Requested Action:

Staff requests the Commission's approval for the appointment of seven nominees to replace the Advisory Committee members whose terms expire on August 31, 2012. The seven nominees are: Ray Gooden, Ginger Laird, Leonard Leinfelder, Mark Rich, Gary Sober, Robb Starr, and Michael Urrutia. Staff also requests the Commission approve continuing the existence of the Advisory Committee until August 31, 2016.

Water Utility Operator Licensing Advisory Committee Background:

The Advisory Committee operates through the Occupational Licensing Section of the Permitting & Registration Support Division (PRS). The Advisory Committee assists and advises the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) on matters related to the training and licensing of water and wastewater operators. The Advisory Committee was created pursuant to Title 30 of the Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 5. The Advisory Committee consists of thirteen members, representing various water and wastewater entities regulated by the TCEQ. These members are from diverse geographic areas of the state, ethnic groups, businesses, government entities, and associations.

On July 8, 2010 the Commission approved Resolution (Docket No. 2010-0215-RES) which appointed new members to the Advisory Committee whose terms will expire August 31, 2014. With the approval of that same resolution, the Commission also extended the term of the Advisory Committee until August 31, 2014. Due to the expiration date of August 31, 2016 for the terms of the new appointees mentioned above, Staff requests that the Commission also extend the existence of the Advisory Committee until August 31, 2016.

Selection Process:

The PRS division solicited nominations to replace the members whose terms expire on August 31, 2012, by sending direct correspondence to interested persons within the regulated community, as well as asking current members of the Advisory Committee to recommend potential nominees. Notice of Request for Nominations was published in the September 9, 2011 issue of the *Texas Register*. The PRS division received a total of 19 nominations to fill the upcoming vacancies within the Advisory Committee.



Current Members Whose Term Expires in 2014 and Recommended New Members (2012)



WHEREAS, Commission advisory committees are subject to the Commissioner's rules regarding such committees pursuant to 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 5, the committees' sole duties are to advise the Commission, the committees have no executive or administrative powers with respect to the operation of the Commission, and all such powers and duties rest solely with the Commission; and
