TCEQ Docket No. 2004-0049-AIR; SOAH Docket No. 582-05-0593; Consideration of the Application by ASARCO Incorporated (ASARCO) for renewal of Air Quality Permit No. 20345 to authorize its continued operation and all related filings, including the Executive Director's Report to the Commission on the Renewal of Asarco Incorporated's Air Quality Permit No. 20345 prepared pursuant to the Commission's Interim Order of March 10, 2006, public comments, and the Executive Director's Responses to Comments. The copper smelting plant is located at 2301 West Paisano Road, El Paso, El Paso County, Texas.

Adopt as the Commission's Report and Schedule, accept as modified by this Order, the Executive Director's Report, including the schedule of actions required to be taken in accordance with TCAA Section 382.055; order that actions as described in the Report shall be taken by ASARCO as expeditiously as possible, but no later than 90 days prior to startup; and adopt the July 2007 Executive Director's Response to Comments and the earlier Executive Director's Response to Comments on the renewal application. Also order that by July 1, 2008, ASARCO shall provide the Executive Director with assessment reports and maintenance plans with regard to the baghouses, the acid plants and the electrostatic precipitators, and the Executive Director's Report requirements with regard to corrosion damage, cleaned and/or mothballed equipment and systems, and other plant parts and areas in need of general housekeeping; and beginning September 1, 2008, ASARCO shall submit bi-monthly progress reports to the Executive Director describing progress toward completion of the repairs and maintenance identified and required. In addition, order that ASARCO shall not start up operations at its El Paso Plant unless and until all the requirements set forth in the Executive Director's Report, as modified by this Order, have been completed in the timeframes specified and the Executive Director has certified in writing, full and satisfactory completion of all those items, and if the Executive Director determines that ASARCO has failed to complete all the requirements in the Report in the timeframes specified, the Executive Director shall immediately refer the matter to the SOAH for a contested case hearing for ASARCO to show cause why the permit should not expire immediately in accordance with TCAA Section 382.055(g). The Executive Director is ordered to revise the draft permit as recommended by the Executive Director on page 27, changes 1, 2, and 4, of the Executive Director's Report and to file a copy of the revised permit in the Office of Chief Clerk and to mail a copy to all parties on the official service list for this matter. The Executive Director is also directed to add two new Special Conditions with one stating that the permit shall be effective for 5 years from the renewal date shown above in the revised permit, unless it expires in accordance with Section 382.055(g), and the other stating that ASARCO shall establish, maintain and operate under the direction of the TCEQ, four additional air monitors positioned on the fence line, in-stack, or other more advantageous positions with site locations for the monitors and more extensive monitoring to be determined with certain official cooperative efforts as agreed to in light of Senator Shapleigh's request for a cooperative approach to location of the monitors. Also deny all hearing requests and all other motions, requests for entry of specific findings and conclusions, and any other request for general or specific relief not granted in this Order; direct that ASARCO be allocated and shall pay all transcription costs from the 2005 SOAH hearing; and approve

ASARCO's renewal application and the issuance of the revised permit and direct the Office of General Counsel to attach a copy of the revised permit as Exhibit A. BG/LS; all agree.
