

# FEDERAL OPERATING PERMIT

## AIR CURTAIN INCINERATOR

### GENERAL OPERATING PERMIT

This general operating permit is issued in accordance with and subject to the Texas Clean Air Act (TCAA), Chapter 382 of the Texas Health and Safety Code and Title 30 Texas Administrative Code (30 TAC) Chapter 122, Federal Operating Permits Program. Owners or operators of sites that qualify for this general operating permit may submit an application to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for an authorization to operate under this general operating permit.


This general operating permit does not relieve the permit holder from the responsibility of obtaining preconstruction authorization for new or modified facilities in accordance with 30 TAC Chapter 116, Control of Air Pollution by Permits for New Construction or Modification.

The permit holder shall comply with all applicable terms and conditions codified in this general operating permit. Additionally, the permit holder shall comply with any other applicable rules, regulations, orders of the commission, or of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Any noncompliance with either the permit terms and conditions or the provisional terms and conditions, if any, constitutes a violation of the Federal Clean Air Act and the TCAA and may be grounds for enforcement action. It shall not be a defense in an enforcement action that it would have been necessary to halt or reduce the permitted activity in order to comply with the permit terms and conditions of this general operating permit.

The permit holder need not comply with terms and conditions codified in this general operating permit that have been replaced by provisional terms and conditions before the granting of a new authorization to operate under this general operating permit. A copy of this general operating permit, the permit application, and the authorization to operate shall be maintained at the location specified in the authorization to operate.
