Dear Sirs:

I am writing this letter as an official appeal of the Use Determination, TCEQ tracking number **06-11021**, filed by **Energy Transfer Fuel**. It is our belief that the Electric drives in the compressors should not receive a 100% property tax exemption. Using an electric drive does remove 100% of the pollution from a particular site but the energy for this drive still produces pollution at the generator site which is still in Texas.

Generation in Texas generally produces less pollution than onsite engines. The actual reduction in pollution for this type of instillation is analogous to a lean burn engine which gets a 20% exemption based on the existing TCEQ PEL. Granting a 100% pollution control tax exemption to this equipment violates common sense and the spirit of the law.

We respectfully request that our appeal regarding this Use Determination be granted. Thank you for your consideration.
