Consideration for adoption of amended Section 7.119 of 30 TAC Chapter 7, Memoranda of Understanding. The rulemaking would adopt, by reference, the rules of the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) in 43 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 2, Subchapter I, Memorandum of Understanding with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality. 43 TAC Subchapter I contains an updated Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ, agency) and TxDOT addressing the TCEQ environmental reviews of TxDOT highway (transportation) projects. The updates to the MOU implement requirements in Sections 1 and 5 of Senate Bill (SB) 548, Section 18 of SB 1420, and Sections 1 and 5 of House Bill 630, 82nd Legislature, 2011, and make additional changes to the MOU. The primary change to the updated MOU addresses the requirement in Texas Transportation Code §201.607, that the MOU include language specifying that comments submitted to TxDOT later than the available 45-day review period will be considered by TxDOT to the extent possible. The updated MOU also changes the triggers for review of a project and allows TxDOT to coordinate review of environmental reports with the TCEQ. The updated MOU also changes the reference to the TCEQ's agency's name from the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality and includes other changes.
