
To my understanding the property belonging to JOCO Holding Corp. is still attempting to discharge their sewage into Quill Miller Creek. The proposed route that this treated water is supposed to take is going to follow a series of ditches that will eventually lead into Quill Miller Creek. The problem that I have with this proposed discharge of waste water is that the series of ditches that it is going to take goes right through the middle of my property. My property does not drain well as it is and to think that backed up sewage from across the highway is sitting, stagnating and attracting mosquitoes is completely ridiculous. I consider my property one of my most valuable assets, and pride myself in the way that it looks and the thought of someone dumping treated or untreated or partially treated waste water on my land does not appeal to me at all. I also raise registered Black Angus cattle and do not want them grazing, or drinking any of this treated sewage. In the letter that I received, it stated that the discharged sewage would meet the standards set by the Texas Surface Water Quality Standards and that it "should not pose a problem to cattle." The last time I checked the word "should" is somewhat, partially, and not always right. So to me this means that it could or would possibly pose a threat to my livestock. No thank you! I more importantly am a father of two wonderful kids who have the right to play, and enjoy the benefits of farm life. But if this waste should not pose a problem to cattle, but could or would if not properly treated at all times, what larger effect could or would it have on my children. Sounds to me like this entire situation has an extreme amount of risks for me, my family, my neighbors and anyone else whose property is along Quill Miller Creek. Lake Arlington is approximately 25 miles from the property belonging to JOCO Holding Corp. And to me that seems like a long stretch of potential problems due to their inability to handle their own wastewater. I believe that the City of Burleson should be responsible for handling this waste and should come up with a solution to this problem that does not endanger or inconvenience the property owners of my area. I have also talked with all of my neighbors and they all take the same stance that I do and thank that it is

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unlawful for this proposal to be passed and will take this matter into the court system and fight it from there if necessary. So in closing please consider my Request for Reconsideration and do not move forward to approve this Permit No. WQ0002730000.

My name is Tim Davis and this letter is in response to a letter that I received this past week. Evidently the motel across the highway ~~that is now part of~~ the city of Burleson Texas needs a place to dump it's waste water, since the city does not provide sewer or drainage services to them. My primary concern regarding this matter is how they are going to get these some 10,000 gallons of water per day to Quil Miller Creek. The series of ditches that you spoke of in your letter I presume are the ditches that I have dug to help my place drain adequately. If this is the case, I am protesting this proposal as it would create undesirable amounts of standing water on my property at all times. My place does not drain well as it is and any additional amounts of water would just compound my existing problem dramatically. Not only this but the last thing I want is to have to have some ones waste water treated or not flowing across or even in a creek near my home. Please provide me with detailed maps of the proposed route of drainage that this wastewater is supposed to take on its path to Lake Arlington. Please arrange a public meeting as soon as possible to discuss this matter in its entirety with those residents of this local area. Quil Miller Creek is a long and winding creek that contacts many local ranches and communities. I find it hard to believe that the people of this area would approve such a proposal of this kind. The motel should be responsible for their own waste water whether it be septic system installation or the city of Burleson piping them adequate sewage to handle their approximately 10,000 gallons a day. This problem should not be mine to have to deal with, but theirs. Additional water of any kind would create huge amounts of mud, mosquitoes, flies and other undesirable issues that would impact my quality of life that I so enjoy. I also graze cattle along that route and do not want my cows drinking treated waste water or eating grass that is growing in waste water land. My name is Tim Davis and my address is 175 W. NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF APPLICATION AND INTENT TO OBTAIN A WATER QUALITY PERMIT AMENDMENT

PERMIT NO. WQ0002730000

APPLICATION. JOCO Holding Corporation, P.O. Box 10, Burleson, Texas 76097, which operates a motel and restaurant complex, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) to amend wastewater disposal Permit No. WQ0002730000 to authorize the discharge of treated wastewater at a volume not to exceed a daily average flow of 10,000 gallons per day under a Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) Permit (EPA I.D. No. TX0127671). The facility is located on the east side of Interstate Highway 35 West, approximately 2,000 feet southeast of the Bethesda Road overpass and approximately 5.1 miles southeast of the City of Burleson, Johnson County, Texas. The discharge route is from the plant site to a series of ditches; thence to Quil Miller Creek; thence to Lake Arlington. This application was submitted to the TCEQ on October 20, 2004. The permit application is available for viewing and copying at the U.S. Post Office, 232 Southwest Johnson Avenue, Burleson, Texas.

The TCEQ executive director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application. After completion of the technical review, the TCEQ will issue a Notice of Application and Preliminary Decision.

PUBLIC COMMENT / PUBLIC MEETING. You may submit public comments or request a public meeting about this application. The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or to ask questions about the application. ~~The TCEQ will hold a public meeting if the executive director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.~~

Written public comments or requests for public meeting must be submitted to the Office of the Chief Clerk, MC 105, TCEQ, P.O. Box 13087, Austin, TX 78711-3087.

ADDITIONAL NOTICE. After technical review of the application is complete, the executive director may prepare a draft permit and will issue a preliminary decision on the application. **Notice of the Application and Preliminary Decision will be published and mailed to those who are on the county-wide mailing list or the mailing list for this application. That notice will contain the final deadline for submitting public comments.**

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. After the deadline for public comments, the executive director will consider the comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. **The response to comments, along with the executive director's decision on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments or who requested to be on the mailing list for this application. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions for requesting reconsideration of the executive director's decision and for requesting a contested case hearing.** A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in a state district court.

A contested case hearing will only be granted based on disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material to the Commission's decision on the application. Further, the Commission will only grant a hearing on issues that were raised during the public comment period and not withdrawn.



Clearly specify which mailing list(s) to which you wish to be added and send your request to the TCEQ Office of the Chief Clerk at the address above. Unless you otherwise specify, you will be included only on the mailing list for this specific application.



My name is Faye Woods and I live at 305 West Bethesda Rd. in Burleson TX. I received a new letter from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality with a Permit number of WQ0002730000. Evidently the hotel across the highway is still trying to dump their sewage into Quill Miller Creek. Well I feel like this is totally unacceptable because first of all there is no "real series of ditches" that leads to Quill Miller Creek from I 35. My land is in a flood zone and all of the water that comes from that direction just stops on my property and sits. I personally think that is disgusting and would like to know how you would feel about treated sewage sitting on your property? I also am concerned because I lease my land to Tim Davis for agricultural purposes and he grazes cattle on it. What long term effects could this cause? Another problem that I see with this other than environmental damages is the problem with mosquitoes and other pests that this would attract. Quill Miller Creek stays dry most of the time and the thought of it flowing with sewage is sickening. Lake Arlington is a long way from Burleson TX. I would really like to see how exactly you intend getting this treated sewer water that far? Or do you really know if what you are proposing will even work? I think that the City of Burleson should be responsible for providing that hotel with sewer service, since they did annex them into the city limits. But under no certain circumstances am I interested in letting this waste water sit or even come across my land. So please consider this as My Request For Reconsideration on the Permit No WQ0002730000. That hotel should put in a septic tank at their own expense instead of using my land to deal with their sewage problem!
