DEFAULT ORDER

At its _____ agenda meeting, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("Commission" or "TCEQ") considered the Executive Director's Preliminary Report and Petition filed pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE chs. 7 and 37, TEX. OCC. CODE ch. 1903, and the rules of the TCEQ, which requests appropriate relief, including the imposition of an administrative penalty and corrective action of the respondent. The respondent made the subject of this Order is Jose Eduardo Coronado ("Respondent").

The Commission makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent owns and operates a landscaping business located at 23118 Woodbine Meadows in Hockley, Harris County, Texas (the "Business"). Respondent sells, designs, offers consultations regarding, installs, maintains, alters, repairs, and/or services landscape irrigation systems and is required to be licensed under 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE ch. 30. Therefore, Respondent is subject to TCEQ jurisdiction pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE ch. 37 and TEX. OCC. CODE ch. 1903.
2. During a record review conducted on September 23, 2010, a TCEQ Central Office investigator documented that Respondent:
 - a. Failed to obtain an irrigator license prior to installing an irrigation system. Specifically, Respondent installed an irrigation system at 10402 Kingston Creek Lane, Cypress County, Texas on November 8, 2009 without a valid irrigator license; and
 - b. Failed to refrain from advertising or representing himself to the public as a holder of a license or registration unless he possesses a current license or registration or unless he employs an individual who holds a current license. Specifically, Respondent advertised irrigation services on a business card without holding a valid irrigator license or employing an individual with a valid irrigator license.
3. Respondent received notice of the violations on or about October 20, 2010.

4. The Executive Director filed the "Executive Director's Preliminary Report and Petition Recommending that the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality Enter an Enforcement Order Assessing an Administrative Penalty Against and Requiring Certain Actions of Jose Eduardo Coronado" (the "EDPRP") in the TCEQ Chief Clerk's office on March 1, 2011.
5. By letter dated March 1, 2011, sent to Respondent's last known address via certified mail, return receipt requested, and via first class mail, postage prepaid, the Executive Director served Respondent with notice of the EDPRP. According to the return receipt "green card," Respondent received notice of the EDPRP on March 3, 2011, as evidenced by the signature on the card.
6. More than 20 days have elapsed since Respondent received notice of the EDPRP, provided by the Executive Director. Respondent failed to file an answer and failed to request a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 1, Respondent is subject to the jurisdiction of the TCEQ pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE ch. 37, TEX. OCC. CODE ch. 1903, and the rules of the Commission.
2. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 2.a., Respondent failed to obtain an irrigator license prior to installing an irrigation system, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 30.5(a) and TEX. WATER CODE § 37.003, and TEX. OCC. CODE § 1903.251.
3. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 2.b., Respondent failed to refrain from advertising or representing himself to the public as a holder of a license or registration unless he possesses a current license or registration or unless he employs an individual who holds a current license, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 30.5(b) and TEX. WATER CODE § 37.003.
4. As evidenced by Findings of Fact Nos. 4 and 5, the Executive Director timely served Respondent with proper notice of the EDPRP, as required by TEX. WATER CODE § 7.055 and 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.104(a).
5. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 6, Respondent failed to file a timely answer as required by TEX. WATER CODE § 7.056 and 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.105. Pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE § 7.057 and 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.106, the Commission may enter a Default Order against Respondent and assess the penalty recommended by the Executive Director.
6. Pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE § 7.051, the Commission has the authority to assess an administrative penalty against Respondent for violations of state statutes within the Commission's jurisdiction, for violations of rules adopted under such statutes, or for violations of orders or permits issued under such statutes.
7. An administrative penalty in the amount of nine hundred ninety-six dollars (\$996.00) is justified by the facts recited in this Order, and considered in light of the factors set forth in TEX. WATER CODE § 7.053.

8. TEX. WATER CODE §§ 5.102 and 7.002 authorize the Commission to issue orders and make determinations necessary to effectuate the purposes of the statutes within its jurisdiction.

ORDERING PROVISIONS

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ORDERS that:

1. Respondent is assessed an administrative penalty in the amount of nine hundred ninety-six dollars (\$996.00) for violations of state statutes and rules of the TCEQ. The payment of this administrative penalty and Respondent's compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Order completely resolve the matters set forth by this Order in this action. The Commission shall not be constrained in any manner from requiring corrective actions or penalties for other violations which are not raised here.
2. The administrative penalty assessed by this Order shall be paid within 30 days after the effective date of this Order. All checks submitted to pay the penalty imposed by this Order shall be made out to "Texas Commission on Environmental Quality" and shall be sent with the notation "Re: Jose Eduardo Coronado; Docket No. 2010-1819-LII-E" to:

3. Respondent shall undertake the following technical requirements:
 - a. Immediately upon the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall cease installing and advertising irrigation system services until properly licensed, in accordance with 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE ch. 30;
 - b. Within 15 days after the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall submit written certification and detailed supporting documentation, including photographs, receipts, and /or other records, to demonstrate compliance with Ordering Provision No. 3.a. The certification shall be notarized by a State of Texas Notary Public and include the following certification language:

"I certify under penalty of law that I have personally examined and am familiar with the information submitted and all attached documents, and that based on my inquiry of those individuals immediately responsible for obtaining the information, I believe that the submitted information is true, accurate and complete. I am aware that there are significant penalties for submitting false information, including the possibility of fine and imprisonment for knowing violations."

4. All relief not expressly granted in this Order is denied.
5. The provisions of this Order shall apply to and be binding upon Respondent. Respondent is ordered to give notice of this Order to personnel who maintain day-to-day control over the Business operations referenced in this Order.
6. If Respondent fails to comply with any of the Ordering Provisions in this Order within the prescribed schedules, and that failure is caused solely by an act of God, war, strike, riot, or other catastrophe, Respondent's failure to comply is not a violation of this Order. Respondent shall have the burden of establishing to the Executive Director's satisfaction that such an event has occurred. Respondent shall notify the Executive Director within seven days after Respondent becomes aware of a delaying event and shall take all reasonable measures to mitigate and minimize any delay.
7. The Executive Director may grant an extension of any deadline in this Order or in any plan, report, or other document submitted pursuant to this Order, upon a written and substantiated showing of good cause. All requests for extensions by Respondent shall be made in writing to the Executive Director. Extensions are not effective until Respondent receives written approval from the Executive Director. The determination of what constitutes good cause rests solely with the Executive Director.
8. The Executive Director may refer this matter to the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas ("OAG") for further enforcement proceedings without notice to Respondent if the Executive Director determines that Respondent has not complied with one or more of the terms or conditions in this Order.
9. This Order shall terminate five years from its effective date or upon compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Order, whichever is later.
10. The Chief Clerk shall provide a copy of this Order to each of the parties. By law, the effective date of this Order shall be the date the Order is final, as provided by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.106(d) and TEX. GOV'T CODE § 2001.144.




More than 20 days have elapsed since Respondent received notice of the EDPRP. Respondent failed to file an answer and failed to request a hearing.
