The proposed location of the radioactive waste disposal facility site is on property identified as Section 25, Block A-29, Public School Land Surveys, Andrews County, Texas (Section 25). The condemnation of mineral interests underlying Section 25 is necessary to acquire a fee simple title to the entire surface and mineral estate, as provided by Texas Health & Safety Code Sections 401.204, 401.205, and 401.209. The following mineral interests underlie Section 25 and should be condemned because they are needed to accomplish the necessary public use: 1) Bank of America, Trustee for V.P. Baker Trust, 1/96 interest in the Northeast Quarter and South Half; 2) Linda Rae Caperton, 1/576 interest in all of Section 25; 3) Ashley Crawford Strouth, 1/36 in the Northwest Quarter; 4) Gerald R. Geisler, 1/128 interest in the Northeast Quarter and South Half; 5) John Geisler, 1/384 interest in the Northeast Quarter and South Half; 6) Lana Kay Martinez, 1/576 interest in all of Section 25; 7) Daniel Joe Pike, 1/576 interest in all of Section 25; and 8) Alfred Cooper, Trustee, 2/151

interest in the Northwest Quarter. Waste Control Specialists LLC has attempted to purchase and/or exchange the mineral interests underlying Section 25 to acquire fee simple title to said mineral interests. In addition, Waste Control Specialists has offered each of the above mineral interest owners the ability to enter into a surface use agreement pursuant to Texas Health & Safety Code § 401.204(b). Waste Control Specialists and the individuals/entities listed above were unable to agree on the damages to be paid for those interests or on an acceptable surface use agreement. The Executive Director of the Commission is ordered to transmit a request on behalf of the Commission to the Attorney General of the State of Texas to file against any and all owners or lien holders of any interests of the mineral rights underlying Section 25 on which the low-level radioactive waste disposal facility site is proposed to be located, proceedings in eminent domain on behalf of the Commission to acquire fee simple title to the mineral rights underlying Section 25 and the Executive Director is authorized to consult with the Attorney General on the condemnation proceeding and to undertake actions necessary to satisfy the requirements of Texas Property Code Chapter 21. BS/BG; LS opposed.

The Commission will also consider timely public comments and the Executive Director's Response to such comments; the application and related filings, exceptions and replies. (John E. Williams and J. Diane Goss)

Remand the matter back to SOAH, with instructions to abate the hearing in order for the analysis to be conducted using the 80.9 milidarcy permeability and assumption that the fault in question is non-transmissive in the horizontal direction and to hold a hearing with that new modeling, information on the public interest, and alternative disposal options. The ALJ is then directed to draft an Amended Proposal for Decision and bring that back to the Commission. BS/LS; all agree

Item 2. TCEQ Docket No. 2007-0362-IHW; SOAH Docket No. 582-07-2674. Consideration of the Administrative Law Judges' Proposal for Decision and Order regarding the application of TexCom Gulf Disposal, L.L.C. for nonhazardous Industrial Solid Waste Permit No. 87758 pursuant to rules of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality in Texas Health and Safety Code Chapter 361 and 30 TAC Chapters 37, 305 and 335 to authorize the operation of a commercial nonhazardous industrial solid waste management facility for the storage and processing of Class I and Class II nonhazardous industrial solid waste generated on-site and received from off-site sources on a commercial basis. The proposed facility would be located at 16185 Creighton Road on the corner of Creighton Road and FM 3080, southeast of the City of Conroe, in Montgomery County, Texas. Remand back to SOAH and direct to utilize Chapters 305, 331, and 335 and taking any additional evidence needed to fully consider whether the surface facility permit satisfies applicable standards and issue a supplemental Proposal for Decision on the ALJ's findings within six months from the preliminary hearing. BS/LS; all agree.

Item 3. TCEQ Docket No. 2007-1833-UCR; SOAH Docket No. 582-08-0990. Consideration of the Administrative Law Judge's Proposal for Decision and Order regarding the plea of the jurisdiction of Wellborn Special Utility District (Wellborn) of Brazos County regarding the application of the City of College Station pursuant to Tex. Water Code § 13.255(a) to decertify a portion of Certificate of Convenience and Necessity No. 11340 of Wellborn and to amend CCN No. 10169 in Brazos County, Texas (Application No. 35717-C). The Commission will also consider timely public comments, the application, related filings, exceptions and replies. (Brian MacLeod)

Adopt the ALJ's Proposal for Decision and issue the proposed Order with the following changes: 1) modify Finding of Fact No. 20 to read "Wellborn filed an original Plea to the Jurisdiction and Answer on March 3, 2008 and an amended Plea to the Jurisdiction and Answer on April 25, 2008 requesting dismissal of College Station's application on the basis of sovereign immunity, res judicata, and collateral estoppel"; 2) amend Conclusion of Law No. 2 to add the words "or jurisdiction" between the words "special expertise" and "of the Commission"; 3) delete Conclusion of Law No. 3; 4) delete Ordering Provision No. 1; and 5) renumber accordingly. The City of Smithville is purchasing sewer facilities from LCRA that serve the area being transferred and will provide service to the customer being transferred. Under the contract, LCRA will transfer a portion of its sewer CCN to the City of Smithville along with the purchased facilities. (Stefanie Skogen, Heidi Graham)

Approve the contract between the City of Smithville and LCRA under Texas Water Code § 13.248 which will result in the transfer of approximately 6,456 acres from LCRA's sewer CCN to Smithville's sewer CCN No. 20377 and issue the Executive Director's proposed Order but add a sentence in paragraph 2 to identify that the transfer area is approximately 6,456 acres. BS/LS; all agree.
