Summary of Request:

The Rio Grande Watermaster Program seeks approval of its FY 2017 proposed assessment for annual costs of operations based on its operating budget which consists of a \$50 base fee applicable to each assessment account. A penalty of 5.0% of any delinquent fee shall be imposed on a person who fails to pay the required fee when due and if the person fails to pay the fee within 30 days after the date the fee is due, an additional 5.0% penalty shall be imposed. Delinquent fees will accrue interest beginning on the 61st day after the due date. The yearly interest rate on all delinquent fees required under this title is the prime rate plus one percent, as published in the *Wall Street Journal* on the first day of each calendar year that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or a legal holiday. Penalties and/or interest fees may be waived by the Executive Director for good cause. The Executive Director estimates the proposed assessment of Nine Hundred Thirty-Four Thousand Three Hundred Thirty-Eight Dollars and Seventy-Eight Cents (\$934,338.78) will generate revenue of Nine Hundred Fifteen Thousand Six Hundred Fifty-Two Dollars and Zero Cents (\$915,652.00) for FY 2017.

CONSIDERATION OF FISCAL YEAR 2017 ASSESSMENT OF ANNUAL COSTS FOR WATERMASTER OPERATIONS IN THE RIO GRANDE WATER DIVISION.

Pursuant to Texas Water Code Section 11.329 and 30 Tex. Admin. Code Sections 12.1, 12.3, 12.5, and 303.71-303.73 of the Commission Rules, the Executive Director requests that the Commission consider Watermaster assessment of annual costs for the fiscal year beginning September 1, 2016, and ending August 31, 2017, for water right holders in the Rio Grande Water Division, which extends from Fort Quitman, Texas to the mouth of the Rio Grande River, excluding the watersheds of the Pecos and Devils Rivers and including that portion of the Nueces-Rio Grande Costal Basin lying in Hidalgo, Cameron, Willacy, and Starr Counties whose source of water is the Rio Grande, and approve \$934,338.78 as the amount to be assessed for annual costs.

AN ORDER

Assessing the Annual Cost of Operation for the Rio Grande Water Division and Associated Basins for the fiscal year beginning September 1, 2016, and ending August 31, 2017:

Docket No. 2016-0971-BGT; Rio Grande Watermaster

On September 7, 2016, after proper notice and public hearing as provided in Texas Water Code § 11.329, came to be considered by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("Commission") the matter of cost for the Watermaster operations in the said Division for the fiscal year beginning September 1, 2016, and ending August 31, 2017. After reviewing the supporting documentation, the Commission finds as follows:

1. The area subject to the order and referred to as the "Rio Grande" herein extends from Fort Quitman, Texas to the mouth of the Rio Grande River, excluding the watersheds of the Pecos and Devils Rivers, and including that portion of the Nueces-Rio Grande Coastal Basin in Hidalgo, Cameron, Willacy, and Starr Counties whose source of water is the Rio Grande;
2. Pursuant to Texas Water Code § 11.329, the holders of water rights which are to be administered by the Watermaster may be assessed the compensation and necessary expenses of a Watermaster, assistant Watermasters, and other necessary employees;
3. 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 303.71-303.73 set forth formulas and procedures for the assessment of costs of the Watermaster operations in the Rio Grande;
4. The procedures set out in the Texas Water Code § 11.329 and 30 TAC § 303.71 were followed for this assessment;
5. The compensation and necessary expenses of a Watermaster and other necessary employees for the fiscal year beginning September 1, 2016, and ending August 31, 2017, will require the amount to be assessed in the sum of Nine Hundred Thirty-Four Thousand Three Hundred Thirty-Eight Dollars and Seventy-Eight Cents (\$934,338.78).
6. The charges, fees, formulas for assessment rates, and method for assessing and levying costs approved below constitute an equitable apportionment of costs, as required by Texas Water Code § 11.329;
7. All requirements of Texas Water Code § 11.329 and 30 TAC §§ 303.71-303.73 have been met.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY:

1. That the amount of Nine Hundred Thirty-Four Thousand Three Hundred Thirty-Eight Dollars and Seventy-Eight Cents (\$934,338.78) is approved as the total amount to be assessed for annual costs of operations of the Rio Grande Watermaster during the fiscal year beginning September 1, 2016, and ending August 31, 2017, and that such amount is assessed against the water rights holders in the Rio Grande Water Division in the manner described in this order and pursuant to 30 TAC §§ 303.71-303.73;
2. That the following charges, rates, fees, formulas for assessment rates and method for assessing and levying costs are approved and shall be implemented by the Executive Director:
 - a. Except as provided for "no charge" water and excess flow permits below, a base charge for each assessment account of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00);
 - b. No base charge for "no charge" water diverted pursuant to Texas Water Code § 11.0871;
 - c. No base charge for excess flow water rights authorized under 30 TAC § 303.61;
 - d. Assessment rates for each assessment account to be calculated by the Executive Director in accordance with the procedures set forth in 30 TAC § 303.72;
 - e. Assessment of costs and levy of assessments for each account in accordance with procedures set forth in 30 TAC § 303.73;
 - f. A penalty of 5.0% of the fee due shall be imposed when the assessment is not paid on time. If the assessment is not paid within 30 days after the day on which the fee is due, an additional 5.0% penalty shall be imposed pursuant to 30 TAC Chapter 12;
 - g. Delinquent fees accrue interest beginning on the 61st day after their due date;
 - h. Penalties and/or interest under this section may be waived by the Executive Director for good cause; and
3. That the Executive Director shall specify dates by which payments assessed pursuant to this order shall be paid or postmarked.

Subject: Fiscal Year (FY) 2017 Proposed Assessment of Annual Costs of Operations for the Rio Grande Watermaster Program

The Rio Grande Watermaster fund is required by Texas Water Code (TWC) § 11.329 to pay compensation and expenses of the Watermaster and to pay expenditures for equipment, facilities, and capital expenditures necessary for Watermaster operations when recommended by the Watermaster Advisory Committee (WAC) and the Executive Director and approved by the Commission.

A copy of the document, "Rio Grande Watermaster Operations," was provided to Rio Grande WAC members on June 13, 2016 and during a public meeting on July 21, 2016 in Harlingen, Texas. The second column, "FY17 Operating Budget Needs" indicates the projected program needs within the FY 2017 appropriation. Also, attached to this memo is a copy of the public meeting notice for the July 21, 2016 Rio Grande WAC meeting. An additional public meeting notice was mailed on August 8, 2016 to all affected water right holders regarding this budget item scheduled for the September 7, 2016 commission agenda. A copy of that notice and the mailing affidavit from the Chief Clerk's office are also attached. As required by the TWC, this notice provides thirty (30) days notice of the budget hearing.

The Rio Grande WAC members voted to approve staff's recommendation for the proposed "FY17 Operating Budget Needs" in the amount of \$915,652.00. A copy of the WAC meeting agenda is attached for your information.

Staff recommends the "FY17 Operating Budget Needs" in the amount of \$915,652.00. Using this budget amount, the program calculates its assessment based on a 98% collection rate; therefore, the total assessment amount is \$934,338.78 with a municipal rate of \$0.4148. This staff proposal represents an increase of \$0.0203 from the previous year's municipal rate of \$0.3945.

- (7) Travel In-State maximum amounts are established at an agency level; an increase in WM travel funding cannot be accommodated without a corresponding decrease in travel funding in another agency program.
- (8) A proportionate share of the annual TCEQ Regional Office building rent is charged to the Watermaster Program.
- (9) Other Operating Expenses includes items designated by the Texas Comptroller's Office that do not fall into any remaining budget category (for example: annual vehicle inspection fees, vehicle decals, etc.).
- (10) Facilities, Furniture & Equipment (FFE) includes but is not limited to non-LAR equipment less than \$5,000 in cost, non-consumable supplies, vehicle maintenance and repairs, etc.
- (11) Capital Equipment - Non LAR includes capital items with a cost between \$5,000 and \$24,999.

The compensation and necessary expenses of the Rio Grande Watermaster Operations for the 2017 fiscal year is Nine Hundred Fifteen Thousand, Six Hundred Fifty-Two Dollars and Zero Cents (**\$915,652.00**). Of this amount, Six Hundred Forty-Three Thousand Four Hundred Fifty-Eight Dollars and Zero Cents (**\$643,458.00**) are needed for program staff base salaries and benefits (including longevity, salary enhancements, and fringe) and the remaining Two Hundred Seventy-Two Thousand One Hundred Ninety-Four Dollars and Zero Cents (**\$272,194.00**) are needed for program operating costs. Based on a 98% collection rate, these necessary expenses require a total assessment of Nine Hundred Thirty-Four Thousand Three Hundred Thirty-Eight Dollars and Seventy-Eight Cents (**\$934,338.78**) with a municipal rate of **\$0.4148**.

This notice is provided to all holders of water rights as required by the Texas Water Code Section 11.329. You may attend this meeting and provide comments to the Commission concerning this item. Enclosed for your review is a preliminary Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2017 (FY17) for the Rio Grande Watermaster Program (RGWM). This notice is required by the Texas Water Code to be submitted at least 30 days before the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (Commission, or TCEQ) meets to consider a proposed order establishing the final assessment amount (Texas Water Code, Section 11.329(b)).

The Watermaster will present a detailed proposed budget to the Watermaster Advisory Committee (WAC) during a meeting at the TCEQ's Harlingen regional office on Thursday, July 21, 2016 at 2:00 p.m. Staff will mail a notification of this meeting to all water right holders and will provide an opportunity for the public to provide comments at the meeting.

The following list includes the pending time frames for budget approval:

- **July 21:** The WAC will meet to discuss the preliminary budget.
- **July 22-31:** TCEQ management will review the proposed budget.
- **By August 8:** TCEQ will mail notice of Commission meeting to all water right holders.
- **September 7:** The Commission will meet to consider approval of the FY17 budget.
- **October:** TCEQ will mail FY17 invoices to water right holders.

The proposed assessment provides funding needed to support the Watermaster Program without additional TCEQ subsidy. Preliminary calculations indicate that the total amount to be assessed for FY17 would be \$934,338.78. See the attached draft budget for details.

- perform other duties requested by the executive director with regard to the watermaster operations, or perform other duties requested by water rights holders that the committee determines would benefit the administration of water rights.
