- * Minimum required seperation for OSSF is 50 ft of any streams creek ponds and lakes .



This letter is sent regarding an application filed by Julie Ann Thames requesting a permit for a proposed Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) which would allow her to discharge treated wastewater at a volume not to exceed a daily average flow of 10,000 gallons per day. There are several inaccuracies in Ms. Thames application, which are directly relevant to the matter at hand.

First, Ms. Thames incorrectly lists the location of her property. The correct location of her property is 2.1 miles south of Farm-to-Market Road 1187 and .1 mile west of Farm-to-Market 1902. With the incorrect location given, one might think that her property was situated on Rock Creek, which is not true. Her property is situated on an unnamed tributary that is nothing more than a runoff for two local stock tanks. The tributary is a dry creek unless it rains substantially. When there is water in the creek, it feeds into a stock tank located on Mr. David Bell's property.

Second, Ms. Thames application does not mention that the wastewater would have to travel 1500 feet, turn and then travel an additional 400 feet across a property owned by me in order to reach Rock Creek. It should be noted that I use Rock Creek for watering livestock. Rock Creek has low spots that do not drain year round. It would be extremely detrimental to the property owners along this dry creek if wastewater were allowed to stagnate in the undrained low spots. Clearly, it would affect the watering of our livestock and would ultimately decrease our property values.

Third, Ms. Thames has an additional 15 acres that are not being used by her mobile home trailer park. She has plenty of space to dispose of her own wastewater on her own property. I see no viable reason why Ms. Thames should be allowed to contaminate this seasonal creek, jeopardize the watering of livestock and affect others property values for the use of her business. She has an ample amount of her own property available for waste disposal. If she is granted a permit to dispose of wastewater volume not to exceed a daily average of 10,000 gallons per day, she will undoubtedly install additional mobile homes on her property.



To The Honorable Texas Commission on Environmental Quality:

As previously noted in our letter to you of March 14, 2007, we represent Crestview Farm 250, L.P. ("Crestview"), the owner of an approximately 250-acre tract of land abutting Rock Creek in Tarrant County, Texas. Our client's property is situated approximately two (2) river miles downstream from the proposed discharge site in the referenced application and permit, and is therefore directly affected by the proposed discharge.

Our client's property is used for agricultural and recreational purposes, and depends upon Rock Creek for water supply. The property is also ultimately intended for residential use. Our client will be directly and adversely impacted by the proposed discharge facility because agricultural activities will be negatively impacted, residential uses may be constrained, and current recreational uses of the creek would be impaired.

Crestview Farm 250, L.P. requests a contested case hearing. Please note the name of the undersigned and the address, telephone number, and fax number shown above as legal representative of Crestview.

The relevant and material disputed issues of fact raised during the public comment period and that are material to this request for contested case hearing are as follows:

1. Crestview disputes that the Executive Director has adequately considered public interest concerns, public policy, and environmental considerations in granting the permit. The proposed location of discharge will directly and adversely impact native prairie areas that are part of a proposed public recreational and park areas. Please see the correspondence of the

Honorable Lon Burnam, State Representative of District 90, and letter from Professor Jeff Howard of the University of Texas at Arlington for further details and discussion of this issue. On this contested issue of fact, Crestview disputes the Executive Director's Responses 1, 3, 4, 9, and 14.

2. Crestview disputes that the Executive Director has adequately considered whether the proposed permit is feasible as written because the proposed discharge point is located on private property and no provision has been made to acquire the necessary private property rights to discharge treated effluent on another person's property. On this contested issue of fact, Crestview disputes the Executive Director's Responses 9, 10, 16, and 17.

3. Crestview disputes that the Executive Director has adequately considered the effect of this permit on discharges into streams that feed into Lake Benbrook and to the potential cumulative impact of those discharges on Lake Benbrook and surrounding areas. In his response to comments, the Executive Director recognizes that he has not employed a case-by-case analysis as is provided by the Commission's rules and regulations and as is called for in this application. Given the proximity of the point of discharge to Lake Benbrook, the likely impact on tall grass prairie lands and potential recreational and park lands, and the substantial opposition of neighboring landowners over whose property the treated effluent will have to flow, the Commission should employ site-specific testing and a case-specific consideration. On this contested issue of fact, Crestview disputes the Executive Director's Responses 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 10, and 19.

4. Crestview disputes that the Executive Director has properly considered the applicant's prior compliance history and history of prior enforcement actions in the application. The applicant has a poor history of compliance in the past, including a long history of unresolved complaints from neighbors of odors, and should not be permitted to increase her treatment operation because the Commission "hopes" that she will be in compliance in the future. Crestview disputes the Executive Director's Responses 10, 11, 13, and 14.

With regard to contested issues of law and policy, Crestview disputes:

1. That the proposed draft permit is protective of the environment, water quality, and human health;

2. That the proposed draft permit meets Commission rules and requirements;

3. That the Executive Director has adequately considered public interest concerns, public policy, and environmental considerations in granting the permit;

4. That the Executive Director has adequately considered whether the proposed permit is feasible as written because the proposed discharge point is located on private property and no provision has been made to acquire the necessary private property rights to discharge treated effluent on another person's property;

5. That the Executive Director has adequately considered the cumulative effects of this permit on discharges into streams that feed into Lake Benbrook and to the potential cumulative impact of those discharges on Lake Benbrook and surrounding areas;


6. That the Commission has properly considered the applicant's prior compliance history and history of prior enforcement actions in the application; and

7. That the proposed draft permit is in the public interest.

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

