**AGREED ORDER
DOCKET NO. 2007-1224-MLM -E**

At its _____ agenda, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("Commission" or "TCEQ") considered this agreement of the parties, resolving an enforcement action regarding City of Lawn ("the City") under the authority of TEX. WATER CODE chs. 7 and 26 and TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ch. 341. The Executive Director of the TCEQ, represented by the Litigation Division, and the City presented this agreement to the Commission.

The City understands that it has certain procedural rights at certain points in the enforcement process, including, but not limited to, the right to formal notice of violations, notice of an evidentiary hearing, the right to an evidentiary hearing, and a right to appeal. By entering into this Agreed Order, the City agrees to waive all notice and procedural rights.

It is further understood and agreed that this Agreed Order represents the complete and fully-integrated agreement of the parties. The provisions of this Agreed Order are deemed severable and, if a court of competent jurisdiction or other appropriate authority deems any provision of this Agreed Order unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and enforceable. The duties and responsibilities imposed by this Agreed Order are binding upon the City.

The Commission makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The City owns and operates a public water supply system (the "Facility") and a surface water treatment plant (the "Plant") located at 150 Main Street, Lawn, Taylor County, Texas.
2. The Facility provides water for human consumption, has approximately 300 service connections, and serves at least 25 people per day for at least 60 days per year. As such, the Facility is a public water supply system as defined in 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.38(47). The Plant has discharged waste into or adjacent to any water in the state or has committed

another act that has caused or will cause pollution of any water in the state under the Texas Water Code.

3. During an investigation conducted on February 16, 2007, a TCEQ Abilene Regional Office investigator documented that the City failed to obtain a permit from the Commission prior to discharging wastewater. Specifically, the water supply did not have a wastewater discharge permit for the filter backwash discharges.
4. During a record review conducted on April 11, 2007, a TCEQ Central Office staff member documented that the City:
 - a. Failed to properly monitor and record the turbidity level of the combined filter effluent of the public water system with a surface water source. Specifically, no combined filter effluent turbidity readings were recorded for a 31 hour period during May 2005, a 43 hour period during June 2005, and a 40 hour period during July 2005. Also, individual filter effluent turbidity was not properly monitored for 17 days in October 2005.
 - b. Exceeded the turbidity level of combined filter effluent of the public water system that treats surface water. Specifically, the exceedances of the turbidity level of combined filter effluent were documented during January 2006, February 2006, July 2006, November 2006, and December 2006.
 - c. Failed to meet the requirements of the disinfection protocol used by the public water system for a period longer than four consecutive hours. Specifically, a low concentration time (the product of disinfectant concentration and effective contact time) for more than four consecutive hours was documented for one day in July 2006, nine days in January 2007, two days in February 2007, and seven days in March 2007.
5. During an investigation conducted on June 8, 2007, a TCEQ Abilene Regional Office investigator documented that the City:
 - a. Failed to comply with the requirements of a Corrective Action Plan that was a result of a Mandatory Comprehensive Performance Evaluation (MCPE) conducted from February 20, 2006 to February 24, 2006.
 - b. Failed to calibrate flow measuring devices and rate-of-flow controllers at least once every twelve months. Specifically, the raw, treated, and backwash flow meters had not been calibrated in the last twelve months.

- c. Failed to provide a treatment plant capacity of 0.6 gallons per minute (“gpm”) per connection under normal rated design flow. Specifically, the water system should be providing a treatment plant capacity of 180 gpm for its 300 connections. The water system currently provides 142 gpm of the treatment plant capacity, which is a 21% deficiency.
- d. Failed to provide spill containment facilities for all liquid chemical storage tanks. Specifically, containment facilities were not provided for the linear alkylate sulphonate (“LAS”) and Chemfloc chemical day tanks.
- e. Failed to maintain the residual disinfectant concentration throughout the distribution system at a minimum of 0.5 milligrams per liter (“mg/L”) total chlorine. Specifically, on the date of the investigation, tests at the valves at Lawn Post Office, 825 Main Street, Fire Hydrant at FM 604 and Highway 84, 118 County Road, Hiway Grocery, Fire Hydrant at Fifth Street and Avenue E, and Lawn Baptist Church were recorded to be 0.34 mg/L, 0.10 mg/L, 0.3 mg/L, 0.14 mg/L, 0.16 mg/L, 0.29 mg/L, and 0.21 mg/L, respectively.
- f. Failed to maintain a minimum pressure of 35 pounds per square inch (“psi”) throughout the distribution system at all times. Specifically, on the date of the investigation, the distribution system pressure levels at 825 Main Street, Lawn Baptist Church, and 118 County Road were recorded to be 31 psi, 33 psi, and 20 psi, respectively.
- g. Failed to provide alarms to summon operators during periods when the surface water treatment plant is not staffed.
- h. Failed to provide legible signs at the raw water intake location which state that the area is restricted and that all recreational activities and trespassing are prohibited. Specifically, at the time of the investigation, the restricted access sign at the raw water intake was not legible.
- i. Failed to post at the Hudson pump station a legible sign containing the name of the water supply and emergency telephone numbers where a responsible official could be contacted.
- j. Failed to maintain the Chatham ground storage tank in accordance with the American Water Works Association (“AWWA”) standards. Specifically, at the time of the investigation, the exterior paint on the ground storage tank was deteriorated.
- k. Failed to design the coagulant feed and metering system that applies chemicals to the water leaving the treatment system in such a manner that complete disinfection

occurs to the water prior to it entering the distribution system. Specifically, it was noted that the system experienced difficulties with maintaining a constant residual disinfectant level in the water leaving the treatment system.

- l. Failed to conduct a calibration check of the benchtop turbidimeter using secondary standards each time a series of samples is tested. Specifically, daily calibration checks for the benchtop turbidimeter were not conducted.
 - m. Failed to conduct weekly calibration checks of the on-line turbidimeter.
 - n. Failed to provide the system's storage tanks with gooseneck vents or roof ventilators equipped with approved screens to prevent the entry of animals, birds, insects, and heavy air contaminants. Specifically, the roof vents on the Hudson storage tank and the Lawn standpipe were corroded.
 - o. Failed to initiate maintenance housekeeping practices to ensure the good working condition and general appearance of the system's facilities and equipment. Specifically, the water main valve located at the intersection of Farm-to-Market Road 604 and Highway 84 was malfunctioning and the water main located at County Road 202 was leaking.
 - p. Failed to verify the accuracy of manual disinfectant residual analyzers in the chlorine residual test kit at least once every 30 days using chlorine solutions of known concentrations.
6. The City received notice of the violations on or about October 26, 2005, December 9, 2005, March 27, 2006, May 11, 2006, September 1, 2006, December 22, 2006, January 30, 2007, April 6, 2007, May 7, 2007, June 14, 2007, June 15, 2007, and June 19, 2007.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. As evidenced by Findings of Fact Nos. 1 and 2, the City is subject to the jurisdiction of the TCEQ pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE § 7.002 and ch. 26 and TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ch. 341 and the rules of the Commission.
2. As evidenced by Findings of Fact No. 3, the City failed to obtain a permit from the Commission prior to discharging wastewater, in violation of TEX. WATER CODE § 26.121(a), 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.42(i), and TCEQ Agreed Order, Docket No. 2003-0324-PWS-E, Ordering Provision No. 2.a.
3. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 4.a., the City failed to properly monitor and record the turbidity level of the combined filter effluent of the public water system with a surface water

source, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.111(c)(2) and (c)(4) and TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 341.0315(c).

4. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 4.b., the City exceeded the turbidity level of combined filter effluent of the public water system that treats surface water, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.111(b)(1)(A) and TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 341.0315(c).
5. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 4.c., the City failed to meet the requirements of the disinfection protocol used by the public water system for a period longer than four consecutive hours, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.110(b)(1) and (f)(4) and TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 341.0315(c).
6. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 5.a., the City failed to comply with the requirements of a Corrective Action Plan that was a result of a MCPE conducted from February 20, 2006 to February 24, 2006, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.111(f)(6).
7. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 5.b, the City failed to calibrate flow measuring devices and rate-of-flow controllers at least once every twelve months, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46(s)(1) and TCEQ Agreed Order, Docket No. 2004-2098-PWS-E, Ordering Provision No. 2.a.i.
8. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 5.c., the City failed to provide a treatment plant capacity of 0.6 gpm per connection under normal rated design flow, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.45(b)(2)(B), TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 341.0315(c), and TCEQ Agreed Order, Docket No. 2003-0324-PWS-E, Ordering Provision No. 2.b.i.
9. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 5.d., the City failed to provide spill containment facilities for all liquid chemical storage tanks, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.42(f)(1)(E)(ii) and TCEQ Agreed Order, Docket No. 2003-0324-PWS-E, Ordering Provision No. 2.b.iv.
10. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 5.e., the City failed to maintain the residual disinfectant concentration throughout the distribution system at a minimum of 0.5 mg/L total chlorine, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46(d)(2)(B) and TCEQ Agreed Order, Docket No. 2006-0164-PWS-E, Ordering Provision No. 2.b.ii.
11. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 5.f., the City failed to maintain a minimum pressure of 35 psi throughout the distribution system at all times, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.44(d) and TCEQ Agreed Order, Docket No. 2003-0324-PWS-E, Ordering Provision No. 2.b.ii.

12. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 5.g., the City failed to provide alarms to summon operators during periods when the surface water treatment plant is not staffed, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46(e)(5)(F).
13. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 5.h., the City failed to provide legible signs at the raw water intake location which state that the area is restricted and that all recreational activities and trespassing are prohibited, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.41(e)(2)(C).
14. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 5.i., the City failed to post at the Hudson pump station a legible sign containing the name of the water supply and emergency telephone numbers where a responsible official could be contacted, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46(t).
15. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 5.j., the City failed to maintain the Chatham ground storage tank in accordance with the AWWA standards, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.43(c)(8) and TCEQ Agreed Order, Docket No. 2003-0324-PWS-E, Ordering Provision No. 2.b.vi.
16. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 5.k., the City failed to design the coagulant feed and metering system that applies chemicals to the water leaving the treatment system in such a manner that complete disinfection occurs to the water prior to it entering the distribution system, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.42(f)(2)(G).
17. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 5.l., the City failed to conduct a calibration check of the benchtop turbidimeter using secondary standards each time a series of samples is tested, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46(s)(2)(B)(ii).
18. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 5.m., the City failed to conduct weekly calibration checks of the on-line turbidimeter, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46(s)(2)(B)(iv).
19. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 5.n., the City failed to provide the system's storage tanks with gooseneck vents or roof ventilators equipped with approved screens to prevent the entry of animals, birds, insects, and heavy air contaminants, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.43(c)(1).
20. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 5.o., the City failed to initiate maintenance housekeeping practices to ensure the good working condition and general appearance of the system's facilities and equipment, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46(m).

21. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 5.p., the City failed to verify the accuracy of manual disinfectant residual analyzers in the chlorine residual test kit at least once every 30 days using chlorine solutions of known concentrations, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46(s)(2)(C)(i).
22. Pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE § 7.051, the Commission has the authority to assess an administrative penalty against the City for violations of state statutes within the Commission's jurisdiction, for violations of rules adopted under such statutes, or for violations of orders or permits issued under such statutes.
23. An administrative penalty in the amount of forty-nine thousand five hundred fifty-six dollars (\$49,556.00) is justified by the facts recited in this Agreed Order, and considered in light of the factors set forth in TEX. WATER CODE § 7.053. The City has paid one thousand one hundred forty-six dollars (\$1,146.00) of the administrative penalty. The remaining amount of forty-eight thousand four hundred ten dollars (\$48,410.00) of the administrative penalty shall be payable in 47 monthly payments of one thousand thirty dollars (\$1,030.00) each. The first monthly payment shall be paid within 30 days after the effective date of this Agreed Order. The subsequent payments shall be remitted not later than 30 days following the due date of the previous payment. If the City fails to timely and satisfactorily comply with the payment requirements of this Agreed Order, including the payment schedule, the Executive Director may, at his option, accelerate the maturity of the remaining installments, in which event the unpaid balance shall become immediately due and payable without demand or notice. In addition, the failure of the City to meet the payment schedule of this Agreed Order constitutes the failure by the City to timely and satisfactorily comply with all of the terms of this Agreed Order.

ORDERING PROVISIONS

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ORDERS that:

1. It is, therefore, ordered by the TCEQ that the City pay an administrative penalty as set forth in Conclusion of Law No. 23, above. The payment of this administrative penalty and the City's compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreed Order completely resolve the violations set forth by this Agreed Order in this action. However, the Commission shall not be constrained in any manner from requiring corrective actions or penalties for other violations that are not raised here. Administrative penalty payments shall be made payable to "Texas Commission on Environmental Quality" and shall be sent with the notation "Re: City of Lawn; Docket No. 2007-1224-MLM-E" to:

2. The City shall undertake the following technical requirements:
 - a. Immediately upon the effective date of this Commission Order, the City shall:
 - i. Begin maintaining the residual disinfectant concentration throughout the distribution system at a minimum of 0.5 mg/L total chlorine, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46.
 - ii. Begin properly monitoring and recording the turbidity levels of the combined filter effluent, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.111.
 - iii. Implement procedures to ensure that the turbidity level of combined filter effluent is achieved, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.111.
 - iv. Implement procedures to ensure that the water system meets the requirements of the disinfection protocol, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.110.
 - v. Implement procedures to ensure a continuous application of coagulants to the water in mixing basins or chambers to ensure that complete disinfection occurs to the water prior to it entering the distribution system, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.42.
 - vi. Begin conducting weekly calibration checks of the on-line turbidimeter, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46.
 - b. Within 30 days after the effective date of this Commission Order, the City shall:
 - i. Submit written certification of compliance as described below in Ordering Provision No. 2.f., that demonstrates compliance with Ordering Provision No. 2.a.
 - ii. Submit an administratively complete wastewater discharge permit application, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE ch. 305 (relating to consolidated Permits) to:

- iii. Correct performance-limiting factors identified during the February 20 through February 24, 2006 MCPE for the disinfectant monitoring violations, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.111.
 - iv. Properly calibrate flow measuring devices and rate-of-flow controllers, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46.
 - v. Post legible signs at the raw water intake location which state that the area is restricted and that all recreational activities and trespassing are prohibited, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.41.
 - vi. Post a legible system ownership sign at each production, treatment, and storage facility, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46.
 - vii. Conduct a proper calibration check of the benchtop turbidimeter, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46.
 - viii. Initiate maintenance and housekeeping practices to ensure good working condition and general appearance of the system's facilities and equipment, including but not limited to repairing or replacing all malfunctioning and leaking water main valves in the distribution line, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46.
 - ix. Verify and begin maintaining the accuracy of manual disinfectant residual analyzers in the chlorine residual test kit at least once every 30 days using chlorine solutions of known concentrations, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46.
- c. Within 60 days after the effective date of this Commission Order, the City shall:
- i. Submit written certification as described in Ordering Provision No. 2.f. below, and include detailed supporting documentation to demonstrate compliance with Ordering Provision No. 2.b.
 - ii. Submit an engineering study which addresses the low pressures being experienced within the distribution system. This study shall include plans

and specifications, which have been prepared by a registered professional engineer, for any system improvements needed to maintain a minimum pressure of 35 psi at all points within the distribution network at flow rates of a least 1.5 gpm, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.44. These plans and specifications shall be submitted to:

- iii. Provide the Facility's storage tanks with a gooseneck vent or roof ventilator equipped with an approved screen to prevent entry of animals, birds, insects, and heavy contaminants, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.43.
 - iv. Make repairs to the Chatham storage tank to ensure that it is in strict accordance with current AWWA standards, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 209.43.
 - v. Provide the surface water treatment plant with alarms capable of summoning operators during periods of time when the plant is not staffed, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46.
 - vi. Provide spill containment facilities for all system's liquid chemical storage tanks, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.42.
- d. Within 90 days of the effective date of the Commission Order, the City shall:
- i. Submit written certification as described in Ordering Provision 2.f. below, and include detailed support documentation to demonstrate compliance with Ordering Provision No. 2.c.
 - ii. Provide a treatment plant capacity of 0.6 gpm per connection, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.45.
- e. Within 105 days after the effective date of this Commission Order, the City shall submit written certification as described in Ordering Provision No. 2.f. below, and include detailed supporting documentation to demonstrate compliance with Ordering Provision No. 2.d.

- f. Within 300 days after the effective date of the Commission Order, the City shall submit written certification that either authorization to discharge wastewater has been obtained or that all discharge of wastewater has ceased until such time that appropriate authorization is obtained. The certification shall include detailed supporting documentation, including photographs, receipts, and /or other records, to demonstrate compliance. The certification shall be notarized by a State of Texas Notary Public and include the following certification language:

“I certify under penalty of law that I have personally examined and am familiar with the information submitted and all attached documents, and that based on my inquiry of those individuals immediately responsible for obtaining the information, I believe that the submitted information is true, accurate and complete. I am aware that there are significant penalties for submitting false information, including the possibility of fine and imprisonment for knowing violations.”

3. The provisions of this Agreed Order shall apply to and be binding upon the City. The City is ordered to give notice of the Agreed Order to personnel who maintain day-to-day control over the Facility and Plant referenced in this Agreed Order.
4. If the City fails to comply with any of the Ordering Provisions in this Agreed Order within the prescribed schedules, and that failure is caused solely by an act of God, war, strike, riot, or other catastrophe, the City's failure to comply is not a violation of this Agreed Order. The City shall have the burden of establishing to the Executive Director's satisfaction that such an event has occurred. The City shall notify the Executive Director within seven days after the

City becomes aware of a delaying event and shall take all reasonable measures to mitigate and minimize any delay.

5. The Executive Director may grant an extension of any deadline in this Agreed Order or in any plan, report, or other document submitted pursuant to this Agreed Order, upon a written and substantiated showing of good cause. All requests for extensions by the City shall be made in writing to the Executive Director. Extensions are not effective until the City receives written approval from the Executive Director. The determination of what constitutes good cause rests solely with the Executive Director.
6. The Executive Director may refer this matter to the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas ("OAG") for further enforcement proceedings without notice to the City if the Executive Director determines that the City has not complied with one or more of the terms or conditions in this Agreed Order.
7. This Agreed Order shall terminate five years from its effective date or upon compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreed Order, whichever is later.
8. This Agreed Order, issued by the Commission, shall not be admissible against the City in a civil proceeding, unless the proceeding is brought by the OAG to: (1) enforce the terms of this Agreed Order; or (2) pursue violations of a statute within the Commission's jurisdiction, or of a rule adopted or an order or permit issued by the Commission under such a statute.
9. This agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, which together shall constitute a single original instrument. Any executed signature page to this Agreement may be transmitted by facsimile transmission to the other parties, which shall constitute an original signature for all purposes.
10. Under 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.10(b) and TEX. GOV'T CODE § 2001.142, the effective date of this Agreed Order is the date of hand-delivery of the Order to the City, or three days after the date on which the Commission mails notice of the Order to the City, whichever is earlier. The Chief Clerk shall provide a copy of this Agreed Order to each of the parties.
