Additional revisions to the guidelines were also proposed by the executive director. HB 3399 included changes and additions to the TERP eligibility criteria, including: changes to the period over which a grant-funded vehicle must be operated, to either five years or 400,000 miles, whichever occurs earlier; specific criteria for decommissioning a vehicle or vehicle engine under the program; and provisions to allow a vehicle that has been leased or otherwise commercially financed to be replaced under the program. HB 3399 also added a provision that the executive director is to waive eligibility requirements on a finding of good cause. The revisions make the guidelines consistent with the statutory and regulatory changes. Additional changes proposed by the executive director include: addition of Wise County to the list of counties eligible for TERP grants; changes to the semi-annual reporting requirements to allow the executive director to establish an annual reporting schedule or suspend reporting requirements; establish a three-year limit on the age of vehicles and equipment purchased under a replacement project; authorize the executive director to establish lower limits on the percentage of costs that may be reimbursed under a grant; and other non-substantive changes to clarify requirements and existing practice. Guidelines were made available for public comment. Comments received have been considered and responded to in the Executive Director's Response to Comments. (Steve Dayton, Betsy Peticolas)

The proposed rulemaking would implement House Bill 451 from the 82nd Legislature, 2011, Regular Session, relating to the creation of a Don't Mess with Texas Water program to help prevent illegal dumping that affects surface waters of this state. The adoption would amend existing rules and add new rules pertaining to the use of a Class I well for disposal of nonhazardous drinking water treatment residuals (DWTR) into a salt cavern in horizontally bedded or non-domal salt. This includes disposal of nonhazardous DWTR that contain naturally occurring radioactive material (NORM). A Radioactive Materials License is required for disposal of DWTR containing NORM that does not meet an exempted level for its radiological content. The rules would provide a disposal alternative within Texas for public water systems to dispose of their treatment residuals containing NORM in a manner that is protective of human health and safety and the environment. Currently, the only facilities licensed to dispose of these wastes are landfills located out of state. The rules include repeal of an obsolete rule and editorial clarifications and corrections. This rulemaking removes references to the Council from Chapter 285. The proposed rulemaking also implements HB 240, 82nd Legislature, 2011, Regular Session. The rulemaking requires all On-Site Sewage Facilities (OSSF), including risers and covers, installed after September 1, 2012, to be designed to prevent access by anyone other than the system's owner and licensed OSSF installers or maintenance providers.
