

**ALTERNATE CONTROL REQUIREMENTS UNDER TITLE 30
TEXAS ADMINISTRATIVE CODE, SECTION 115.613**

3M COMPANY

PROVISIONS

1. The Alternate Control Requirements granted herein, as allowed in Title 30 Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 115, Subchapter G, §115.613(c), shall apply only to 3M Company (the Applicant) aerosol household adhesives, “90 High Strength Adhesive” and “Mopar Spray Adhesive” (the Products) with the formulations specified in the Application. The Application is defined as the Applicant’s submittal to the executive director of the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission dated February 12, 1996, and subsequent revisions of March 6, 1996, and June 14, 1996.
2. The Products may be sold, supplied, offered for sale, distributed, or manufactured for use in the State of Texas for the period commencing on the date of the issuance of the Alternate Control Requirements and continuing through June 30, 1997, subject to the Alternate Control Requirements specified herein.
3. The Products shall be sold only under the labels in Attachment A. No other products shall be sold in the State of Texas under such labels.
4. The Applicant shall take all necessary steps, including working with distributors and retailers, to assure that noncomplying products are not sold, supplied, offered for sale, distributed, or manufactured for use in the State of Texas after June 30, 1997.
5. The Applicant shall diligently pursue the Compliance Plan in Attachment B. The Alternate Control Requirements granted herein shall cease to be effective immediately upon failure of the Applicant to substantially complete any step at the date specified and as detailed in the Compliance Plan, or when the Applicant ceases pursuing any step of the Compliance Plan.
6. The Applicant shall file quarterly written reports with the executive director on their progress toward achieving compliance (Progress Reports) no later than five days after each of the following dates: September 30, 1996, and December 31, 1996. The executive director may modify or revoke the Alternate Control Requirements after reviewing any Progress Report.
7. The Applicant shall notify the executive director in writing within 30 days if the Applicant learns that information submitted to the executive director has changed in a manner which could modify the basis of the executive director’s approval of the Alternate Control Requirements. Upon receipt of such notice from the Applicant, the executive director may revoke or alter the Alternate Control Requirements granted herein.
8. The Alternate Control Requirements granted herein shall cease to be effective immediately, if for any reason the Applicant fails to give any notice, furnish any document, report, information, or perform any other action in the manner or at the time specified herein.

COMPLIANCE PLAN

TIME	ACTION
End of 2nd Quarter 1996	Provide one can of product to 25-30 users in California for testing.
End of 3rd Quarter 1996	Complete trial manufacture. Supply original field test users with one can for reevaluation.
End of 4th Quarter	Complete the first product run to provide material for test scale in Texas. Stock material in 3M Distribution Center.
January 1, 1997	Begin test sell in Texas.
April 1, 1997	Cease sale of old product from Distribution Center.
June 15, 1997	Take all reasonable steps necessary to make sure old product is off retail shelves in Texas by June 30, 1997.

MOPAR SPRAY ADHESIVE
COMPLIANCE PLAN

TIME	ACTION
End of 2nd Quarter 1996	Provide one can of product to 35-40 users in California. The product tested will be below 75% volatile organic compounds.
End of 3rd Quarter 1996	Complete production scaleup and produce first lot of material. If formula is changed because of field evaluation above, new formula will be resampled to the same end users.
End of 4th Quarter	Complete the first product run to provide material for test scale in Texas. Stock material in 3M Distribution Center.
January 1, 1997	Begin test sell in Texas.
April 1, 1997	Cease sale of old product from Distribution Center.
June 15, 1997	Take all reasonable steps necessary to make sure old product is off retail shelves in Texas by June 30, 1997.
