Item 2. APPLICATION BY PENNZOIL SULPHUR COMPANY for an amendment to Permit No. SU-50501 which authorizes a Class III Frasch Sulfur Mining Permit to conduct Frasch sulfur mining at its Culberson Mine. The Culberson Mine is located approximately 42 miles northwest of Pecos in Blocks 45, 52, and 111 of the Public School Land Survey in Culberson County, Texas.
