### **Decision of the Executive Director.**

The executive director has made a decision that the above-referenced permit application meets the requirements of applicable law. **This decision does not authorize construction or operation of any proposed facilities.** Unless a timely request for contested case hearing or reconsideration is received (see below), the TCEQ executive director will act on the application and issue the permit.

Enclosed with this letter is a copy of the Executive Director's Response to Comments. A copy of the complete application, draft permit and related documents, including public comments, is available for review at the TCEQ Central office. A copy of the complete application, the draft permit, and executive director's preliminary decision are available for viewing and copying at Missouri City Branch Library, 1530 Texas Parkway, Missouri City, Texas.

If you disagree with the executive director's decision, and you believe you are an "affected person" as defined below, you may request a contested case hearing. In addition, anyone may request reconsideration of the executive director's decision. A brief description of the procedures for these two requests follows.

### **How To Request a Contested Case Hearing.**

It is important that your request include all the information that supports your right to a contested case hearing. You must demonstrate that you meet the applicable legal requirements to have your hearing request granted. The commission's consideration of your request will be based on the information you provide.

The request must include the following:

- (1) Your name, address, daytime telephone number, and, if possible, a fax number.
- (2) If the request is made by a group or association, the request must identify:
  - (A) one person by name, address, daytime telephone number, and, if possible, the fax number, of the person who will be responsible for receiving all communications and documents for the group; and
  - (B) one or more members of the group that would otherwise have standing to request a hearing in their own right. The interests the group seeks to protect must relate to the organization's purpose. Neither the claim asserted nor the relief requested must require the participation of the individual members in the case.
- (3) The name of the applicant, the permit number and other numbers listed above so that your request may be processed properly.
- (4) A statement clearly expressing that you are requesting a contested case hearing. For example, the following statement would be sufficient: "I request a contested case hearing."

Your request must demonstrate that you are an **"affected person."** An affected person is one who has a personal justiciable interest related to a legal right, duty, privilege, power, or economic interest affected by the application. Your request must describe how and why you would be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity in a manner not common to the general public. For example, to the extent your request is based on these concerns, you should describe the likely impact on your health, safety, or uses of your property which may be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activities. To demonstrate that you have a personal justiciable interest, you must state, as specifically as you are able, your location and the distance between your location and the proposed facility or activities.

Your request must raise disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material to the commission's decision on this application. The request must be based on issues that were raised during the comment period. The request cannot be based solely on issues raised in comments that have been withdrawn. The enclosed Response to Comments will allow you to determine the issues that were raised during the comment period and whether all comments raising an issue have been withdrawn. The public comments filed for this application are available for review and copying at the Chief Clerk's office at the address below.

To facilitate the commission's determination of the number and scope of issues to be referred to hearing, you should: 1) specify any of the executive director's responses to comments that you dispute; and 2) the factual basis of the dispute. In addition, you should list, to the extent possible, any disputed issues of law or policy.

### **How To Request Reconsideration of the Executive Director's Decision.**

Unlike a request for a contested case hearing, anyone may request reconsideration of the executive director's decision. A request for reconsideration should contain your name, address, daytime phone number, and, if possible, your fax number. The request must state that you are requesting reconsideration of the executive director's decision, and must explain why you believe the decision should be reconsidered.

### **Deadline for Submitting Requests.**

A request for a contested case hearing or reconsideration of the executive director's decision must be in writing and must be **received by** the Chief Clerk's office no later than **30 calendar days** after the date of this letter: You should submit your request to the following address:

### **Processing of Requests.**

Timely requests for a contested case hearing or for reconsideration of the executive director's decision will be referred to the alternative dispute resolution director and set on the agenda of one of the commission's regularly scheduled meetings. Additional instructions explaining these procedures will be sent to the attached mailing list when this meeting has been scheduled.

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The Executive Director of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (the Commission or TCEQ) files this Response to Public Comment (Response) on the application by Blue Ridge Landfill TX, LP (Applicant) for an amendment to Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) Permit Number 1505A and on the Executive Director's preliminary decision on the application. As required by Title 30 of the Texas Administrative Code (30 TAC), Section 55.156, before a permit is issued, the Executive Director prepares a response to all timely, relevant and material, or significant, comments. Office of the Chief Clerk timely received comment letters and comments at the public meetings. Commenter names are presented to the accuracy allowed by reproduction quality. Indecipherable signatures are indicated as "concerned citizens."

The following people submitted identical comments under petitions labeled "Briargate Subdivision" and will be referred to as **Group 1**.

## BACKGROUND

### Description of Facility

Blue Ridge Landfill TX, LP, 2200 FM 521, Fresno, TX 77545, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for a permit amendment to authorize a vertical and horizontal expansion of the existing Type I municipal solid waste landfill facility. The total permitted facility will include 1,344.88 acres of land of which 784.24 acres will be used for waste disposal. The final elevation of waste fill and soil cover material will be 235 feet above mean sea level. Waste acceptance rate is expected to initially average about 3,000 tons per day.

The expanded facility would be authorized to accept household solid waste, commercial solid waste, yard waste, Class 1 industrial non-hazardous waste, Class 2 industrial waste, Class 3 industrial waste, and special waste. The site is not authorized to accept those waste streams that are expressly prohibited by 30 TAC, Chapter 330, including but not limited to regulated hazardous waste, prohibited polychlorinated biphenyls, and infectious medical waste. Liquid waste will not be disposed in the landfill but will be accepted at the Liquid Waste Bulking Facility.

The facility is located approximately ½ mile south-southwest of the intersection of FM 2234 and FM 521, south of the city of Houston and north of the community of Fresno in Fort Bend County, Texas. The location is within the extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ) of the City of Houston but is nearest to the City of Pearland. The land within a mile of the proposed facility is 61.6% undeveloped, 32% residential or future residential, and 4% industrial. The structures that are within a mile of the proposed facility are primarily homes. There are approximately 1,420 people that reside within a mile of the proposed facility. The nearest residence is approximately 470 feet south of the permit boundary and about 1,320 feet south of the waste cell.

### Procedural Background

The application was received January 25, 2006, and declared administratively complete February 6, 2006. Notice of Receipt of Application and Intent to Obtain a Municipal Solid Waste Permit was published February 14, 2006, in the *Fort Bend Herald-Coaster*; February 15, 2006, in the *Houston Chronicle*; and February 22, 2006, in *Las Noticias de Fort Bend*. Notice of Public Meeting was published June 13, 20, and 27, 2006, in the *Fort Bend Herald-Coaster* and June 13, 19, and 26, 2006, in the *Houston Chronicle* for a public meeting held in Houston on July 6, 2006. The TCEQ Executive Director completed the technical review of the application on October 13, 2006, and prepared a draft permit. Notice of Application and Preliminary Decision for a Municipal Solid Waste Permit (NAPD) was published November 13, 2006, in the *Fort Bend Herald-Coaster* and the *Houston Chronicle* and November 16, 2006, in *Las Noticias de Fort Bend*. Notice of Public Meeting was published November 14, 21, and 28, 2006, in the *Houston Chronicle* and a second public

meeting was held in Houston on December 7, 2006. The public comment period closed on December 18, 2006. This application was administratively complete on or after September 1, 1999; therefore, this application is subject to the procedural requirements adopted pursuant to House Bill 801 (76<sup>th</sup> Legislature, 1999).<sup>1</sup>

#### **COMMENTS and RESPONSES**

Please note that nearly all comments were in opposition to the landfill or cited some concern over its construction or operation. Only comments from Fort Bend County Commissioner, Tom Stavinoha (including comments by Michael Gutierrez on behalf of Commissioner Stavinoha), Herb Appel, Chief Executive Officer for the Fort Bend County Economic Development Council, and Ron Armstrong were not in opposition to the expansion. Their comments are acknowledged, but will not be documented here and no responses will be provided.

### RESPONSE 1

The Executive Director has no authority under the Texas Solid Waste Disposal Act (TSWDA) to consider property values when reviewing an application. The Executive Director's review of a permit application considers whether the proposed facility meets the requirements of Chapter 330 of the Commission rules. In addition, Section 305.122(c) of TCEQ rules provide that the issuance of a permit does not authorize any injury to persons or property or an invasion of other property rights, or any infringement of state or local law or regulation.

### COMMENT 2 (Landfill Height, Visual Impact, and Visual Impact Studies)

Carla Bell, Jimmy Bell, Sherry Bell, Elliott Broughton, Delois Clark, Bruce Guillory, Jason Husbands, Taren Johnston, the individuals identified as Group 3, Mike and Julia Maher, Mayor Delores Martin, Carla Mayfield, Darryl Mayo, Jackie Neely, Jennifer Ogilvie, State Representative Dora Olivo, Steve Powell, Anita Prinz, Dale Reynolds, Martin Rosetta, Mary Ross, the individuals identified as Group 6, Peter Thorpe, Hallie and Dave Van Manen, Zhiyue Wang, Janiy Yates, Jerri Yenne, Qing Yuan, and the individuals identified as Group 8 feel that the landfill is too high and would have a negative visual impact on the surrounding community, noting that it would be the tallest structure in the area.

The individuals identified as Group 3 and Mike and Julia Maher questioned whether existing technology is adequate for disposal at these heights.

Elliott Broughton questioned the adequacy of statistical methods to address a landfill this tall.

Steve Powell, Martin Rosetta, Zhiyue Wang and Qing Yuan indicated that the applicant should be required to provide three-dimensional renderings of the facility to allow the community to better visualize the landfill at completion.

Mary Ross requested a copy of information related to a reported "helicopter study."

### RESPONSE 2

The Executive Director has no specific authority under the TSWDA to limit the height of a landfill or to consider visual impacts. Height is only limited indirectly by the geometry of the waste footprint and maximum allowable sideslopes of one vertical foot for every four horizontal feet. The height of this facility is approved through agreements between the Applicant and Fort Bend County and Missouri City, though these agreements were not required by rule. Over 20 landfills in Texas have been permitted to a height of 170 feet or higher. If the proposed landfill is constructed and operated as shown in the application and as required by regulation, including providing proper compaction of waste and cover and meeting allowable sideslopes, the Executive Director expects current technology to be more than adequate to operate the facility at the proposed height.

It is unclear which statistical methods are being questioned in the comment regarding adequacy of statistical methods for a landfill this tall. Statistical methods for leachate generation include the soil column. Statistical methods for runoff include the angle of the surface and the run length, thereby accounting for landfill height. Statistical methods for evaluation of groundwater quality are independent of landfill height. The Executive Director is unaware of any statistical method of calculation that would support the proposition that the application is inadequate based on the height of the landfill or any other factor.

As the Executive Director has no authority to consider visual impacts, MSW rules do not require visual impact studies or three-dimensional representations of the landfill. A "helicopter study" was mentioned during the first TCEQ-led public meeting. However, this study is not required by rule and has not been provided to the agency.

### **COMMENT 3** (Landfill Incompatibility with Surrounding Communities)

Many of these commenters indicated that §330.53(b)(8) requires that the landfill be compatible with the surrounding community.

### **RESPONSE 3**

The cited rule, §330.53(b)(8), states that "a primary concern is that the use of any land for an MSW site not adversely impact human health or the environment. The impact of the site upon a city, community, group of property owners, or individuals must be considered in terms of compatibility of land use, zoning in the vicinity, community growth patterns, and other factors associated with the public interest." To assist the Executive Director in determining potential adverse impact, the Applicant is required to submit information regarding: zoning at the site and in the vicinity; character of surrounding land uses within one mile of the proposed facility; growth trends of the nearest community with directions of major development; proximity to residences and other uses, such as schools, churches, cemeteries, historic structures and sites, archaeologically significant sites, and

sites having exceptional aesthetic quality; the approximate number of residences and business establishments within one mile of the proposed facility and distances and directions to the nearest residences and businesses; and a description and discussion of all known wells within 500 feet of the proposed site. The rule indicates that “the impact of the site upon a city, community, group of property owners, or individuals must be *considered* [emphasis added] in terms of compatibility of land use, zoning in the vicinity, community growth patterns, and other factors associated with the public interest.” The Executive Director has no specific authority under the TSWDA to judge land use compatibility, but merely reviews the application to ensure that adequate information has been provided to assist the Commissioners in this determination. It is worth noting that Fort Bend County has an ordinance that specifies areas within the county where landfills may be located; Blue Ridge Landfill expansion is located within the area designated for landfills by the county ordinance.

#### **COMMENT 4** (Land Use Summary Discrepancies)

**Opie and Ruby Baath, Elliott Broughton, Sheila Burr, Delois Clark, Timothy Gash, State Representative Dora Olivo, Steve Powell, Anita Prinz, Mary Ross, Zhiyue Wang, Sharon Warren, Jeri Yenne, and Qing Yuan** provided comments of possible contradictions or omissions to land use information provided in the application. Many of these indicated that the area is residential and not industrial. Several comments indicated that the application fails to note existing or planned schools and churches and failed to identify all springs, water wells, oil and gas wells, homes and businesses in the area.

**Elliott Broughton, Steve Powell, Zhiyue Wang and Qing Yuan** disagreed with a Land Use Study conclusion that rapid land development in the vicinity of the landfill will continue if the facility is expanded.

**Elliott Broughton** indicated that the application should include zoning information for nearby communities. **Martin Rosetta** said that the application should look at community growth patterns.

#### **RESPONSE 4**

In the application, Chapter 7 of Parts I/II and a Land Use Study provided as Appendix I/IIC provide land use information in accordance with §330.53(b)(8). This rule defines the area for consideration as that within one mile of the facility. The information provided indicates that the land within a mile of the proposed facility is 61.6% undeveloped, 32% residential or future residential, and 4% industrial. The application does not characterize the surrounding land as industrial and MSW rules do not designate the character of property in which landfills must be located or prohibit location of landfills within any specific category of land use. The rule does not require the applicant to provide this information for a proposed facility or for locations greater than one mile from the facility. Section 7.2 describes, and Figure I/II-4.2 illustrates surface water features, including springs, and water wells within one mile of the facility. In accordance with §330.53(b)(8)(E), the application should include a description and discussion of all known wells within 500 feet of the proposed site. Water wells within 500 feet are described in Section 7.2 and illustrated on Figure I/II-4.2. Page 7 of the Land Use Study describes the facility’s proximity to residences and other uses.

Section 330.53(b)(8)(D) provides specific examples of the "other uses" (schools, churches, cemeteries, historic structures and sites, archaeologically significant sites, and sites having exceptional aesthetic quality). These other uses are addressed in the Land Use Study, including two proposed schools within one mile of the permit boundary. The applicant has provided an updated Figure I/II-4.2 with a new note to provide known oil or gas wells within 500 feet of the facility.

MSW rules do establish limits on the effect a landfill or expansion will have on local community growth patterns. However, construction of landfills has typically not stopped development in the immediate vicinity. Development of Shadow Creek Ranch, immediately east of the existing facility, has continued towards the landfill in spite of its presence.

Parts I/II, Section 7.1 indicates that the facility is located in the extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ) of Houston and is not zoned or subject to zoning. While Pearland or other nearby communities may have zoning requirements, these requirements do not affect this facility.

A discussion of growth trends of the nearest community and directions of major development is required by §330.53(b)(8)(C) and provided on page 6 of the Land Use Study provided in Parts I/II, Appendix I/II.C.

#### **COMMENT 5** (Traffic)

**Carla Bell, Jimmy Bell, Sherry Bell, Elliott Broughton, Delois Clark, Timothy Gash, Bruce Guillory, Taren Johnston**, the individuals identified as **Group 3**, **Brian Long, Julia and Mike Maher, Carla Mayfield, Richard and Kimberlee Molette, Jackie Neely, Jennifer Ogilvie, State Representative Dora Olivo, Steve Powell, Anita Prinz, Martin Rosetta, Mary Ross**, the individuals identified as **Group 6**, **Donna Thomas, Peter Thorpe, Zhiyue Wang, Jeri Yenne, and Qing Yuan** indicated that traffic related to this facility would create an inappropriate impact on surrounding communities and their future growth and questioned the traffic analysis provided in the application.

**Mayor Tom Reid** indicated that W. Broadway (FM 518) will be designated a "No Through Trucks" route between State Highway 288 and FM 521 in contradiction of the traffic study provided in the application. Some comments noted an apparent discrepancy in the Traffic Study truck counts versus waste counts from current to the anticipated time that the landfill will reach capacity.

**Brian Long** indicated that the facility should coordinate with the Toll Road Authority.

#### **RESPONSE 5**

In accordance with §330.51(b)(6)(C), the application must include documentation of coordination with the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT). Coordination with the Toll Road Authority is not required by MSW rules. Parts I/II, Appendix I/II.A provides a response letter from TxDOT indicating that TxDOT "offers no objection to the Blue Ridge Landfill plans to expand." A traffic study is provided as Parts I/II, Appendix I/II.D in accordance with §330.53(b)(9). The study provides current (at the time of application submittal) and, to the extent practicable, future traffic volumes on roads within one mile of the facility. If at some point in the future it is determined that predicted traffic conditions, such as the reported plans to restrict traffic on FM 518 through Pearland, result in a change to anticipated traffic patterns, the facility will be required to submit a

permit modification for approval of proposed changes. The apparent discrepancy (599 trucks/day transporting 3,000 tons/day at present, to 1,476 trucks/day transporting 9,600 tons/day) is explained by noting that, as indicated on page IIIA-1 of Part III, Appendix IIIA, the applicant estimates that other area landfills will close in about 2019. At this point there is an increase in the anticipated waste acceptance rate. Much of this increase is expected to arrive in transfer trailers from transfer stations, which are heavier loads on the average.

**COMMENT 6** (Road Expansion and Maintenance Costs)

**Mike and Julia Maher, Steve Powell, Martin Rosetta**, and the individuals identified as **Group 6** inquired as to whether the landfill would share in costs to improve or maintain roads in the vicinity of the landfill.

**RESPONSE 6**

The Executive Director has no authority under the TSWDA to consider the cost to state and local governments due to road maintenance associated with a landfill. While it is not required by rule, the TxDOT letter discussed above indicates that "TxDOT and the Blue Ridge Landfill have agreed that the Landfill will fund the adjustments to lengthen the FM 521 northbound left turn bay accessing the landfill to meet current TxDOT design criteria. The implementation will be performed when FM 521 is rehabilitated or reconstructed, whichever comes first. Though the current turn lane is functioning appropriately and safely, it is only prudent to adjust the current turn lane to current specifications; however, this adjustment does not warrant exposing the public to a stand alone turn lane lengthening project at this time."

**COMMENT 7** (Noise)

**Taren Johnston, Carla Mayfield, Darry Mayo, Richard and Kimberlee Molette, Nzinga Rideaux, and Donna Thomas** raised concerns about the effect of noise from the landfill and associated trucks on the surrounding community.

**RESPONSE 7**

The Executive Director has no authority under the TSWDA to regulate the intensity of sound generated by vehicles associated with a landfill. Within the permit boundary, §330.5(a)(2) prohibits the owner or operator of an MSW facility from operating the facility in a manner that causes "the creation and maintenance of a nuisance." To decrease the likelihood of nuisance noise, §330.121(b) requires a minimum separating distance of 50 feet between solid waste processing and disposal activities and the boundary of the site. As illustrated on Attachment 1B, the buffer between the landfill boundary and the waste footprint, within which most waste activity will be performed, is at least 330 feet.

**COMMENT 8** (Odor)

Opie and Ruby Baath, Sheila Burr, Rodrigo Carreon, Delois Clark, Cheryl Cockrell, Delbert DeFlora, Joseph DeLeon, Deloris Eli, Timothy Gash, the individuals identified as Group 2, Taren Johnston, the individuals identified as Group 3, Mike and Julia Maher, Carla Mayfield, Richard and Kimberlee Molette, Sheba Muharib, Jennifer Ogilvie, Anita Prinz, Dale Reynolds, Nzinga Rideaux, R.L. Ross, the individuals identified as Group 6, Donna Thomas, Becky Vindola, Zhiyue Wang, Janiy Yates, Jeri Yenne, and Qing Yuan were concerned that odors from the landfill would adversely affect the surrounding communities. Many of these comments indicated that odors are an issue for the existing facility and these problems will only be worsened if the facility is allowed to expand.

Elliot Broughton, Steve Powell, Zhiyue Wang and Qing Yuan asked if an odor control system will be required on leachate storage tanks.

### **RESPONSE 8**

Section 330.5(a)(2) requires that the proposed facility be operated in a way that prevents the occurrence of nuisance odor conditions. Subsection §330.125(b) requires the facility Site Operating Plan (SOP) to include an odor management plan that addresses the sources of odors and includes general instructions to control odors or sources of odors. Plans must include the identification of wastes that require special attention such as septage, grease trap waste, dead animals and leachate. The facility odor management plan is provided on pages IV-26 through -28 in Part IV of the application. Various features of the proposed site operation, including daily covering of waste and prevention of ponded water, should control the development of odor conditions. The application contained sufficient information for the Executive Director to determine that the application met TCEQ regulations. If objectionable odors occur, the owner or operator must initiate appropriate measures to alleviate the condition. Procedures concerning the covering of waste at the facility are addressed in the SOP, Part IV of the application. If the owner or operator follows these procedures, odors from the landfill should be minimized. For information on TCEQ odor complaint investigation procedures, interested persons are encouraged to visit the following webpage: [http://www.tceq.state.tx.us/compliance/complaints/protocols/odor\\_protodef.html](http://www.tceq.state.tx.us/compliance/complaints/protocols/odor_protodef.html).

MSW rules do not require odor control on leachate storage tanks. Leachate storage tanks are described in Part III, Attachment 15 of the application. The tanks are double-walled with leak detection sumps. Tanks will be equipped with floating high density polyethylene (HDPE) geomembrane covers, so they are not expected to generate significant odors. If they do, additional controls will be required as described above.

### **COMMENT 9** (Groundwater Protection)

Opie and Ruby Baath, the individuals identified as Group 1, Elliott Broughton, Sheila Burr, Rodrigo Carreon, Jinfu Chang, Delbert DeFlora, Joseph DeLeon, Nancy Durham, Timothy Gash, the individuals identified as Group 2, Liao Guangling, the individuals identified as Group 3, Darryl Mayo, Richard and Kimberlee Molette, Jennifer Ogilvie, Steve Powell, Anita Prinz, the individuals identified as Group 4, Mayor Tom Reid, David Sauer, the individuals

identified as **Groups 5 and 6, Robert Swanagan**, the individuals identified as **Group 9**, and **Jeri Yenne** were concerned that the landfill will leak and affect groundwater quality in the vicinity of the landfill.

#### RESPONSE 9

The proposed landfill will include a groundwater monitoring system based on site-specific hydrogeologic characteristics detailed in Attachment 4, Section 4. The system will consist of a total of 54 groundwater monitoring wells; 16 wells will monitor the "shallow" zone identified as the Stratum I-A sands and 38 wells will monitor the "deep" zone identified as the Stratum II sands (Attachment 5, Section 2.1, pages 5-16 and 5-17). The locations of the monitoring wells are shown on Figures 5A.1 through 5A.5 of Attachment 5. These monitoring wells will yield representative groundwater samples from the uppermost aquifer and they will be sampled and analyzed in accordance with the Groundwater Sampling and Analysis Plan. In addition, the landfill will be constructed with a composite liner (three feet of compacted clay overlain by a 60-mil geomembrane and two feet of protective cover soil) and leachate collection system meeting the groundwater protection design criteria in §330.200(a)(2). Background groundwater sampling for the new wells will be conducted quarterly (3-month intervals) for two years for a total of eight independent sampling events. After background sampling is completed, the detection monitoring program will consist of groundwater sampling on a semi-annual basis. The Executive Director has determined that the proposed groundwater monitoring system will provide adequate groundwater monitoring.

#### COMMENT 10 (General Health Concerns)

**Opie and Ruby Baath, Carla Bell, Jimmy Bell, Sherry Bell**, the individuals identified as **Group 1, Sheila Burr, Rodrigo Carreon, Jinfu Chang, Delois Clark, Cherilyn Cokrell, Joseph DeLeon, Nancy Durham, Deloris Eli, Timothy Gash, U.S. Congressman Al Green**, the individuals identified as **Group 2, Liao Guangling, Bruce Guillory, State Senator Mike Jackson, Camille Kahn, Gerald Kahn, Halfredia Kahn**, the individuals identified as **Group 3, Darryl Mayo, Richard and Kimberlee Molette, Jennifer Ogilvie, State Representative Dora Olivo, Anita Prinz**, the individuals identified as **Group 4, Aurore Denise Ragston, Nzinga Rideaux, Danielle Ross**, the individuals identified as **Groups 5, 6, and 7, Robert Swanagan, Donna Thomas, Sharon Warren**, the individuals identified as **Groups 8 and 9**, and **Jeri Yenne** indicated that the landfill will cause adverse health effects on the surrounding community.

**Sheba Muharib** indicated that as she passes the landfill on the Fort Bend Toll Road in the evenings, she feels as if she has been drugged by the "toxic smell."

**Darryl Mayo, State Representative Dora Olivo**, and **Anita Prinz** indicated that a health impact study or research on the long-term health effects of landfills on nearby residents should be performed before issuance of a permit for this facility.

#### RESPONSE 10

The Executive Director has received no information that shows that the proposed facility presents a threat to human health or the environment. The Executive Director determined that the proposed landfill was designed in compliance with the TSWDA, and with the MSW rules and regulations developed to protect human health and the environment. If the proposed landfill is constructed and operated as shown in the application and as required by the regulations, the Executive Director expects human health and the environment to be protected.

MSW rules do not require long-term health impact studies

**COMMENT 11** (Surface Water Control and Protection of Surface Water Features)

**Timothy Austin, Elliott Broughton, Rodrigo Carreon, Delois Clark, Delbert DeFlora, Nancy Durham, Deloris Eli, Timothy Gash, Darryl Mayo, State Senator Mike Jackson, Richard and Kimberlee Molette, State Representative Dora Olivo, Steve Powell, Anita Prinz, Mayor Tom Reid, Nzinga Rideaux, Mary Ross, David Sauer, the individuals identified as Group 6, Robert Swanagan, Peter Thorpe, Zhiyue Wang, Jeri Yenne, and Qing Yuan** indicated concern over the adequacy of surface water controls, including storm water and flood water. Most of these comments included concerns over Mustang Bayou and the American Canal. Some suggested monitoring these and surface water features for contamination by the landfill.

**Rodrigo Carreon and Mary Ross** indicated that surface water samples from Clear Creek have elevated concentrations of fecal coliform.

**RESPONSE 11**

In accordance with §330.56(f)(4)(A)(iv) and relevant guidance, the application must include a demonstration that drainage patterns will not be significantly altered by the expansion. The applicant provided a drainage analysis in Attachment 6 of Part III of the application that states that the proposed facility will not increase run-off onto adjacent property. The Executive Director determined that the information submitted complied with the rules.

According to §330.55(b)(1)(A) and (B), MSW facilities are prohibited from discharging untreated contaminated water from the site. Leachate, condensate, and storm water that has come into contact with solid waste, leachate or condensate is considered to be contaminated water. All discharges of storm water must be in accordance with U.S. Environmental Protection Agency National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) requirements, or Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) requirements, as applicable. The proposed drainage structures are designed to handle runoff from a 24-hour, 25-year storm event as required by the regulations. These structures include drainage terraces, final cover drainage channels, perimeter drainage channels, and detention basins. If the permit is issued and there are unauthorized discharges from the landfill, the permittee will be subject to enforcement.

In accordance with §330.55(b)(7)(A) and (B), the site must be protected from the 100-year flood and provide at least a three-foot freeboard above this flood elevation. Parts I/II, Figure I/II-11.1 demonstrates that the only location where the 100-year floodplain is within the permit boundary is south of the American Canal and that the three-foot freeboard requirement is met by the landfill perimeter road which lies just outside of the waste footprint. There are no wastes processing or

disposal activities permitted south of the American Canal. The American Canal is leveed, and as shown on Figure I/II-11.1, the 100-year floodplain extends to the levee on the south side of the canal but not beyond.

It is not clear that the results for fecal coliform are indicative of a release from the landfill to Clear Creek. Fecal coliform may indicate industrial activity but may also reflect livestock or septic systems. The reported results are not unusual for watersheds in areas with industrial activity, farming, or livestock. The results do not provide levels upstream and downstream of the landfill. If levels are elevated, the information does not allow determination of a source. The Executive Director believes that if the facility is constructed and operated as shown in the application and as required by rule, human health and the environment will be protected.

#### **COMMENT 12** (Groundwater and Protection of Surface Water Features)

**State Representative Dora Olivo, Anita Prinz, and Mary Ross** stated that the application does not provide adequate information on geology and hydrogeology.

**Timothy Austin, Elliott Broughton, Rodrigo Carreon, Delois Clark, Nancy Durham, Timothy Gash, Darryl Mayo, Richard and Kimberlee Molette, State Representative Dora Olivo, Steve Powell, Anita Prinz, Mayor Tom Reid, Nzinga Rideaux, Mary Ross, David Sauer,** the individuals identified as **Group 6, Robert Swanagan, Peter Thorpe, Zhiyue Wang, Jeri Yenne,** and **Qing Yuan** were concerned that there should be more groundwater monitoring between the landfill waste footprint and the American Canal and Mustang Bayou.

**Robert Stoll** asked about the structural characteristics of substrate materials beneath the waste footprint.

**Anita Prinz** stated that groundwater monitoring should be performed quarterly.

#### **RESPONSE 12**

The American Canal and Mustang Bayou are located on the southwest side of the landfill. The groundwater flow direction at the site is generally to the north (Attachment 4, Section 4.5; Appendix 4J, Figure 4J.3 and 4J.4; and Attachment 5, Section 1.2). As illustrated in Attachment 1B in Part III of the application, upgradient monitoring wells MW-34, MW-35, MW-99, and MW-100 are located southwest of the waste footprint between the waste footprint and the American Canal and Mustang Bayou. They will provide data on the water quality that has been unaffected by the landfill because the groundwater in the shallow and deep zones flows from these wells toward the landfill, not from the landfill to the wells. Putting more wells in this area would only duplicate the information provided by these wells and would not signal a release of leachate from the landfill. Figures 4J.1 to 4J.4c illustrate the groundwater flow direction.

The general geologic dip of Stratum I-A and Stratum II is to the east (Attachment 5, Section 2.1.2, pages 5-16). A subsurface investigation report, located in Attachment 4, Section 2, pages 4-13 to 4-44, describes the structural characteristics of substrate materials.

Background groundwater sampling for the new wells will be conducted quarterly (3-month intervals) for two years for a total of eight independent sampling events. After background sampling

is completed, the detection monitoring program will consist of groundwater sampling on a semi-annual basis in accordance with the facility Groundwater Sampling and Analysis Plan.

### COMMENT 13 (Landfill Liner)

**Elliott Broughton, Timothy Gash, Steve Powell, Robert Stoll, Zhiyue Wang and Qing Yuan** were concerned that a landfill liner designed for the currently permitted waste column will be compromised when up to 110 feet more waste are placed above it and inquired as to how the liner in new areas will tie into existing liner.

**Delbert DeFlora, Taren Johnston, Carla Mayfield, Steve Powell, Nzinga Rideaux, and Danielle Ross** indicated a concern that the liner will react with materials found in household waste, such as lard or nail polish remover.

**Robert Stoll** requested information regarding geomembrane seaming.

**Delbert DeFlora** suggested that the landfill should provide a liner integrity report to the community each month.

**Joseph DeLeon** felt that the facility should use a "double liner" with two compacted clay layers, two geomembranes, and a leachate collection layer between the geomembranes.

### RESPONSE 13

The landfill has been constructed to date with a composite liner (two feet of compacted clay and a 60-mil high density polyethylene (HDPE) flexible membrane liner) and leachate collection system meeting the groundwater protection design criteria in §330.200(a)(2) of the MSW rules. Future cells will be constructed with a composite liner (three feet of compacted clay and a 60-mil HDPE flexible membrane liner) and a leachate collection system meeting the groundwater protection design criteria in §330.200(f)(1) and (2). "Double liners" are not required by rule and so the Executive Director has no authority to require it. Sixty-mil HDPE liners are an industry standard specifically allowed by rule for use in liners in MSW landfill units because they are flexible, strong, and chemically resistant to materials found in MSW. Liners at MSW landfills must meet the minimum standard set by the rule; they are not designed with any consideration of the soil column height. Details of the liner system and tie-ins are provided in the Liner, Leachate Collection and Final Cover System Details, provided as Part III, Attachment 6C of the application. Details of the tie-ins to the currently permitted liner system are provided on Attachment 6C.5. If the landfill liner is constructed as shown in the application and as required by the regulations, the Executive Director expects liner integrity to be maintained and human health and the environment to be protected.

MSW rules do not require a facility to provide monthly liner integrity reports; however, in accordance with §330.56(j), the application must include a soil and liner quality control plan (SLQCP). The SLQCP is provided in Part III, Attachment 10 of the application. The SLQCP establishes the construction quality assurance and testing procedures for liner installation of soil and geosynthetic liner system components, including geomembrane seam welding. When a new cell is constructed, a soil and liner evaluation report (SLER) and a geosynthetic liner evaluation report (GLER) will be submitted to the TCEQ MSW Permits Section to document that the liner system for

that cell is in compliance with the SLQCP, which is in agreement with §330.205 and applicable guidance materials.

**COMMENT 14** (Avoidance of Chapter 330 Rule Revisions Effective March 27, 2006)

**Delbert DeFlora, Joseph DeLeon, Glinda Frazier, Jason Husbands, Sarah Husbands, Taren Johnston, Mike and Julia Maher, Carla Mayfield, Steve Powell, and Robin Sam** accused the applicant of submitting the application ahead of the effective date of the revised Chapter 330 rules in an effort to avoid the new rules. They felt the applicant should be required to meet the revised and presumably more protective rules.

**RESPONSE 14**

The rules applicable to an application are those in effect at the time the application is determined to be administratively complete. Permit administrative review is an initial cursory examination to determine if required components of the application are provided before the application is forwarded to technical staff for complete review in accordance with requirements of the rules. This application was received by the agency on January 25, 2006, and determined to be administratively complete on February 6, 2006. The rule revision effective March 27, 2006, is therefore not applicable to this application. However, it should be noted that the application meets the new provisions (effective March 27, 2006) for groundwater monitoring well spacing and buffer zones. Site Operating Plan requirements for landfills were not significantly changed in the March 27, 2006 rule revisions. In accordance with §330.1(a)(2) effective March 27, 2006, the facility will be required to submit modifications required by the 2006 rule revisions within one year after the commission's decision on the application becomes final and appealable, unless a longer period of time is specified in the rules. If the proposed landfill is constructed and operated as shown in the application and as required by applicable regulations, the Executive Director expects human health and the environment to be protected.

**COMMENT 15** (Alternative Locations)

Elliott Broughton, Delois Clark, Sarah Husbands, Michael Lowe, Jennifer Ogilvie, Steve Powell, R.L. Ross, the individuals identified as Group 6, Zhiyue Wang, Sharon Warren, Celeste Yates, and Qing Yuan indicated that alternative sites should be evaluated or that the landfill should be located elsewhere.

**RESPONSE 15**

The Executive Director has no authority under the TSWDA to consider alternative locations or to require the applicant to consider alternative locations. The Executive Director's review of a permit application considers whether the proposed facility and the existing soil and groundwater conditions at that particular location meet the requirements of Chapter 330 of TCEQ rules.

**COMMENT 16** (Visual Screening, Wind Screening, Wind Rose)

Elliott Broughton, Delois Clark, Bruce Guillory, Jackie Neely, State Representative Dora Olivo, Steve Powell, Anita Prinz, Martin Rosetta, Donna Thomas, Peter Thorpe, Zhiyue Wang, and Qing Yuan indicated that visual and wind screening are inadequate.

Elliott Broughton, Zhiyue Wang, and Qing Yuan requested a wind rose study to demonstrate that odors will be carried away from the local communities.

**RESPONSE 16**

MSW SOP rules regarding visual screening, §330.138, do not prevent the possibility that waste will, at some point in landfill development, be visible to the surrounding community. Visibility must be minimized by vegetation around the waste footprint; application of daily, intermediate, and final cover; buffer zones; and landfill development patterns that will minimize exposure. MSW SOP rules do not require wind screening, except to the extent required by §330.120(1) to control windblown solid waste at the working face. The facility will maintain a 25-foot-wide landscape buffer as illustrated on Figure I/II-2.2 in Parts I/II, but MSW rules do not require that established vegetation equal the height of the landfill at completion.

As required by §330.52(b)(4)(A)(i), a wind rose is provided on Figure I/II-4.2 in Parts I/II. MSW rules do not require an assessment or demonstration of where odors will be carried by prevailing winds, but rather minimize odors through requirements for an odor management plan described elsewhere in this response to comments, requirements for buffer zones, and prohibition of nuisance conditions.

**COMMENT 17** (Vectors)

Elliott Broughton, Sheila Burr, Delois Clark, Timothy Gash, Darryl Mayo, Anita Prinz, Mary Ross, Donna Thomas, and Jeri Yenne stated that the landfill has and/or will attract vectors, such as birds or rodents.

**RESPONSE 17**

As required by §330.126, the site operator must take the appropriate steps to prevent and control on-site populations of disease vectors and scavengers using proper compaction and daily cover procedures, and the use of other approved methods when needed. Part IV, pages IV-28 and -29 in the application address plans to control vectors at the facility. The application states that the operator will take the appropriate steps to prevent and control onsite populations of disease vectors through the proper placement and compaction of daily cover over the waste. The Executive Director determined that the application complies with the requirements of §330.126.

**COMMENT 18** (Buffer)

Anita Prinz, Mary Ross, the individuals identified as **Group 6**, and Peter Thorpe indicated that there is insufficient buffer between the landfill and the surrounding communities.

**RESPONSE 18**

Paragraph §330.121(b) requires that a minimum separating distance of 50 feet be maintained between solid waste processing and disposal activities and the boundary of the site. According to page IV-23 of Part IV of the application, the facility will maintain a 50-foot buffer zone around the facility. As can be seen from Attachment 1B in Part III of the application, waste processing and storage activities will not occur closer than 240 feet from the permit boundary. The Executive Director has determined that the proposed buffer zone meets the regulatory requirements.

**COMMENT 19** (Endangered Species)

State Representative Dora Olivo, Anita Prinz, and Mary Ross indicated that the evaluation of the impact of the facility on endangered or threatened species is insufficient.

**RESPONSE 19**

Under §330.53(b)(13)(B), the TCEQ must consider the impact of a solid waste disposal facility upon endangered or threatened species. In addition, the facility and the operation of the facility may not result in the destruction or adverse modification of the critical habitat of an endangered or threatened species, or cause or contribute to the taking of any endangered or threatened species. According to §§330.51(b)(8), 330.53(b)(13), and 330.302, the applicant must demonstrate compliance with the Endangered Species Act.

Information regarding protection of threatened and endangered species is summarized in Parts I/II, Chapter 12 of the application. As part of the review of this permit application, the applicant contacted the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) and the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD). FWS concluded that "the proposed [expansion] will have no adverse effect on any federally listed threatened or endangered species." This letter is provided in Appendix I/IIA in Parts I/II of the application. TPWD stated that the Texas Prairie Dawn plant and the Houston Toad are identified as federal and state threatened and endangered species in Fort Bend County. This letter is also provided in Appendix I/IIA. Based on this response, the applicant contracted Berg Oliver Associates, Inc. to perform a Threatened and Endangered Species Assessment for the two identified species. The assessment report is provided in Appendix I/IIK in Parts I/II of the application. The report concludes that neither species nor associated habitat is present. The information submitted in the application was determined by the Executive Director to meet the requirements of MSW rules.

#### **COMMENT 20** (Special Waste)

**Richard and Kimberlee Molette** are concerned that medical waste will be allowed in the landfill and with it will come a greater risk of infectious diseases such as HIV and AIDS.

**Jimmy Bell** was concerned about special waste, specifically medical waste and regulated asbestos-containing material (RACM), and indicated that testing should be performed for airborne fibers.

**Mike and Julia Maher** indicated that Class 1 non-hazardous waste will be allowed at the facility which is inappropriate with residential areas so close to the landfill.

#### **RESPONSE 20**

Page 4 of 9 of the Part A Application Form provided with the application indicates that infectious [untreated] medical waste will not be accepted at the facility. Untreated medical waste is listed in Section III.C of the draft permit for the expanded facility.

RACM will be accepted at this facility. As noted in Part IV, Sections 4.20.4 and 4.20.5 of the application, RACM and non-regulated asbestos-containing material (non-RACM) will be handled in accordance with §330.136(b)(3)(A) through (I) and in accordance with §330.136(b)(4), respectively. Testing for airborne fibers is not required at MSW facilities. If RACM and non-RACM are handled in accordance with §330.136(b), the Executive Director expects human health and the environment to be protected.

Class 1 non-hazardous waste will be accepted at the facility in accordance with §330.137(a) through (h), as noted in Part IV, Section 4.20.7. As required by §330.200(f) for waste trenches that receive Class 1 waste, areas of the landfill where waste has not yet been placed will be constructed with a composite liner (three feet of compacted clay overlain by a 60-mil geomembrane and two feet of protective cover soil) and leachate collection system meeting the groundwater protection design criteria in §330.200(a)(2). In accordance with §330.200(f)(6), Class 1 waste will only be disposed below surrounding natural ground surface elevation. As required by §330.137(e), Class 1 waste will not exceed 20% of the total amount of waste (not including Class 1 waste) accepted during the current or previous year.

**COMMENT 21** (Trash From Trucks)

Elliott Broughton, Delois Clark, Steve Powell, Donna Thomas, Zhiyue Wang, Jeri Yenne and Qing Yuan asked how the facility will address trash that blows out of trucks. Steve Powell suggested that there should be monthly cleanup of trash on routes.

**RESPONSE 21**

Under the requirements of §330.123, the operator of a landfill is responsible to encourage vehicles hauling waste to the facility to properly enclose the waste with a tarpaulin, net, or other means to effectively secure the load to prevent the escape of any part of the load by blowing or spilling. The operator is also responsible at least *daily* for the cleanup of waste spilled along and within the right-of-way of public access roads serving the site for a distance of two miles in either direction from any entrance used for the delivery of waste to the site. Sections 4.5 and 4.8 of Part IV of the application indicate that these responsibilities will be met. The Executive Director determined that the application complied with the applicable MSW rule.

**COMMENT 22** (Environmental Racism)

Jackie Neely, State Representative Dora Olivo, Danielle Ross, Mary Ross, and R.L. Ross indicated that expanding the landfill in its current location is environmental racism.

**RESPONSE 22**

Although the TCEQ and EPA collaborate on the cumulative impacts from permitting activities, rules, and policies of both agencies, the EPA has primary jurisdiction over environmental justice or Title VI concerns. The EPA website [www.epa.gov/compliance/environmentaljustice](http://www.epa.gov/compliance/environmentaljustice) notes that environmental justice is the fair treatment and meaningful involvement of all people regardless of race, color, national origin, or income with respect to the development, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies. When evaluating permits, the TCEQ considers the surrounding community without regard to its socioeconomic or racial status.

The TCEQ Environmental Equity program was designed to help the community with this issue. Low-income and minority communities often believe that they are burdened with a disproportionate share of environmental risks. Hostilities can develop between these communities and the industries or facilities involved, making good-faith efforts to resolve disputes, address concerns, and seek solutions ineffective. The Environmental Equity Program was established in 1993 to help counter this trend by improving communication between government, local communities, and neighboring industries. Individuals may raise environmental equity or environmental justice concerns with TCEQ staff through a toll-free number, 1-800-687-4040, or at the following address, phone or fax numbers:

### COMMENT 23 (TCEQ Responsibilities)

**Representative Dora Olivo** stated that state policies, including statutory and regulatory goals, direct TCEQ staff to promote the maximum conservation and protection of the quality of the environment and the natural resources of the state; prohibit discharges and actions that could result in pollution of the waters, both ground and surface, of the state; require the safeguarding of the air from pollution; require the control of all aspects of the management of MSW by all practical and economically feasible methods consistent with the law; prohibit any entity from causing or allowing the collection, storage, disposal, transportation, or processing, of MSW in a fashion that creates or maintains nuisance conditions; and/or endangers human health and welfare or the environment.

**Delbert DeFlora, Glinda Frazier, Michael Lowe and Richard Morrison** accused TCEQ of protecting the Applicants when the responsibility of the agency is to protect citizens.

**Fletcher Simpson** noted that the TCEQ must be impartial.

**Mike and Julia Maher** asked if TCEQ representatives at associated public meetings had seen communities near the landfill that are not in Fort Bend County or Missouri City.

**Steve Powell** requested a list of all gifts and/or benefits received from Allied Waste and/or BFI by TCEQ representatives at associated public meetings before or during consideration of the expansion application.

**Herbert Robinson and R.L. Ross** asked who watches the landfills and stated that TCEQ should directly monitor the facilities.

### RESPONSE 23

The Executive Director has reviewed the permit application in accordance with the applicable law, policy and procedures, in accordance with its mission to protect our state's human and natural resources consistent with sustainable economic development. Therefore, the Executive Director has properly considered public concerns to the extent of his authority. If the proposed landfill is constructed and operated as shown in the application and as required by the regulations, the Executive Director expects human health and the environment to be protected.

TCEQ technical staff (Engineer, Geologist, and Team Leader) present at the two TCEQ-led public meetings for this application briefly visited the surrounding communities, including the community immediately east of the existing facility. These same staff members and their management have received no gifts and/or benefits from anyone associated with this application or any other. TCEQ Operating Policies and Procedures (OPP 12.08.01 Employee Ethics) prohibit a state officer or employee from accepting or soliciting any gift, favor, or service that might reasonably tend to influence the officer or employee in the discharge of official duties or that the officer or

employee knows or should know is being offered with the intent to influence the officer's or employee's official conduct.

The TCEQ is the regulating authority for MSW landfills in Texas; however, staffing is inadequate to provide specific daily monitoring of these facilities. TCEQ staff do not perform daily on-site monitoring activities on landfills, such as groundwater, storm water or landfill gas monitoring, except instances resulting from questions of compliance. TCEQ relies largely on the comments and complaints of the surrounding community to alert the agency to compliance questions. In addition, TCEQ staff reviews monitoring data regarding the landfill's methane system, groundwater beneath the site, and certain aspects of landfill operations.

#### COMMENT 24 (Compliance History)

**Anita Prinz, Mary Ross and Robin Schneider** indicated that the applicant has compliance history issues.

#### RESPONSE 24

During the technical review, a compliance history review is conducted on the company and the site based on the criteria in Title 30, Chapter 60 of the Texas Administrative Code (TAC). The compliance history is reviewed for the company and the site for the five-year period prior to the date the permit application was received by the Executive Director. The compliance history includes multimedia compliance-related components about the site under review. These components include the following: enforcement orders, consent decrees, court judgments, criminal convictions, chronic excessive emissions events, investigations, notices of violations, audits and violations disclosed under the Audit Act, environmental management systems, voluntary on-site compliance assessments, voluntary pollution reduction programs and early compliance. For the compliance review period from January 25, 2001 through November 6, 2006, this facility has no enforcement orders, court judgments, consent decrees, or criminal convictions from the state of Texas or the federal government, no chronic excessive emissions events, and no written notices of violations (NOVs).

#### COMMENT 25 (Waste Reduction, Reuse, Recycling)

**Joseph DeLeon and Robin Sam** encouraged more recycling of waste. **Sharon Warren** asked what other options are available for waste disposal. **Rodrigo Carreon and Sharon Warren** asked why this facility is being considered when water supply and waste water treatment services are needed in some of the surrounding community.

#### RESPONSE 25

The TCEQ encourages source reduction, reuse, and recycling in many ways, such as the Texas Recycling Program and Urban Recycling Events held throughout the state. Additionally, TCEQ rules provide incentives for facilities to recycle; however, recycling is a discretionary and not a mandatory requirement for a landfill permit. As required by Texas Health & Safety Code

§363.064(a)(8), the regional or local solid waste management plan must establish recycling rate goals appropriate to the area covered by the plan. According to "Municipal Solid Waste in Texas: A Year in Review, 2005 Data Summary and Analysis," Texans produced over 46 million tons of solid waste during the 2005 fiscal year.<sup>2</sup> Approximately 35% of this material was recycled (statewide), leaving about 30 million tons for disposal. These rates are expected to increase with population. Landfills are still needed for those materials that are not recycled.

Beyond interment, disposal options are very limited. Incineration may be performed, but typically is only used where waste has sufficient combustion potential, (referred to as "BTU content,") to produce more energy than the energy needed to combust the materials. Also, incineration emissions are a significant concern, particularly for general waste streams, as dioxins and other materials of concern are often generated. Emissions controls for waste combustion facilities greatly increase disposal costs. Ash disposal may require additional treatment, stabilization or encapsulation to meet disposal restrictions under Subtitle C of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act.

The Texas Solid Waste Disposal Act does not authorize the Executive Director to consider the needs of the surrounding community for other services, such as utilities, when reviewing an application.

#### **COMMENT 26** (Notices of Deficiency)

**Elliott Broughton** doubted the competency of the engineer that prepared the application, noting that the application had received a 70-item notice of deficiency (NOD).

#### **RESPONSE 26**

As allowed by §281.19(c), an applicant may address and correct deficiencies in an application identified by the Executive Director in an NOD.

The first technical NOD for this application included 70 items. After the Applicant responded to the first NOD, a second NOD was issued. The second NOD identified 13 remaining items. The response to the second NOD resolved all deficiencies to the satisfaction of the Executive Director.

#### **COMMENT 27** (Regional Waste Disposal Guidance and Agreements)

**Elliott Broughton** and **State Representative Dora Olivo** indicated that the facility is inconsistent with the Houston-Galveston Area Council of Governments (HGAC) regional solid waste management plan (RSWMP). **Elliott Broughton** also indicated that the application is inconsistent with the Fort Bend "Order Prohibiting Solid Waste Disposal in Fort Bend County."

Elliott Broughton, Mike and Julia Maher, Steve Powell, Martin Rosetta, Zhiyue Wang and Qing Yuan commented that while there are no agreements with Brazoria County or Pearland, Brazoria County and Pearland shoulder much of the burden.

#### **RESPONSE 27**

Parts I/II, Appendix I/III of the application provides a demonstration that the application is in conformance with the HGAC RSWMP. The HGAC RSWMP provides no information specific to Fort Bend County and the only goals for solid waste management are more specifically addressed by TCEQ MSW rules.

Parts I/II, Appendix I/III of the application provides the "Order Prohibiting Solid Waste Disposal in Fort Bend County." The order establishes those areas in Fort Bend County where waste disposal may occur. The expanded facility is located in Area 6, which is authorized for waste disposal.

The agreements reached between the applicant and Fort Bend County and Missouri City are not required by rule. Nor are agreements between the applicant and Brazoria County and Pearland. The TSWDA does not authorize the Executive Director to require these agreements when reviewing an application.

#### **COMMENT 28** (Landfill Gas)

Anita Prinz commented that landfill gas (LFG) is a health and safety hazard to the surrounding community and that electricity should be generated from this product of degrading waste. Nzinga Rideaux noted that leachate and gas collection lines may clog, increasing risks to the surrounding community.

#### **RESPONSE 28**

This facility has an active LFG collection and control system and a perimeter LFG monitoring plan. In accordance with §330.56(n), a LFG Management Plan is provided as Part III, Attachment 14. Appendix 14A, Attachment 14A-1 illustrates the current LFG system. The system will expand as the landfill is developed to capacity, as illustrated in Appendix 14F, Attachment 14F-1.

The TCEQ agrees that generating electricity from landfill gas is preferable to flaring, but the TSWDA does not authorize the Executive Director to require flaring. The cost of constructing and operating a LFG-to-power facility is significant and not cost-effective for the facility until a plateau is reached in LFG production. Facilities wishing to begin recovery of LFG for beneficial use, such as production of electricity, are now authorized with a registration by rule under §330.9(k).

MSW rules do not directly address clogging of gas collection lines; however, in accordance with §330.56(n)(7)(B), the LFG Management Plan must address maintenance procedures. Section 6.4 of the LFG Management Plan addresses maintenance. Page 15-5 of Part III, Attachment 15, Leachate and Contaminated Water Plan, addresses clogging of leachate collection piping in accordance with §330.56(o)(1)(G). The application indicates that geotextile fabric and pipe

perforations are designed to prevent clogging. The leachate collection system is designed with cleanout risers at the end of each collection pipe to allow cleaning. The maximum cleanout distance is 3,786 feet which is within the limits of the manufacturer's information for cleaning of collection pipes through jetting and/or flushing.

**COMMENT 29** (Leachate Storage Tank Secondary Containment)

**Elliott Broughton, Steve Powell, Zhiyue Wang, and Qing Yuan** asked if secondary containment will be required for leachate storage tanks.

**RESPONSE 29**

In accordance with §330.56(o)(3), leachate, gas condensate, contaminated surface water, and contaminated groundwater must be disposed at an authorized facility. Discharge of contaminated water is also prohibited by §330.139. The referenced rules obligate the applicant to provide secondary containment for aboveground storage tanks of contaminated water. The proposed storage tanks are described on page 15-8 of Part III, Attachment 15, Leachate and Contaminated Water Plan, and illustrated in Appendix 15D, Sheet 15D-5. Storage tanks will be double-walled. If the inner wall, or "Primary HDPE Geomembrane Liner," leaks, leachate will collect within the secondary liner and drain to a leak detection sump that is equipped with a witness riser pipe. When leachate is identified through the witness riser pipe, the tank will be drained and repaired.

**COMMENT 30** (Aerial Photographs)

**Elliott Broughton** noted that aerial photographs, most of which were taken in 2002, are outdated and do not show recent growth of surrounding communities, particularly Shadow Creek Ranch, located directly east of the facility.

**RESPONSE 30**

It is not clear to which aerial photographs the comment refers; however, Figure I/II-6.1 in Parts I/II of the application, provided in accordance with §330.53(b)(6), was taken on March 10, 2005. The rule does not specify how recent an aerial photograph should be, but this aerial photograph was judged by the Executive Director to meet the requirement of this rule. While this photograph may not illustrate all development to date, the area is shown as residential in Land Use Study provided in Parts I/II, Appendix I/IIC. There is no apparent effort to present this area as undeveloped.

**COMMENT 31** (Doppler Radar Tower)

**Brian Long** noted that the Doppler radar tower is approximately 170 feet high and the new landfill will be completed to 170 feet high and asked how the landfill would affect the utility of the Doppler radar. A **concerned citizen** asked how the landfill will be affected by a hurricane.

### RESPONSE 31

MSW rules do not address the effect a landfill will have on Doppler or other radar facilities and do not require coordination or approval from their operators or the operators of other utility towers in the vicinity. The effect of this facility on the Doppler radar tower is therefore unknown.

MSW facilities are not required to prepare for hurricanes or tornados. Presumably, a facility will shut down operations if conditions indicate a hurricane or tornado is expected. To the extent practical, in consideration of employee safety, the facility would be required to dispense daily cover (six inches of well compacted earthen material in accordance with §330.133) to secure waste before evacuating. Part III, Attachment 6, (Groundwater and Surface Water Protection Plan, of the application) has provisions for handling surface water runoff. Surface water drains into the facility's storm water pond thus preventing direct contact with waste. Additionally, the facility is not located in a flood plain.

### COMMENT 32 (Tipping Fees)

**Delbert DeFlora** indicated that tipping fees are bribes.

### RESPONSE 32

Tipping fees are the price that customers pay to unload waste at a landfill. The fees are used to pay for obtaining permit; designing, constructing, and operating landfill; and closure measures and financial assurance. Some of the fee is directed to the TCEQ to fund regulatory costs. The agency is funded through fees and fines on the entire environmentally regulated community. Half of the money received by the TCEQ from tipping fees is directed to the local Council of Governments (COG), in this case HGAC, to fund local projects and to provide guidance, including RSWMPs, for local solid waste activities. If the comment was intended to refer to payments made to local governmental organizations, such as a county or city, these arrangements are not required by MSW rules and are not considered during the application review.

### COMMENT 33 (Faults, Wetlands, Subsidence)

**Elliott Broughton**, State Representative **Dora Olivo**, **Anita Prinz**, and **Mary Ross** indicated that the expansion violates location restrictions for faults and wetlands. **Robert Stoll** requested more information regarding faults. **Elliott Broughton**, **Zhiyue Wang** and **Qing Yuan** requested documentation on the effect the landfill will have on the subgrade and whether subsidence will be accelerated.

### RESPONSE 33

In accordance with §330.302, a new or expanded MSW waste footprint may not be located in wetlands. As discussed in Parts I/II, Section 11.2 and illustrated on Figure I/II-11.2, no jurisdictional wetland areas or waters of the United States are located within the waste disposal area.

In accordance with §330.303, a new or expanded MSW waste footprint may not be located within 200 feet of a fault that has had displacement in Holocene time or provide a demonstration that a proposed offset is adequate to protect the integrity of the waste unit. As discussed in Parts I/II, Section 9.2, fault studies for the original application and for the expansion demonstrate compliance with the location restriction for faults. A fault study is provided in Attachment 4, Section 2.4, pages 4-35 to 4-44.

Subgrade settlement analysis is discussed in Part III, Attachment 4, Section 3.6.3 of the application. Sample calculations of subgrade settlement analyses are presented in Appendix 4I on Figures 4I.7 through 4I.10. Historical and predicted regional land subsidence maps are provided on Figure 4A.6 in Appendix 4A. MSW rules do not require a determination of whether subsidence will be accelerated by a facility.

#### **COMMENT 34** (Adjacent Landowners)

**Rodrigo Carreon** asked if the 170 owners listed in the application will share in costs of the landfill.

#### **RESPONSE 34**

The comment appears to refer to the 174 adjacent (within 500 feet of the permit boundary) landowners listed in Parts I/II, Section 5. These individuals will in no way share in costs or benefits of the landfill unless through some undisclosed agreement or business relationship. MSW rules do not require explanation of agreements between the landfill owner or operator and an individual. Only owners of 20% or more of the business that owns the facility must be listed in the application.

#### **COMMENT 35** (Waste Acceptance Disparity)

**Elliott Broughton** noted a discrepancy between TCEQ publication "Municipal Solid Waste in Texas: A Year in Review" for 2005 and the application. The TCEQ publication indicates that the facility received about 633,000 tons of waste in 2005. The application indicates that the current rate is almost 1,100,000 tons/year.

#### **RESPONSE 35**

The annual waste acceptance rate in the TCEQ publication is waste accepted for the referenced year. The daily rate at the end of the year is almost certainly greater than the daily rate at the beginning of the year. A current figure would be based on the most recent, and most likely the highest daily rate. Any apparent error beyond this explanation is conservative, leading to higher quantities of traffic, for example, than may actually be needed. The Executive Director concludes

that any error in the application value is conservative and more protective of human health and the environment.

**COMMENT 36** (13-Year Expansion)

**Rodrigo Carreon** asked which bill gave this facility a 13-year expansion.

**RESPONSE 36**

The question appears to indicate a misunderstanding of the facts relating to this application. This facility was originally permitted under MSW Permit #1505. MSW permits are issued for the lifetime of the facility, which includes its operation, closure, and post-closure. The facility has not reached its currently permitted waste capacity, and the estimated remaining life is 13 years. All MSW permits are authorized in accordance with the TSWDA.

**COMMENT 37** (“Technically”)

**Delbert DeFlora** objected to references to “technically” as in “the application is technically complete” or “meets the technical requirements.”

**RESPONSE 37**

The comment appears to indicate a misunderstanding of the use of the word “technically” by the TCEQ. When a permit application arrives at TCEQ it receives a cursory administrative review to ensure that the main “pieces” of the application, such as the Site Development Plan and the Site Operating Plan, have been provided. Once Permit Administrative Review determines that the application includes the main “pieces” required, the application is considered to be “administratively complete” and forwarded to technical staff. Technical staff is appropriately educated and experienced to review the application in accordance with all applicable rules. They do not only see if the “piece” is provided; they determine if the submittal meets any provided standards and the intent of the rule. Once the conclusion is reached that the submittal meets the technical requirements of the rules, the application is found to be “technically complete.” The Executive Director determined that the proposed landfill was designed in compliance with the TSWDA, and with the MSW rules and regulations developed to protect human health and the environment. If the proposed landfill is constructed and operated as shown in the application and as required by the regulations, the Executive Director expects human health and the environment to be protected.

**COMMENT 38** (Chemicals Produced by Facility)

**Delbert DeFlora** indicated that the facility should provide a list of all the chemicals it produces.

**RESPONSE 38**

The facility will not produce chemicals other than those produced during breakdown of waste disposed in the landfill cell, and so no list is needed. Landfill gas is produced from the breakdown of waste. Leachate is the fluid resulting from water percolating through the waste. These are expected results of properly interred waste.

**COMMENT 39** (Notification)

**Carla Bell, Jimmy Bell, Sherry Bell, Elliott Broughton, Delbert DeFlora, Bruce Guillory,** and the individuals identified as **Group 6** either inquired as to who is notified in the case of an application or a release or commented that more people should be notified.

**RESPONSE 39**

Notification requirements for new permits and amendment applications are contained in §§305.70(e)(5) and 39.413(1) of the rules. Essentially, persons entitled to notice include: people who own property within 500 feet of the proposed permit boundary; city, county and state officials specified by the rule; and those individuals who have placed themselves on a concerned party list with the Office of the Chief Clerk for the county in which the facility is located.

If methane is identified above the regulatory limit of 5% by volume in landfill gas monitoring points or probes or 1.25% by volume in facility structures, the same contact list is followed. If assessment constituents in groundwater are detected at a statistically significant level exceeding groundwater protection standards, notification is provided for the same list, but also for anyone owning property over the groundwater contaminant plume.

**COMMENT 40** (Sugar Frames)

**Robert Stoll** indicated that the proposed liner system does not use “sugar frames” which he indicates are new and should be used at this facility.

RESPONSE 40

MSW rules do not require the use of "sugar frames." The Executive Director is unfamiliar with "sugar frames" and could find no information relating the term to landfill liner systems.

No changes to the draft permit have been made except where noted.



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
