


I, James G. This application is for a wastewater treatment plant to be constructed to serve a new subdivision planned in the area. The plants location will be near the south side of the Carriage Hills property line. This would place the plant behind my home. The proposed distance from my house is less than a few hundred yards away. The prevailing winds from the south along with the noise will negatively impact my home as well as the Carriage Hills subdivision. Quality of living, property values and potentially the general health of my self, family and neighbors will be negatively affected by this plant as proposed.

The potential to locate the plant away from my home, the existing Carriage Hills subdivision, exist now. I request a contested case hearing for Proposed Permit Number WQ0014671001. The permit applicant is Houston Intercontinental Trade Center, L.P.


My name is Robert Morgan. I live at 2325 Cobblecreek Drive, Conroe, TX 77384 and own the house in which I reside. My home phone number is 936-273-3198. This is in the Carriage Hills subdivision, and is in close proximity to the wastewater treatment plant proposed to be built on the former Jacobs Ranch.

The proposed waste water treatment plant would be located to the south and east of the Carriage Hills subdivision, and would be within approximately 2,000 feet of my house. The discharge ditch is planned to be located between the proposed plant and the homes along Cobblecreek Drive, within 300 feet of the property lines of my neighbors across the street. As you may be aware, during the summer months in this area, the prevailing winds come out of the south and southeast towards the north and northwest, and would carry the smell directly over our neighborhood. I moved to Carriage Hills from the coastal area of Florida, and am well acquainted with the smell of the mangrove swamps blowing in from the bays. Thus, I know from experience that the smell from the wastewater plant would substantially lower our quality of life, as well as adversely affect our property values. In fact, it is highly likely that we would be more adversely affected than the residents of the proposed subdivision that the plant is intended to serve.

I am even more concerned due to the fact that the posted location of the plant, the plat available for review, and the latitude and longitude location listed all appear to place the proposed plant at varying degrees of proximity to our subdivision and my house.

Thank you for your consideration. Please inform me of your decision regarding my request.





This is in the Carriage Hills subdivision, and is in close proximity to the wastewater treatment plant proposed to be built on the former Jacobs Ranch.

The proposed waste water treatment plant would be located to the south and east of the Carriage Hills subdivision, and would be within approximately 2,000 feet of my house. The discharge ditch is planned to be located between the proposed plant and the homes along Cobblecreek Drive, within 300 feet of the property lines of my neighbors across the street. As you may be aware, during the summer months in this area, the prevailing winds come out of the south and southeast towards the north and northwest, and would carry the smell directly over our neighborhood. I have visited wastewater plants, and I know from experience that the smell from the wastewater plant would substantially lower our quality of life, as well as adversely affect our property values. Wastewater plants in general are not built in such proximity to neighboring homes because of the strong and offensive smell, similar in some cases to walking into a port-a-potty. We would most likely that we would be more adversely affected than the residents of the proposed subdivision that the plant is intended to serve, because of the winds.

I am even more concerned due to the fact that the posted location of the plant, the plat available for review, and the latitude and longitude location listed all appear to place the proposed plant at varying degrees of proximity to our subdivision and my house.



Houston Intercontinental Trade Center, L.P., 14405 Walters Road, Suite 800, Houston, Texas 77014, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for proposed Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) Permit No. WQ0014671001 (EPA I.D. No. TX0128431) to authorize the discharge of treated wastewater.

As residents of the Carriage Hills subdivision, we are very concerned about the possibility of a waste water treatment plant being built in the planned location. Based upon the application and plans that can be reviewed at the Montgomery County Library, this wastewater treatment plant will be constructed just a few hundred yards to the south of the Carriage Hills southern property line, almost directly behind our house. Not to mention the noise created by this proposed plant, with a prevailing wind from the south and southeast for a majority of the year, the smell will be drifting over Carriage Hills. We believe that this will directly affect those homes along Cobblecreek Drive east of Jacobs Court to the dead-end including Cobblecreek Court, Bergman Court, and Woodstone Court, and indirectly affect many others.

We would like to see the plant be built in another part of the property; possibly the Northeastern section. There are no homes to the North of that area that would be affected if the plant were to be constructed there.

We request a contested case hearing.

We are writing this letter in regards to the following proposal:



We live at 1114 Woodstone Ct in Conroe, Texas, 77384. It has come to our attention that a new subdivision will be constructed to the east and south of our development, Carriage Hills. We have major concerns regarding the location of the wastewater treatment plant which will be constructed for this subdivision. Our southern property line directly borders the land which is to be developed. If the wastewater treatment plant is constructed in its proposed location, our property will be diversely affected by this plant. Not only will our property value be diminished by the close proximity of the wastewater treatment plant, but we also have many environmental concerns. We will be adversely affected by the site, sound, and smell of this wastewater treatment plant. The south-southeast prevailing winds will bring the sound and smell directly over our property. Furthermore, our property lays at a lower elevation than the proposed site. We are concerned that any potential runoff would be funneled directly onto our property. The applicant has recently purchased 406 acres to develop a new subdivision. In this new subdivision they are going to build a waste treatment facility. This facility will be built less than one mile from our common area for Carriage Hills subdivision directly to the west. This common area has a place for tennis, basket ball, picnic area, and a swing set. The area is used by everyone here in Carriage Hills subdivision from the elderly to the new born. It seems that it would be a shame to not be able to use this facility because of the order and noise produced from this water treatment facility. Why can't the facility be put in the northeast corner next to the flood plane? I know that the developer would rather make more money by selling a preferred lot but should all 600 plus households in Carriage Hills suffer so they can make an extra thousand dollars?

Why do they need a water treatment plant to begin with? Would it not be more environmentally sound for them to use the same septic as we have here in Carriage Hills? These new homes are going to produce 1000's of gallons of waste a day that will be dumped into the river system. This opens the door for a major catastrophe should we have flooding, torrential down pours, or a hurricane. Instead of these new homes using water from the reservoir to water their lawns why don't they use their septic water. This provides less drain on the reservoir and reduces the chance of polluting the river with raw sewage.

I hope that the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality will live up to its name and consider the environmental quality of not only us here in Carriage Hills but also everyone who uses the river, human and animal, and every person in the Conroe area who depends on their water from the reservoir.
