**EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S RESPONSE TO HEARING REQUESTS**

The Executive Director (ED) of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (Commission or TCEQ) files this response (Response) to the requests for a contested case hearing submitted by persons listed herein. The Texas Clean Air Act (TCAA) §382.056(n) requires the commission to consider hearing requests in accordance with the procedures provided in Tex. Water Code §5.556.<sup>1</sup> This statute is implemented through the rules in 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 55, Subchapter F.

A map showing the location of the site for the proposed facility is included with this response and has been provided to all persons on the attached mailing list. In addition, a current compliance history report, technical review summary, modeling audit memorandum, and draft permit prepared by the ED's staff have been filed with the TCEQ's Office of Chief Clerk for the commission's consideration. Finally, the ED's Response to Public Comments (RTC), which was mailed by the chief clerk to all persons on the mailing list, is on file with the chief clerk for the commission's consideration.

**I. Application Request and Background Information**

Aggregate Industries-WCR, Inc has applied to the TCEQ for a New Source Review Authorization under Texas Clean Air Act (TCAA) §382.0518. This will authorize the construction of a new facility that may emit air contaminants. This permit will authorize the applicant to construct a rock crushing plant consisting of three feed hoppers, seven crushers, 16 screens, associated conveyor belts, 30 acres of stockpiles, and two 10,000 gallon tanks of diesel fuel for onsite vehicle use. The site will operate 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, and 52 weeks per year for a total of 8,760 hours per year. Plant throughput will be authorized at 2,000 tons per hour with an annual throughput of 5,000,000 tons per year. The facility is located at 5900 FM 482 New Braunfels, Comal County. Contaminants authorized under this permit include organic compounds and particulate matter including particulate matter less than 10 microns in diameter (PM<sub>10</sub>).

The permit application was received on December 28, 2007, and declared administratively complete on January 28, 2008. The Notice of Receipt and Intent to Obtain an Air Quality Permit (public notice) for this permit application was published on February 25, 2008, in *El Norte The Community's Newspaper*, and on February 26, 2008 in the *New Braunfels Herald-Zeitung*. A public meeting was held on March 10, 2009 in New Braunfels, Comal County, Texas. The notice of public meeting and the Notice of Application and Preliminary Decision for an Air Quality Permit was published on February 25, 2009 in the *New Braunfels Herald-Zeitung* and in *El Norte The Community's Newspaper*. The public comment period ended on March 27, 2009. The executive director's Response to Comment was filed on July 1, 2009. Since this application was administratively complete after September 1, 1999, this action is subject to the procedural requirements adopted in accordance with House Bill 801, 76th Legislature, 1999.

The chief clerk's database states that there were two hundred sixteen hearing requests filed for this permit. This includes a hearing request from State Senator Jeff Wentworth. A request for reconsideration was also filed by Wayne E. Brown.

## **II. Applicable Law**

The commission must assess the timeliness and form of the hearing requests, as discussed above. The form requirements are set forth in 30 TAC § 55.201(d):

- (d) A hearing request must substantially comply with the following:
- (1) give the name, address, daytime telephone number, and, where possible, fax number of the person who files the request. If the request is made by a group or association, the request must identify one person by name, address, daytime telephone number, and, where possible, fax number, who shall be responsible for receiving all official communications and documents for the group;
  - (2) identify the person's personal justiciable interest affected by the application, including a brief, but specific, written statement explaining in plain language the requester's location and distance relative to the proposed facility or activity that is the subject of the application and how and why the requester believes he or she will be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity in a manner not common to members of the general public;
  - (3) request a contested case hearing;
  - (4) list all relevant and material disputed issues of fact that were raised during the public comment period and that are the basis of the hearing request. To facilitate the commission's determination of the number and scope of issues to be referred to hearing, the requester should, to the extent possible, specify any of the executive director's responses to comments that the requester disputes and the factual basis of the dispute and list any disputed issues of law or policy; and
  - (5) provide any other information specified in the public notice of application.

The next necessary determination is whether the requests were filed by "affected persons" as defined by Tex. Water Code § 5.115, and implemented in commission rule 30 TAC § 55.203. Under 30 TAC § 55.203, an affected person is one who has a personal justiciable interest related to a legal right, duty, privilege, power or economic interest affected by the application. An interest common to members of the general public does not qualify as a personal justiciable interest. Local governments with authority under state law over issues raised by the application receive affected person status under 30 TAC § 55.203(b).

In determining whether a person is affected, 30 TAC § 55.203(c) requires all factors be considered, including, but not limited to, the following:

- (1) whether the interest claimed is one protected by the law under which the application will be considered;
- (2) distance restrictions or other limitations imposed by law on the affected interest;
- (3) whether a reasonable relationship exists between the interest claimed and the activity regulated;
- (4) likely impact of the regulated activity on the health and safety of the person, and on the use of property of the person;
- (5) likely impact of the regulated activity on use of the impacted natural resource by the person; and
- (6) for governmental entities, their statutory authority over or interest in the issues relevant to the application.

In addition to the requirements noted above regarding affected person status, in accordance with 30 TAC § 55.205(a), a group or association may request a contested case hearing only if the group or association meets all of the following requirements:

- (1) one or more members of the group or association would otherwise have standing to request a hearing in their own right;
- (2) the interests the group or association seeks to protect are germane to the organization's purpose; and
- (3) neither the claim asserted nor the relief requested requires the participation of the individual members in the case.<sup>2</sup>

If the commission determines a hearing request is timely and fulfills the requirements for proper form and the hearing requester is an affected person, the commission must apply a three-part test to the issues raised in the matter to determine if any of the issues should be referred to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a contested case hearing. The three-part test in 30 TAC § 50.115(c) is as follows:

- (1) The issue must involve a disputed question of fact;
- (2) The issue must have been raised during the public comment period; and
- (3) The issue must be relevant and material to the decision on the application.

The law applicable to the proposed facility may generally be summarized as follows. A person who owns or operates a facility or facilities that will emit air contaminants is required to obtain authorization from the commission prior to the construction and operation of the facility or facilities.<sup>3</sup> Thus, the location and operation of the proposed facility requires authorization under the TCAA. Permit conditions of general applicability must be in rules adopted by the commission.<sup>4</sup> Those rules are found in 30 TAC Chapter 116. In addition, a person is prohibited from emitting air contaminants or performing any activity that violates the TCAA or any commission rule or order, or that causes or contributes to air pollution.<sup>5</sup> The relevant rules regarding air emissions are found in 30 TAC Chapters 101 and 111-118. In addition, the commission has the authority to establish and enforce permit conditions consistent with this chapter.<sup>6</sup> The materials accompanying this response list and reference permit conditions and operational requirements and limitations applicable to this proposed facility.

### **III. Analysis of Hearing Requests**

#### **A. Were the requests for a contested case hearing in this matter timely and in proper form?**

The persons listed on Attachment A all submitted timely hearing requests for this permit. A timely hearing request was also submitted by state Senator Jeff Wentworth.

The following persons submitted a timely hearing request and provided an address that is at or within one mile from the proposed facility (see attached maps): Curtis A Fey Jr, Sharlene & Tim Fey, Daryl & Jeri Hoffman, Kathleen Hoffman, Todd Hoffman, Dennis Parma, Maggie Parma, Dwight & Sandra Reeh, Tressie Mae Russell, Vandeline Sahn, Carol Warwick Smith, and Heather Hoffmann & Jason Stewart. One business, Magnolia Springs Associates, submitted a timely hearing request through their attorney, Patrick Christensen. Magnolia Springs Associates is developing a community of approximately 535 homes in the area that is designated as Magnolia Springs Subdivision on the attached maps. Part of this subdivision is also located within one mile of the proposed facility.

All of the remaining requestors listed on Attachment A provided addresses that were greater than one mile from the proposed facility (see attached maps).

The hearing requests were submitted during the public comment period or during the period for requesting a contested case hearing after the filing of the ED's RTC. Furthermore, the ED has determined the hearing requests of all the requestors listed on Attachment A substantially comply with all of the requirements for form in 30 TAC § 55.201(d).

The ED addressed all public comments in this matter by providing responses in the RTC. The cover letter from the Office of the Chief Clerk attached to the RTC states that requesters should, to the extent possible, specify any of the ED's responses in the RTC that the requesters dispute and the factual basis of the dispute, and list any disputed issues of law or policy.<sup>7</sup> In the absence of a response from any of the hearing requesters considered to be affected persons or their representatives within the thirty-day period after the RTC was mailed, the ED cannot determine or speculate whether the hearing requesters considered to be affected persons continue to dispute issues of fact, or whether there are any outstanding issues of law or policy. The ED nevertheless has included all of the issues raised by hearing requesters regarding this application as listed below.

B. Are those who requested a contested case hearing in this matter affected persons?

Many of the requesters have demonstrated that they are "affected persons" as defined in 30 TAC § 55.203. The threshold test of affected person status is whether the requestor has a personal justiciable interest affected by the application, and this interest is different from that of the general public.<sup>8</sup> All of the hearing requesters who submitted requests on this application listed at least one personal justiciable interest affected by the application. However, many did not indicate how their interest is different from the general public. Because only particulate matter emissions are expected from this facility, which disperse in the air over distance from the emission points, distance from the proposed facility is key to the issue whether or not there is a likely impact of the regulated activity on a person's interests such as the health and safety of the person, and on the use of property of the person. The ED has identified the following requesters who reside at or within 1 mile of the proposed facility and thus may be affected in a manner different from the general public (see the attached maps for individual requesters): Curtis A Fey Jr, Sharlene & Tim Fey, Daryl & Jeri Hoffman, Kathleen Hoffman, Todd Hoffman, Dennis Parma, Maggie Parma, Dwight & Sandra Reeh, Tressie Mae Russell, Vandeline Sahm, Carol Warwick Smith, and Heather Hoffmann & Jason Stewart. Additionally, the business, Magnolia Springs Associates, is developing a subdivision that is located within one mile of the proposed facility. The remaining hearing requestors have provided addresses that are beyond one mile from the facility. As they reside more than 1 mile from the proposed facility, they are not likely to be impacted differently than any other member of the general public.

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C. Do those groups who requested a hearing meet the group or associational standing requirements?

There were no groups or associations that requested a contested case hearing for this permit. Although several hearing requestors sent in a petition with a return address for "Comal Residents for Rural Heritage," no request for a hearing was specifically received from the group. These petitions were evaluated as individual hearing requests. None of these petitions received were signed and sent in by any of the requestors that have been identified as affected parties.

D. Hearing request of State Senator Jeff Wentworth.

Local governments with authority under state law over issues raised by the application receive affected person status under 30 TAC § 55.203(b). The request by Senator Wentworth does not, however, meet the requirements of 30 TAC § 55.203(b).

Senator Wentworth requested that a public hearing be held in this matter, given the public interest of the affected residents, to ensure that the health and safety of the residents in the area are protected. Senator Wentworth does not have standing to request a contested case hearing on behalf of his constituents, and has not requested a hearing on his own behalf. Therefore, the ED is recommending that Senator Wentworth's hearing request be denied. However, the ED notes that he has recommended the referral of a number of individuals for hearing as affected persons.

E. Which issues in this matter should be referred to SOAH for hearing?

If the commission determines any of the hearing requests in this matter are timely and in proper form, and some or all of the hearing requesters are affected persons, the commission must apply the three-part test discussed in Section II to the issues raised in this matter to determine if any of the issues should be referred to SOAH for a contested case hearing. The three-part test asks whether the issues involve disputed questions of fact, whether the issues were raised during the public comment period, and whether the issues are relevant and material to the decision on the permit application, in order to refer them to SOAH.

The ED addressed all public comments in this matter by providing responses in the RTC. The cover letter from the Office of the Chief Clerk transmitting the RTC cites 30 TAC § 55.201(d)(4), which states that requesters should, to the extent possible, specify any of the ED's responses in the RTC the requesters dispute and the factual basis of the dispute, and list any disputed issues of law or policy. In the absence of a response from any of the hearing requesters considered to be affected persons or their representatives within the thirty-day period after the RTC was mailed, the ED cannot determine or speculate whether the hearing requesters considered to be affected persons continue to dispute issues of fact, or whether there are any outstanding issues of law or policy. The ED nevertheless has included all of the issues raised by hearing requesters regarding this application as listed below.

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**1. Issues involving questions of fact.**

Protestants raised the following issues in comments and hearing requests filed on this application:

1. Adverse effects on air quality claiming the project will cause or contribute to air pollution;
2. Adverse effects on the Edwards Aquifer;
3. Are the stockpile heights included in the permit conditions sufficiently protective, as they are greater than is TCEQ normal practice
4. Background on Westward Environmental;
5. Can the facility operate safely around preexisting a gas pipeline;
6. Compliance with OSHA;
7. Cumulative effects due to other rock quarries in the area;
8. Cumulative effects of other rock crushers
9. Deficiencies in the applicant's modeling;
10. Do the proposed controls at the proposed facility meet the requirement for "best available control technology?"
11. Effects on property values and property rights and economic impacts;
12. Effects on roads and traffic;
13. Effects on the Edward's Aquifer, ground water, water quality;
14. Enforceability of the permit conditions
15. Impact on the environment, wildlife/animals, endangered species such as the golden-cheeked warbler and it's habitat;
16. Limitation to single shift
17. Location and proximity to schools, homes, roads, parks, and the Edwards Aquifer;
18. Monitoring: who will monitor and why no particulate monitoring has been proposed or will occur;
19. Other necessary water related approvals;
20. Pollution caused by trucks used in the process;
21. Potential health impacts on the elderly, children, students in nearby schools, those living near the facility, and the public;
22. The combined environmental effect of the new plant;
23. Unannounced audits should be required as part of the permit conditions
24. Was the land surrounding the proposed facility properly characterized in the modeling?
25. Was the public notice for the application sufficient to meet the requirements of the Texas Clean Air Act and TCEQ rules?
26. Were implications of the effects of man-made changes to the landscape to the Balcones Escarpment properly considered/
27. Were sensitivity analyses properly done for the permit?
28. Were the health effects review and modeling for this permit properly conducted, and do the health effects review and modeling for this permit sufficiently demonstrate that the facility will not cause or contribute to a violation of air quality standards, a condition of air pollution, or a nuisance condition?

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29. What will be the effect of fugitive dust emissions from the facility?
30. Whether the applicant has an acceptable compliance history in Texas and other jurisdictions and whether there are any ongoing investigations of company/environmental liabilities;
31. Whether the rock crusher will cause or contribute to the following nuisance conditions: dust, noise, odor, and light pollution;
32. Will construction and operation of the proposed facility cause violations of the Texas Clean Air Act, or other applicable state or federal requirements?

**2. Were the issues raised during the public comment period?**

The public comment period is defined in 30 TAC § 55.152. The public comment period begins with the publication of the Notice of Receipt and Intent to Obtain an Air Quality Permit. The end date of the public comment period depends on the type of permit. In this case, the public comment period began on February 25, 2008 and ended March 27, 2009. All of the issues listed above upon which the hearing requests in this matter are based were raised in comments received during the public comment period.

**3. Whether the issues are relevant and material to the decision on the application.**

In this case, the permit would be issued under the commission's authority in Tex. Water Code § 5.013(11) (assigning the responsibilities in Chapter 382 of the Tex. Health and Safety Code) and the TCAA. The relevant sections of the TCAA are found in Subchapter C (Permits). Subchapter C requires the commission to grant a permit to construct or modify a facility if the commission finds the proposed facility will use at least the best available control technology (BACT) and the emissions from the facility will not contravene the intent of the TCAA, including the protection of the public's health and physical property. In making this permitting decision, the commission may consider the Applicant's compliance history. The commission by rule has also specified certain requirements for permitting. Therefore, in making the determination of relevance in this case, the commission should review each issue to see if it is relevant to these statutory and regulatory requirements that must be satisfied by this permit application.

The ED finds the following issues relevant and material to the decision on the application:

1. Whether the permit complies with the following applicable rules and regulations:
  - a. Whether the draft permit achieves BACT for particulate matter;
  - b. Whether the permit demonstrates compliance with the NAAQS for PM<sub>2.5</sub>;
  - c. Whether monitoring is required and if so, whether the permit provisions are sufficient;
  - d. Whether the application/permit is deficient with regard to representation and consideration of emission sources, emission rates, and stockpile levels;
  - e. Whether the stockpile heights included in the permit conditions are sufficiently protective;
  - f. Whether the permit conditions as written are enforceable;

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- g. Whether the permit should limit the applicant to a single shift;
  - h. Whether the permit properly controls for fugitive dust emissions;
  - i. Whether the permit requires proper maintenance of control equipment, and if not whether such provisions in the permit should be added;
  - j. Whether the permit is based on correct usage of emission factors; and
  - k. Whether the permit's recordkeeping provisions are adequate to ensure compliance.
2. Whether adverse health impacts are expected on the elderly, children, students in nearby schools, those living near the facility, and the public;
  3. Whether there will be an adverse impact on the livestock, wildlife/animals, or vegetation;
  4. Whether the rock crusher will cause or contribute to the following nuisance conditions: dust and odor;
  5. Will the permit have adverse effects on air quality, or cause or contribute to air pollution;
  6. Were the health effects review and modeling for this permit properly conducted, and do the health effects review and modeling for this permit sufficiently demonstrate that the facility will not cause or contribute to a violation of air quality standards, air pollution, or a nuisance condition? Did the modeling properly account for surrounding land uses?
  7. Location and proximity to schools, homes, roads, and parks;
  8. Will construction and operation of the proposed facility cause violations of the Texas Clean Air Act, or other applicable state or federal requirements?
  9. Was the public notice for the application sufficient to meet the requirements of the Texas Clean Air Act and TCEQ rules?
  10. Whether the applicant has an acceptable compliance history in Texas?

The ED finds the following issues are beyond the jurisdiction of TCEQ and thus not material to the decision on the application:

1. Background on Westward Environmental;
2. Can the facility operate safely around preexisting a gas pipeline;
3. Compliance with OSHA;
4. Cumulative effects due to other rock quarries in the area;
5. Effects on property values and property rights and economic impacts;
6. Effects on roads and traffic;
7. Pollution caused by trucks used in the process;
8. The combined environmental effect of the new plant;
9. Were implications of the effects of man-made changes to the landscape to the Balcones Escarpment properly considered?
10. Whether the rock crusher will cause or contribute to the following nuisance conditions: noise and light pollution.

The ED finds the following issues, although within the TCEQ's jurisdiction, not within the scope of this air permit review and thus not material to the decision on the application:

1. Adverse effects on the Edwards Aquifer;
2. Cumulative effects of other rock crushers

3. Effects on the Edward's Aquifer, ground water, water quality;
4. Other necessary water related approvals;
5. Unannounced audits should be required as part of the permit conditions
6. Whether the facility will adversely affect water quality.

#### **IV. Maximum Expected Duration of the Contested Case Hearing**

The ED recommends the contested case hearing, if held, should last no longer than six months from the preliminary hearing to the proposal for decision.

#### **V. Executive Director's Recommendation**

The Executive Director respectfully recommends the commission:

- A. Find all hearing requests in this matter were timely filed.
- B. Find that the requests of the following groups or persons satisfy the requirements for form under 30 TAC § 55.201(d) and are affected under 30 TAC § 55.203: Curtis A Fey Jr, Sharlene & Tim Fey, Daryl & Jeri Hoffman, Kathleen Hoffman, Todd Hoffman, Dennis Parma, Maggie Parma, Dwight & Sandra Reeh, Tressie Mae Russell, Vandeline Sahn, Carol Warwick Smith, Heather Hoffmann & Jason Stewart, and Magnolia Springs Associates.
- C. Find all other hearing requesters are not affected persons under 30 TAC § 55.203 in this matter;
- D. Deny the hearing request of state Senator Jeff Wentworth.
- E. If the commission determines any requester is an affected person, refer the following issues to SOAH:
  1. Whether the permit complies with the following applicable rules and regulations:
    - a. Whether the draft permit achieves BACT for particulate matter;
    - b. Whether the permit demonstrates compliance with the NAAQS for PM<sub>2.5</sub>;
    - c. Whether monitoring is required and if so, whether the permit provisions are sufficient;
    - d. Whether the application/permit is deficient with regard to representation and consideration of emission sources, emission rates, and stockpile levels;
    - e. Whether the stockpile heights included in the permit conditions are sufficiently protective;
    - f. Whether the permit conditions as written are enforceable;
    - g. Whether the permit should limit the applicant to a single shift;
    - h. Whether the permit properly controls for fugitive dust emissions;

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
- i. Whether the permit requires proper maintenance of control equipment, and if not whether such provisions in the permit should be added;
  - j. Whether the permit is based on correct usage of emission factors; and
  - k. Whether the permit's recordkeeping provisions are adequate to ensure compliance.
2. Whether adverse health impacts are expected on the elderly, children, students in nearby schools, those living near the facility, and the public;
  3. Whether there will be an adverse impact on the livestock, wildlife/animals, or vegetation;
  4. Whether the rock crusher will cause or contribute to the following nuisance conditions: dust and odor;
  5. Will the permit have adverse effects on air quality, or cause or contribute to air pollution;
  6. Were the health effects review and modeling for this permit properly conducted, and do the health effects review and modeling for this permit sufficiently demonstrate that the facility will not cause or contribute to a violation of air quality standards, air pollution, or a nuisance condition? Did the modeling properly account for surrounding land uses?
  7. Location and proximity to schools, homes, roads, and parks;
  8. Will construction and operation of the proposed facility cause violations of the Texas Clean Air Act, or other applicable state or federal requirements?
  9. Was the public notice for the application sufficient to meet the requirements of the Texas Clean Air Act and TCEQ rules?
  10. Whether the applicant has an acceptable compliance history in Texas?
- F. Deny the request for reconsideration filed by Wayne E. Brown; and
- G. Find the maximum expected duration of the contested case hearing, if held, would be six months.






