These certificates require LCRA to develop the WMP, Permit No. 5838, which provides how LCRA makes water available from these lakes to help meet "firm" water customer needs, downstream interruptible irrigation demands, and environmental flow needs of Matagorda Bay and the lower Colorado River, and how LCRA will manage and curtail supplies from the lakes during times of drought including through a repeat of the Drought of Record. LCRA requests that the emergency order change the triggers for curtailment of interruptible water in the 2010 WMP to state that LCRA is not required to release any water for interruptible customers other than Garwood irrigation division for the duration of the order.
