1. Discussion of the Monthly Enforcement Report for March 2004. Anne Dobbs, Office of Compliance and Enforcement, presented this issue.

2. Consideration of issues related to the agency's FY 2005 Recommended Operating Budget. Linda Flores, Chief Financial Officer, and Becky O'Brien, Budget and Planning presented this issue from the distributed materials.

3. Discussion of issues relating to agency compliance and enforcement policies and practices. Glenn Shankle, Acting Executive Director, and Matt Baker, Chairman of Compliance History Committee, presented this issue. Matt provided the Commissioners with an update of Compliance History Committee activities.

4. Consideration of and update on the implementation status of the Texas Emissions Reduction Plan (TERP), the use of future TERP funding, and other issues regarding the TERP incentive programs. Randy Wood, Deputy Director, Office of Environmental Planning Analysis and Assessment, Steve Dayton, TERP, and Lynne Haase, Air Quality Planning Grants Section, presented this issue. Staff presented options to the Commission on different TERP fund allocation strategies as noted in the backup materials. The Commissioners directed staff to further develop options based on Option 2d. Additionally, staff asked should the Commission place a limit on the maximum cost effectiveness of projects considered in FY 2005 in terms of cost per ton. The Commissioners indicated that some limit may be necessary and directed staff to continue to look at those options. No final direction was given to staff.
