1. Failed to collect at least five routine distribution coliform samples the month following a coliform-positive sample result, and failed to provide public notification of the failure to collect five distribution samples [30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 290.109(c)(2)(F) and 290.122(c)(2)(A)].

The Order will require Respondent to:

a. Within 10 days:

i. Implement procedures to ensure that all necessary public notifications are provided in a timely manner to the customers of the Facility; and

ii. Begin complying with applicable coliform monitoring requirements by collecting all routine, increased, and repeat coliform distribution samples when required, and providing water that meets the provisions regarding microbial contaminants. This provision will be satisfied upon six consecutive months of compliant monitoring and reporting.

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- b. Within 25 days, submit written certification demonstrating compliance with Ordering Provision a.i.;
- c. Within 30 days, update the Facility's operational guidance and conduct employee training to ensure that self-reporting requirements are properly accomplished, including the timely submission of signed and certified DLQORs;
- d. Within 45 days, submit written certification demonstrating compliance with Ordering Provision c.;
- e. Within 90 days, begin submitting DLQORs to the Executive Director each quarter, by the tenth day of the month following the end of the quarter. This provision will be satisfied upon two consecutive quarters of compliant reporting;
- f. Within 195 days, submit written certification demonstrating compliance with Ordering Provision a.ii.; and
- g. Within 285 days, submit written certification demonstrating compliance with Ordering Provision e.

At its \_\_\_\_\_ agenda, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("the Commission" or "TCEQ") considered this agreement of the parties, resolving an enforcement action regarding Robert F. Bryer dba Bentwood Estates Mobile Home Park ("Respondent") under the authority of TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ch. 341. The Executive Director of the TCEQ, through the Enforcement Division, and the Respondent presented this agreement to the Commission.

The Respondent understands that he has certain procedural rights at certain points in the enforcement process, including, but not limited to, the right to formal notice of violations, notice of an evidentiary hearing, the right to an evidentiary hearing, and a right to appeal. By entering into this Agreed Order, the Respondent agrees to waive all notice and procedural rights.

It is further understood and agreed that this Order represents the complete and fully-integrated settlement of the parties. The provisions of this Agreed Order are deemed severable and, if a court of competent jurisdiction or other appropriate authority deems any provision of this Agreed Order unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and enforceable. The duties and responsibilities imposed by this Agreed Order are binding upon the Respondent.

The Commission makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law:

## I. FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Respondent owns and operates a public water supply at 2719 3rd Street in Harris County, Texas (the "Facility") that has approximately 45 service connections and serves at least 25 people per day for at least 60 days per year.
2. During record reviews conducted on December 10, 2012 and February 4, 2013, TCEQ staff documented that the Respondent collected two of five routine distribution coliform samples required for the month of September 2012, collected one of five routine distribution coliform samples required for the month of October 2012, and did not provide public notification of the failure to collect five distribution samples for the month of October 2012.
3. During a record review conducted on December 10, 2012, TCEQ staff documented that the Respondent collected one of four repeat samples required following a total coliform-positive result on a routine distribution sample, and did not issue public notification of the failure to collect repeat distribution samples for the month of August 2012.
4. During a record review conducted on December 10, 2012, TCEQ staff documented that the Respondent did not submit a Disinfectant Level Quarterly Operating Report ("DLQOR") to the Executive Director for the third quarter of 2012.
5. During a record review conducted on December 10, 2012, TCEQ staff documented that the Respondent did not provide public notification regarding the failure to collect one raw groundwater source *Escherichia coli* sample from each of the Facility's active wells within 24 hours of notification of a distribution total coliform-positive sample during the month of August 2012.
6. The Respondent received notice of the violations on January 3, 2013.

## II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Respondent is subject to the jurisdiction of the TCEQ pursuant to TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ch. 341 and the rules of the Commission.
2. As evidenced by Findings of Fact No. 2, the Respondent failed to collect at least five routine distribution coliform samples the month following a coliform-positive sample result, and failed to provide public notification of the failure to collect five distribution samples, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 290.109(c)(2)(F) and 290.122(c)(2)(A).
3. As evidenced by Findings of Fact No. 3, the Respondent failed to collect a set of repeat distribution samples within 24 hours of being notified of a total coliform-positive result, and did not post public notification of the failure to collect repeat distribution samples, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 290.109(c)(3)(A)(ii) and 290.122(c)(2)(A).

4. As evidenced by Findings of Fact No. 4, the Respondent failed to submit a DLQOR to the Executive Director each quarter by the tenth day of the month following the end of each quarter, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.110(e)(4)(A) and (f)(3).
5. As evidenced by Findings of Fact No. 5, the Respondent failed to provide public notification regarding the failure to collect one raw groundwater source *Escherichia coli* sample from each of the Facility's active wells within 24 hours of notification of a distribution total coliform-positive sample, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.122(c)(2)(A).
6. Pursuant to TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 341.049, the Commission has the authority to assess an administrative penalty against the Respondent for violations of the Texas Water Code and the Texas Health and Safety Code within the Commission's jurisdiction; for violations of rules adopted under such statutes; or for violations of orders or permits issued under such statutes.
7. An administrative penalty in the amount of One Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-Four Dollars (\$1,264) is justified by the facts recited in this Agreed Order, and considered in light of the factors set forth in TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 341.049(b). The Respondent has paid the One Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-Four Dollar (\$1,264) administrative penalty.

### III. ORDERING PROVISIONS

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ORDERS that:

1. The Respondent is assessed an administrative penalty in the amount of One Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-Four Dollars (\$1,264) as set forth in Section II, Paragraph 7 above, for violations of TCEQ rules and state statutes. The payment of this administrative penalty and the Respondent's compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreed Order completely resolve the violations set forth by this Agreed Order in this action. However, the Commission shall not be constrained in any manner from requiring corrective actions or penalties for other violations that are not raised here. Administrative penalty payments shall be made payable to "TCEQ" and shall be sent with the notation "Re: Robert F. Bryer dba Bentwood Estates Mobile Home Park, Docket No. 2013-0218-PWS-E" to:

2. The Respondent shall undertake the following technical requirements:
  - a. Within 10 days after the effective date of this Agreed Order:
    - i. Implement procedures to ensure that all necessary public notifications are provided in a timely manner to the customers of the Facility, in accordance with 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.122; and
    - ii. Begin complying with applicable coliform monitoring requirements by collecting all routine, increased, and repeat coliform distribution samples when required, and providing water that meets the provisions regarding microbial contaminants, in accordance with 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.109. This provision will be satisfied upon six consecutive months of compliant monitoring and reporting.
  - b. Within 25 days after the effective date of this Agreed Order, submit written certification as described in Ordering Provision No. 2.g. below, and include detailed supporting documentation including photographs, receipts, and/or other records to demonstrate compliance with Ordering Provision No. 2.a.i.;
  - c. Within 30 days after the effective date of this Agreed Order, update the Facility's operational guidance and conduct employee training to ensure that self-reporting requirements are properly accomplished, including the timely submission of signed and certified DLQORs, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.110;
  - d. Within 45 days after the effective date of this Agreed Order, submit written certification as described in Ordering Provision No. 2.g. below, and include detailed supporting documentation including photographs, receipts, and/or other records to demonstrate compliance with Ordering Provision No. 2.c.;
  - e. Within 90 days after the effective date of this Order, begin submitting DLQORs to the Executive Director each quarter, by the tenth day of the month following the end of the quarter, in accordance with 30 TEX. 3. The provisions of this Agreed Order shall apply to and be binding upon the Respondent. The Respondent is ordered to give notice of the Agreed Order to personnel who maintain day-to-day control over the Facility operations referenced in this Agreed Order.
4. The Executive Director may grant an extension of any deadline in this Agreed Order or in any plan, report, or other document submitted pursuant to this Agreed Order, upon a written and substantiated showing of good cause. All requests for extensions by the Respondent shall be made in writing to the Executive Director. Extensions are not effective until the Respondent receives written approval from the Executive Director. The determination of what constitutes good cause rests solely with the Executive Director.
5. The Executive Director may refer this matter to the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas ("OAG") for further enforcement proceedings without notice to the

- Respondent if the Executive Director determines that the Respondent has not complied with one or more of the terms or conditions in this Agreed Order.
6. This Agreed Order shall terminate five years from its effective date or upon compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreed Order, whichever is later.
  7. This Agreed Order, issued by the Commission, shall not be admissible against the Respondent in a civil proceeding, unless the proceeding is brought by the OAG to: (1) enforce the terms of this Agreed Order; or (2) pursue violations of a statute within the Commission's jurisdiction, or of a rule adopted or an order or permit issued by the Commission under such a statute.
  8. This Agreed Order may be executed in separate and multiple counterparts, which together shall constitute a single instrument. Any page of this Agreed Order may be copied, scanned, digitized, converted to electronic portable document format ("pdf"), or otherwise reproduced and may be transmitted by digital or electronic transmission, including but not limited to facsimile transmission and electronic mail. Any signature affixed to this Agreed Order shall constitute an original signature for all purposes and may be used, filed, substituted, or issued for any purpose for which an original signature could be used. The term "signature" shall include manual signatures and true and accurate reproductions of manual signatures created, executed, endorsed, adopted, or authorized by the person or persons to whom the signatures are attributable. Signatures may be copied or reproduced digitally, electronically, by photocopying, engraving, imprinting, lithographing, electronic mail, facsimile transmission, stamping, or any other means or process which the Executive Director deems acceptable. In this paragraph exclusively, the terms "electronic transmission", "owner", "person", "writing", and "written" shall have the meanings assigned to them under TEX. BUS. ORG. CODE § 1.002.
  9. The Chief Clerk shall provide a copy of this Agreed Order to each of the parties. By law, the effective date of this Agreed Order is the third day after the mailing date, as provided by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.10(b) and TEX. GOV'T CODE § 2001.142.
