- ii. Implement procedures to ensure that all necessary public notifications are provided in a timely manner to persons served by the Facility and a copy of the public notification is submitted to the ED;

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- iii. Provide public notification regarding the failure to conduct routine coliform monitoring for the months of October 2013 and July 2014, and regarding the failure to submit a DLQOR for the second and third quarters of 2014, and provide a copy of each public notification to the ED; and
 - iv. Mail one copy of the consumer notification of lead tap water monitoring results to persons served at the sites that were tested for the most recent monitoring period in which lead samples were collected.
- b. Within 45 days:
- i. Submit written certification to demonstrate compliance with a.; and
 - ii. Submit to the Commission a copy of the consumer notification provided to the persons served at the locations that were sampled for lead and the certification that the consumer notification has been distributed in a manner consistent with TCEQ requirements.
- c. Within 60 days, submit written certification to demonstrate compliance with b.ii.
- d. Within 90 days, begin submitting DLQORs to the ED each quarter by the tenth day of the month following the end of the quarter. This provision will be satisfied upon two consecutive quarters of compliant reporting.
- e. Within 285 days, submit written certification to demonstrate compliance with d.

AGREED ORDER

At its _____ agenda, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("the Commission" or "TCEQ") considered this agreement of the parties, resolving an enforcement action regarding The Mission Texas International Training Center (the "Respondent") under the authority of TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ch. 341. The Executive Director of the TCEQ, through the Enforcement Division, and the Respondent presented this agreement to the Commission.

The Respondent understands that it has certain procedural rights at certain points in the enforcement process, including, but not limited to, the right to formal notice of violations, notice of an evidentiary hearing, the right to an evidentiary hearing, and a right to appeal. By entering into this Agreed Order, the Respondent agrees to waive all notice and procedural rights.

It is further understood and agreed that this Order represents the complete and fully-integrated settlement of the parties. The provisions of this Agreed Order are deemed severable and, if a court of competent jurisdiction or other appropriate authority deems any provision of this Agreed Order unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and enforceable. The duties and responsibilities imposed by this Agreed Order are binding upon the Respondent.

The Commission makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law:

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Respondent owns and operates a public water supply located at 571 Shanes Lane near Weatherford, Parker County, Texas (the "Facility") that has 11 service connections and serves at least 25 people per day for at least 60 days per year.
2. During a record review conducted from July 6, 2015 through July 17, 2015, TCEQ staff documented that the Respondent did not submit a Disinfectant Level Quarterly Operating Report ("DLQOR") to the Executive Director each quarter by the tenth day of the month following the end of the quarter for the second quarter of 2014 through the first quarter of 2015 and did not provide public notification and submit a copy of the notification to the Executive Director regarding the failure to submit a DLQOR to the Executive Director for the second and third quarters of 2014.
3. During a record review conducted from July 6, 2015 through July 17, 2015, TCEQ staff documented that the Respondent did not mail consumer notification of lead tap water monitoring results to persons served at the locations that were sampled and did not submit to the TCEQ a copy of the consumer notification and certification that the consumer notification has been distributed to the persons served at the locations in a manner consistent with TCEQ requirements for the January 1, 2014 through June 30, 2014 and July 1, 2014 through December 31, 2014 monitoring periods.
4. During a record review conducted from July 6, 2015 through July 17, 2015, TCEQ staff documented that the Respondent did not provide public notification and submit a copy of the public notification to the Executive Director regarding the failure to conduct routine coliform monitoring for the months of October 2013 and July 2014.
5. The Respondent received notice of the violations on July 22, 2015.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Respondent is subject to the jurisdiction of the TCEQ pursuant to TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY Code ch. 341 and the rules of the Commission.
2. As evidenced by Findings of Fact No. 2, the Respondent failed to submit a DLQOR to the Executive Director each quarter by the tenth day of the month following the end of the quarter and failed to provide public notification and submit a copy of the notification to the Executive Director regarding the failure to submit a DLQOR to the Executive Director, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 290.110(e)(4)(A) and (f)(3) and 290.122(c)(2)(A) and (f).
3. As evidenced by Findings of Fact No. 3, the Respondent failed to mail consumer notification of lead tap water monitoring results to persons served at the locations that were sampled and failed to submit to the TCEQ a copy of the consumer notification and certification that the consumer notification has been distributed to the persons served at

the locations in a manner consistent with TCEQ requirements, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.117(i)(6) and (j).

4. As evidenced by Findings of Fact No. 4, the Respondent failed to provide public notification and submit a copy of the public notification to the Executive Director regarding the failure to conduct routine coliform monitoring, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.122(c)(2)(A) and (f).
5. Pursuant to TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 341.049, the Commission has the authority to assess an administrative penalty against the Respondent for violations of the Texas Water Code and the Texas Health and Safety Code within the Commission's jurisdiction; for violations of rules adopted under such statutes; or for violations of orders or permits issued under such statutes.
6. An administrative penalty in the amount of Five Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$580) is justified by the facts recited in this Agreed Order, and considered in light of the factors set forth in TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY Code § 341.049(b). The Respondent has paid the Five Hundred Eighty Dollar (\$580) administrative penalty.

III. ORDERING PROVISIONS

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ORDERS that:

1. The Respondent is assessed an administrative penalty in the amount of Five Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$580) as set forth in Section II, Paragraph 6 above, for violations of TCEQ rules and state statutes. The payment of this administrative penalty and the Respondent's compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreed Order completely resolve the violations set forth by this Agreed Order in this action. However, the Commission shall not be constrained in any manner from requiring corrective actions or penalties for other violations that are not raised here. Administrative penalty payments shall be made payable to "TCEQ" and shall be sent with the notation "Re: The Mission Texas International Training Center, Docket No. 2015-1209-PWS-E" to:

2. The Respondent shall undertake the following technical requirements:
 - a. Within 30 days after the effective date of this Agreed Order:

- i. Update the Facility's operational guidance and conduct employee training to ensure that self-reporting requirements are properly accomplished, including the timely submission of signed and certified DLQORs, in accordance with 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.110;
 - ii. Implement procedures to ensure that all necessary public notifications are provided in a timely manner to persons served by the Facility and a copy of the public notification is submitted to the Executive Director, in accordance with 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.122;
 - iii. Provide public notification regarding the failure to conduct routine coliform monitoring for the months of October 2013 and July 2014, and regarding the failure to submit a DLQOR for the second and third quarters of 2014, and provide a copy of each public notification to the Executive Director, in accordance with 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.122; and
 - iv. Mail one copy of the consumer notification of lead tap water monitoring results to persons served at the sites that were tested for the most recent monitoring period in which lead samples were collected, in accordance with 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.117.
- b. Within 45 days after the effective date of this Agreed Order:
- i. Submit written certification as described in Ordering Provision No. 2.e. below, and include detailed supporting documentation including photographs, receipts, and/or other records to demonstrate compliance with Ordering Provisions Nos. 2.a.i. through 2.a.iv.; and
 - ii. Submit to the Commission a copy of the consumer notification provided to the persons served at the locations that were sampled for lead and the certification that the consumer notification has been distributed in a manner consistent with TCEQ requirements, as required by 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.117. The copy of the consumer notification and the certification shall be mailed to:

- c. Within 90 days after the effective date of this Agreed Order, begin submitting DLQORs to the Executive Director each quarter by the tenth day of the month following the end of the quarter, in accordance with 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.110. This provision will be satisfied upon two consecutive quarters of compliant reporting. DLQORs shall be submitted to:

"I certify under penalty of law that I have personally examined and am familiar with the information submitted and all attached documents, and that based on my inquiry of those individuals immediately responsible for obtaining the information, I believe that the submitted information is true, accurate and complete. I am aware that there are significant penalties for submitting false information, including the possibility of fines and imprisonment for knowing violations."

3. The provisions of this Agreed Order shall apply to and be binding upon the Respondent. The Respondent is ordered to give notice of the Agreed Order to personnel who maintain day-to-day control over the Facility operations referenced in this Agreed Order.
4. The Executive Director may grant an extension of any deadline in this Agreed Order or in any plan, report, or other document submitted pursuant to this Agreed Order, upon a written and substantiated showing of good cause. All requests for extensions by the Respondent shall be made in writing to the Executive Director. Extensions are not effective until the Respondent receives written approval from the Executive Director. The determination of what constitutes good cause rests solely with the Executive Director.
5. The Executive Director may refer this matter to the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas ("OAG") for further enforcement proceedings without notice to the Respondent if the Executive Director determines that the Respondent has not complied with one or more of the terms or conditions in this Agreed Order.
6. This Agreed Order shall terminate five years from its effective date or upon compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreed Order, whichever is later.
7. This Agreed Order, issued by the Commission, shall not be admissible against the Respondent in a civil proceeding, unless the proceeding is brought by the OAG to: (1) enforce the terms of this Agreed Order; or (2) pursue violations of a statute within the Commission's jurisdiction, or of a rule adopted or an order or permit issued by the Commission under such a statute.
8. This Agreed Order may be executed in separate and multiple counterparts, which together shall constitute a single instrument. Any page of this Agreed Order may be copied, scanned, digitized, converted to electronic portable document format ("pdf"), or otherwise reproduced and may be transmitted by digital or electronic transmission, including but not limited to facsimile transmission and electronic mail. Any signature affixed to this Agreed Order shall constitute an original signature for all purposes and may be used, filed, substituted, or issued for any purpose for which an original signature could be used. The term "signature" shall include manual signatures and true and accurate reproductions of manual signatures created, executed, endorsed, adopted, or authorized by the person or persons to whom the signatures are attributable. Signatures may be copied or reproduced digitally, electronically, by photocopying, engraving, imprinting, lithographing, electronic mail, facsimile transmission, stamping, or any other means or process which the Executive Director deems acceptable. In this paragraph exclusively, the terms "electronic transmission", "owner", "person", "writing", and "written" shall have the meanings assigned to them under TEX. BUS. ORG. CODE § 1.002.
9. The effective date of this Order is the date it is signed by the Commission. A copy of this fully executed Order shall be provided to each of the parties.
