DEFAULT ORDER DOCKET NO. 2006-0836-AIR-E

At its _____ agenda, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, ("Commission" or "TCEQ") considered the Executive Director's Preliminary Report and Petition filed pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE ch. 7, TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ch. 382, and the rules of the TCEQ, which requests appropriate relief, including the imposition of an administrative penalty and corrective action of the respondent. The respondent made the subject of this Order is Houston Precast, Inc. ("Houston Precast").

The Commission makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Houston Precast owns and operates a specialty concrete batch plant located at 11393 Sleepy Hollow Road, Conroe, Montgomery County, Texas (the "Plant").
2. The Plant consists of one or more sources as defined in TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 382.003(12).
3. During inspections conducted on May 17, 18, and 19, 2006, a TCEQ Houston Regional Office investigator documented that Houston Precast failed to obtain authorization prior to constructing and operating a specialty concrete batch plant.
4. Houston Precast received notice of the violation on or about June 27, 2006.
5. The Executive Director recognizes that Houston Precast:
 - a. ceased operation of the Plant on May 19, 2006; and
 - b. submitted a permit application for the Plant on May 26, 2006.

6. The Executive Director filed the "Executive Director's Preliminary Report and Petition Recommending that the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality Enter an Enforcement Order Assessing an Administrative Penalty Against and Requiring Certain Actions of Houston Precast, Inc." (the "EDPRP") in the TCEQ Chief Clerk's office on September 28, 2006.
7. By letter dated September 28, 2006, sent via certified mail, return receipt requested, and via first class mail, postage prepaid, the Executive Director served Houston Precast with notice of the EDPRP. According to the return receipt "green card," Houston Precast received notice of the EDPRP on September 30, 2006, as evidenced by the signature on the card.
8. More than 20 days have elapsed since Houston Precast received notice of the EDPRP provided by the Executive Director. Houston Precast failed to file an answer to the EDPRP, failed to request a hearing, and failed to schedule a settlement conference.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. As evidenced by Finding of Fact Nos. 1 and 2, Houston Precast is subject to the jurisdiction of the TCEQ pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE ch. 7, TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ch. 382 and the rules of the Commission.
2. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 3, Houston Precast failed to obtain authorization prior to constructing and operating a specialty concrete batch plant in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 116.110(a)(2)(A) and TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE §§ 382.085(b) and 382.0518(a).
3. As evidenced by Finding of Fact Nos. 6 and 7, the Executive Director timely served Houston Precast with proper notice of the EDPRP, as required by TEX. WATER CODE § 7.055 and 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.104(a).
4. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 8, Houston Precast failed to file a timely answer to the EDPRP, as required by TEX. WATER CODE § 7.056 and 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.105. Pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE § 7.057 and 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.106, the Commission may enter a Default Order against Houston Precast and assess the penalty recommended by the Executive Director.
5. Pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE § 7.051, the Commission has the authority to assess an administrative penalty against Houston Precast for violations of the Texas Water Code and the Texas Health and Safety Code within the Commission's jurisdiction; for violations of rules adopted under such statutes; or for violations of orders or permits issued under such statutes.

6. An administrative penalty in the amount of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) is justified by the facts recited in this Order, and considered in light of the factors set forth in TEX. WATER CODE § 7.053.
7. TEX. WATER CODE §§ 5.102 and 7.002 authorize the Commission to issue orders and make determinations necessary to effectuate the purposes of the statutes within its jurisdiction.

ORDERING PROVISIONS

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ORDERS that:

1. Houston Precast is assessed an administrative penalty in the amount of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) for violations of TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ch. 382 and rules of the TCEQ. The payment of this administrative penalty and Houston Precast's compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Order completely resolve the matters set forth by this Order in this action. The Commission shall not be constrained in any manner from requiring corrective actions or penalties for other violations which are not raised here. All checks submitted to pay the penalty imposed by this Order shall be made out to the "Texas Commission on Environmental Quality." The administrative penalty assessed by this Order shall be paid within 30 days after the effective date of this Order and shall be sent with the notation "Re: Houston Precast, Inc.; Docket No. 2006-0836-AIR-E." to:

2. Houston Precast shall undertake the following technical requirements:
 - a. Respond completely and adequately, as determined by the TCEQ, to all requests for information concerning the Permit Application within 30 days after the date of such request, or by any other deadline specified in writing.
 - b. Within 180 days after the effective date of this Order, submit written certification that authorization to construct and operate a source of air emissions has been obtained, or certify that the concrete batch plant will not be used until authorization is obtained. The certification shall include detailed supporting documentation including receipts, and/or other records to demonstrate compliance with Ordering Provision 2.a.

The certification shall be notarized by a State of Texas Notary Public and include the following certification language:

I certify under penalty of law that this document and all attachments were prepared under my direction or supervision in accordance with a system designed to assure that qualified personnel properly gather and evaluate the information submitted. Based on my inquiry of the person or persons who manage the system, or those persons directly responsible for gathering the information, the information submitted is, to the best of my knowledge and belief, true, accurate, and complete. I am aware that there are significant penalties for submitting false information, including the possibility of fine and imprisonment for knowing violations.

3. All relief not expressly granted in this Order is denied.
4. The provisions of this Order shall apply to and be binding upon Houston Precast.
5. If Houston Precast fails to comply with any of the Ordering Provisions in this Order within the prescribed schedules, and that failure is caused solely by an act of God, war, strike, riot, or other catastrophe, Houston Precast's failure to comply is not a violation of this Order. Houston Precast shall have the burden of establishing to the Executive Director's satisfaction that such an event has occurred. Houston Precast shall notify the Executive Director within

seven days after Houston Precast becomes aware of a delaying event and shall take all reasonable measures to mitigate and minimize any delay.

6. The Executive Director may grant an extension of any deadline in this Order or in any plan, report, or other document submitted pursuant to this Order, upon a written and substantiated showing of good cause. All requests for extensions by Houston Precast shall be made in writing to the Executive Director. Extensions are not effective until Houston Precast receives written approval from the Executive Director. The determination of what constitutes good cause rests solely with the Executive Director.
7. The Executive Director may refer this matter to the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas ("OAG") for further enforcement proceedings without notice to Houston Precast if the Executive Director determines that Houston Precast has not complied with one or more of the terms or conditions in this Order.
8. This Order shall terminate five years from its effective date or upon compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Order, whichever is later.
9. The Chief Clerk shall provide a copy of this Order to each of the parties. By law, the effective date of this Order shall be the date the Order is final, as provided by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.106(d) and TEX. GOV'T CODE § 2001.144.
