DEFAULT ORDER

At its _____ agenda meeting, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("Commission" or "TCEQ") considered the Executive Director's Preliminary Report and Petition filed pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE chs. 7 and 26 and the rules of the TCEQ, which requests appropriate relief, including the imposition of an administrative penalty and corrective action of the respondent. The respondent made the subject of this Order is Natalin Dorette Keenan ("Respondent").

The Commission makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent owns, as defined in 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 334.2(73), an inactive underground storage tank ("UST") system and a former gasoline dispensing facility located at 3957 United States Highway 287 in Latexo, Houston County, Texas (the "Facility"). The USTs at the Facility are not exempt or excluded from regulation under the Texas Water Code or the rules of the Commission, and contain a regulated petroleum substance as defined in the rules of the TCEQ.
2. During a record review conducted on October 10, 2010, a TCEQ Beaumont Regional Office investigator documented that Respondent:
 - a. Failed to permanently remove from service, no later than 60 days after the prescribed upgrade implementation date, a UST system for which any applicable component of the system is not brought into timely compliance with the upgrade requirements; and
 - b. Failed to notify the agency of any change or additional information regarding the USTs within 30 days of the occurrence of the change or addition. Specifically, the registration was not updated to reflect the current owner.
3. Respondent received notice of the violations on or about November 2, 2010.
4. The Executive Director filed the "Executive Director's Preliminary Report and Petition Recommending that the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality Enter an Enforcement Order Assessing an Administrative Penalty Against and Requiring Certain Actions of Natalin Dorette Keenan" (the "EDPRP") in the TCEQ Chief Clerk's office on March 14, 2011.

5. Respondent filed an answer requesting a hearing on April 3, 2011, and the matter was referred to the State Office of Administrative Hearings ("SOAH") on May 5, 2011.
6. On May 18, 2011, the TCEQ Chief Clerk mailed notice of the June 16, 2011, preliminary hearing via certified mail, return receipt requested, and via first class mail, postage prepaid to Respondent.
7. On June 16, 2011, the Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") convened the preliminary hearing, but Respondent failed to appear. The ALJ entered a finding that Respondent was served with proper notice of the hearing, and the Executive Director requested that the matter be remanded to the Executive Director so that a Default Order may be entered and the case may be dismissed from the SOAH Docket.
8. The ALJ remanded the matter to the Executive Director by SOAH Order No. 1, Dismissing Case and Remaining to the Executive Director, issued on June 16, 2011, so that TCEQ may dispose of this case on a default basis.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 1, Respondent is subject to the jurisdiction of the TCEQ pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE ch. 26 and the rules of the Commission.
2. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 2.a., Respondent failed to permanently remove from service, no later than 60 days after the prescribed upgrade implementation date, a UST system for which any applicable component of the system is not brought into timely compliance with the upgrade requirements, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 334.47(a)(2).
3. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 2.b., Respondent failed to notify the agency of any change or additional information regarding the USTs within 30 days of the occurrence of the change or addition, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 334.7(d)(3).
4. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 5, Respondent filed an answer requesting a hearing as required by TEX. WATER CODE § 7.056 and 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.105, and the matter was referred to SOAH pursuant to 1 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 155.53(b) and 155.101(a)(3) and 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.109.

As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 6, Respondent was provided proper notice of the preliminary hearing in accordance with TEX. GOV'T CODE §§ 2001.051(1) and 2001.052, TEX. WATER CODE § 7.058, 1 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 155.103(a) and (c)(3), 155.401 and 155.501(c) and (e)(2), and 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 1.11, 1.12, 39.23, 39.25, 39.405, 39.413, 39.423, 39.425 and 80.6.
5. As evidenced by Findings of Fact Nos. 7 and 8, Respondent failed to appear for the preliminary hearing, and pursuant to TEX. GOV'T CODE § 2001.056(4), TEX. WATER CODE § 7.057, and 1 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 155.501(e)(1)(A), the ALJ dismissed the case from the SOAH docket so that the Commission may enter a Default Order against Respondent and assess the penalty recommended by the Executive Director pursuant to 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.106(b).

6. Pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE § 7.051, the Commission has the authority to assess an administrative penalty against Respondent for violations of state statutes within the Commission's jurisdiction, for violations of rules adopted under such statutes, or for violations of orders or permits issued under such statutes.
7. An administrative penalty in the amount of three thousand six hundred seventy-five dollars (\$3,675.00) is justified by the facts recited in this Order, and considered in light of the factors set forth in TEX. WATER CODE § 7.053.
8. TEX. WATER CODE §§ 5.102 and 7.002 authorize the Commission to issue orders and make determinations necessary to effectuate the purposes of the statutes within its jurisdiction.

ORDERING PROVISIONS

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ORDERS that:

1. Respondent is assessed an administrative penalty in the amount of three thousand six hundred seventy-five dollars (\$3,675.00) for violations of state statutes and rules of the TCEQ. The payment of this administrative penalty and Respondent's compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Order completely resolve the matters set forth by this Order in this action. The Commission shall not be constrained in any manner from requiring corrective actions or penalties for other violations which are not raised here.
2. The administrative penalty assessed by this Order shall be paid within 30 days after the effective date of this Order.  - b. Within 45 days after the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall submit an amended registration to indicate the operational status of the UST system, in accordance with 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 334.7 to:

- c. Within 60 days after the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall submit written certification and detailed supporting documentation, including photographs, receipts, and/or other records, to demonstrate compliance with Ordering Provision Nos. 3.a. and 3.b. The certification shall be notarized by a State of Texas Notary Public and shall include the following certification language:

"I certify under penalty of law that I have personally examined and am familiar with the information submitted and all attached documents, and that based on my inquiry of those individuals immediately responsible for obtaining the information, I believe that the submitted information is true, accurate and complete. I am aware that there are significant penalties for submitting false information, including the possibility of fine and imprisonment for knowing violations."

4. All relief not expressly granted in this Order is denied.
5. The provisions of this Order shall apply to and be binding upon Respondent. Respondent is ordered to give notice of this Order to personnel who maintain day-to-day control over the Facility operations referenced in this Order.
6. If Respondent fails to comply with any of the Ordering Provisions in this Order within the prescribed schedules, and that failure is caused solely by an act of God, war, strike, riot, or other catastrophe, Respondent's failure to comply is not a violation of this Order. Respondent shall have the burden of establishing to the Executive Director's satisfaction that such an event has occurred. Respondent shall notify the Executive Director within seven days after Respondent becomes aware of a delaying event and shall take all reasonable measures to mitigate and minimize any delay.

7. The Executive Director may grant an extension of any deadline in this Order or in any plan, report, or other document submitted pursuant to this Order, upon a written and substantiated showing of good cause. All requests for extensions by Respondent shall be made in writing to the Executive Director. Extensions are not effective until Respondent receives written approval from the Executive Director. The determination of what constitutes good cause rests solely with the Executive Director.
8. The Executive Director may refer this matter to the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas ("OAG") for further enforcement proceedings without notice to Respondent if the Executive Director determines that Respondent has not complied with one or more of the terms or conditions in this Order.
9. This Order shall terminate five years from its effective date or upon compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Order, whichever is later.
10. The Chief Clerk shall provide a copy of this Order to each of the parties. By law, the effective date of this Order shall be the date the Order is final, as provided by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.106(d) and TEX. GOV'T CODE § 2001.144.



On behalf of the Executive Director of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, the "Executive Director's Preliminary Report and Petition Recommending that the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality Enter an Enforcement Order Assessing an Administrative Penalty Against and Requiring Certain Actions of Natalin Dorette Keenan" (the "EDPRP") was filed in the TCEQ Chief Clerk's office on March 14, 2011.

Respondent filed an answer requesting a hearing on April 3, 2011, and the matter was referred to the State Office of Administrative Hearings ("SOAH") on May 5, 2011. On May 18, 2011, the TCEQ Chief Clerk mailed notice of the June 16, 2011, preliminary hearing via certified mail, return receipt requested, and via first class mail, postage prepaid to Respondent.

Respondent failed to appear at the hearing on June 16, 2011. At that hearing, I requested and received a finding that Respondent was served with proper notice of the hearing pursuant to 1 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 155.501(e)(2). I also requested that the matter be remanded to the Executive Director pursuant to 1 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 155.501(e)(1)(A), which gives an ALJ the authority to remand the case back to the agency "to allow the agency to dispose of the case on a default basis under TEX. GOV'T CODE § 2001.056(4) and the referring agency's rules.


