 1 and Site No. 2;
 - b. Within 180 days after the effective date of this Order, Mr. Hodges shall remove and dispose of all waste material at Site No. 1 and Site No. 2 at an authorized facility; and
 - c. Within 210 days after the effective date of this Order, Mr. Hodges shall submit written certification as described below, and include detailed supporting documentation including photographs, receipts, and/or other records to demonstrate compliance with Ordering Provision Nos. 2.a. and 2.b.

The certification shall be notarized by a State of Texas Notary Public and include the following certification language:

"I certify under penalty of law that I have personally examined and am familiar with the information submitted and all attached documents, and that based on my inquiry of those individuals immediately responsible for obtaining the information, I believe that the submitted information is true,

accurate and complete. I am aware that there are significant penalties for submitting false information, including the possibility of fine and imprisonment for knowing violations.”

3. All relief not expressly granted in this Order is denied.
4. The provisions of this Order shall apply to and be binding upon Mr. Hodges. Mr. Hodges is ordered to give notice of this Order to personnel who maintain day-to-day control over the Site operations referenced in this Order.
5. If Mr. Hodges fails to comply with any of the Ordering Provisions in this Order within the prescribed schedules, and that failure is caused solely by an act of God, war, strike, riot, or other catastrophe, Mr. Hodges' failure to comply is not a violation of this Order. Mr. Hodges shall have the burden of establishing to the Executive Director's satisfaction that such an event has occurred. Mr. Hodges shall notify the Executive Director within seven days after Mr. Hodges becomes aware of a delaying event and shall take all reasonable measures to mitigate and minimize any delay.
6. The Executive Director may grant an extension of any deadline in this Order or in any plan, report, or other document submitted pursuant to this Order, upon a written and substantiated showing of good cause. All requests for extensions by Mr. Hodges shall be made in writing to the Executive Director. Extensions are not effective until Mr. Hodges receives written

approval from the Executive Director. The determination of what constitutes good cause rests solely with the Executive Director.

7. The Executive Director may refer this matter to the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas ("OAG") for further enforcement proceedings without notice to Mr. Hodges if the Executive Director determines that Mr. Hodges has not complied with one or more of the terms or conditions in this Order.
8. This Order shall terminate five years from its effective date or upon compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Order, whichever is later.
9. The Chief Clerk shall provide a copy of this Order to each of the parties. By law, the effective date of this Order shall be the date the Order is final, as provided by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.106(d) and TEX. GOV'T CODE § 2001.144.


