Chemical Compliance

- Sampling

17,767 Chemical Compliance samples were collected during the third quarter by our sample contractor. 40,898 samples and 82,682 chemical results were migrated from the laboratory.

- **MCL Violations**

120 MCL Violations were issued during the third quarter for DBPs, inorganic chemicals, and radionuclides. Data is still being reported and this number will increase.

- **Monitoring and Reporting (M&R) Violations**

We are preparing to send M&R notice of violation letters in the coming weeks. Systems should ensure that all data is submitted to the TCEQ on a timely basis. If you have questions related to M&R compliance please contact Amy-Jean Katterjohn at 512-239-6141.

- **Consumer Confidence Reports (CCR)**

This year we fully implemented the CCR Generator which facilitated a 30% increase in compliance with distribution and submission of CCRs.

Keep an eye out for significant changes to the CCR web pages that should make it easier still for systems to prepare their CCRs.

- **Disinfectant Level Quarterly Operating Report (DLQOR)**

We are preparing to send monitoring and reporting violations to systems that have not submitted their reports. At this time 528 potential violations have been identified for the first quarter 2013 and approximately 550 for the second quarter.

Microbiological Compliance

- **Total Coliform Rule**

71,222 routine and repeat samples were received during third quarter 2013.

58 MCL violations were issued, 4 of which were acute, during the third quarter 2013.

502 M&R violations were issued during the third quarter 2013

- **Ground Water Rule**

3675 raw water samples were received electronically during the third quarter 2013

Surface Water Treatment Rule Compliance

- Treatment Technique Violations for calendar quarter three.
 - One violation for low disinfectant residual entering the distribution system for more than four consecutive hours
 - One violation for combined filter effluent turbidity above 1.0 NTU at a treatment plant
 - Five violations for Combined filter effluent above 0.3 NTU in more than 5% of readings for a month
 - Seven violations for Low Concentration Time (disinfection) for more than four consecutive hours.

Drought

- **1,226** public water systems (PWSs) asking customers to follow outdoor water use restrictions.
 - Of these systems, **783** are asking customers to follow a mandatory watering schedule and
 - **443** are asking customers to follow a voluntary watering schedule.
- Seasonal forecasts continue to predict the drought to persist or intensify in many areas of the state. Increasing demands are resulting in more water systems implementing the water-rationing stages of their Drought Contingency Plans.

NEW – Since Nov 2011 (Fort Bend and Harris Counties) - The WSD has received 4 submittals from systems. Of the 4 submittals WSD has approved 4 EPPs.

HB 805 (Fort Bend County and New Systems in Harris County) - The WSD has received 173 submittals from systems. Of the 173 submittals WSD has approved 162 EPPs and 2 Financial Waivers.

SB 361 (Harris County) - The WSD has received 682 submittals from systems. Of the 682 submittals WSD has approved 631 EPPs and 52 Financial Waivers.
