
In regards to SOAH Docket No.582—07-0267; TCEQ Docket No.2005-1818-PWS-E; It is with our deepest apologies for not responding to your correspondences. Until November 2007 we, the community of Dirgin, were un-aware of problems with our water system and Texas Commission on Environmental Quality. Jerry Weaver, who was the President of the board passed away earlier this year and Kasy Hickerson, the most recent President and named on the letter to appear, had resigned his position. It was not until November when our water system failed that we became aware that no one was in charge of our water system. At that time we, as a community came together and elected a new board of members and have taken successive steps in resolving issues with Dirgin Water Supply Corp.

On November 7, 2007 the community of Dirgin met and elected a board of 5 representatives from the community: President Pat McClung, Vice President Loyd Adams, Secretary /Treasure Sally Valcourt, Board Member Tony Broome, and Board Member Linda Wallace. Since this first meeting we have initiated steps to merge with Crystal Farms Water Supply Company and are in the process of signing a Memorandum of Understanding with Crystal Farms Water system. This Memorandum is due to be signed December 17th, 2007 at our next scheduled meeting. This contract will provide a certified operator for our system as well as other services needed by Dirgin Water Supply.

Other steps taken have been to mandate that all customers of Dirgin Water System have a working meter installed at each connection by March 1, 2008. Some repairs have been made at the water well site including replacing a leaking valve and cleaning the well meter. The location has been mowed and volunteers have cleared most of the plant growth from the fences. A survey was sent throughout the community to determine the exact number of customers on our system. Water rates were raised to become effective December 1, 2007 to help pay for costs of running the system and paying past due bills. Though these steps do not cover all of the issues of non-compliance, we are steadily working to correct past mistakes and deficiencies with Dirgin Water Supply.

Therefore we are respectfully requesting your consideration in rescheduling the date of the enforcement action hearing so that we may be better prepared to attend and work with TCEQ towards achieving these goals.
