Re: Priority Call Rescinded in the Brazos River Basin

Dear Water Right Holder:

On July 2, 2013, I issued an order suspending or adjusting junior water right holders with a priority date of February 15, 1942 or later below Lake Possum Kingdom in the Brazos River Basin. I issued this order in response to a senior priority call from Dow Chemical Company (Dow) received on June 26, 2013.

On October 8, 2013, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) received an email from Dow notifying the TCEQ that it was rescinding its priority call. In accordance with its terms, the July 2<sup>nd</sup> Order automatically terminated when TCEQ received Dow's notification. Because the senior call has been rescinded and the order is no longer in effect, junior water right holders can store and divert water again according to the terms of their permits. Please note that should another priority call be made, adjustments or suspensions of junior water rights may again be necessary.

In recognition of drought conditions, all water right holders should continue to take actions necessary to conserve water and encourage your customers, if any, to do the same. If applicable, we recommend that you continue to implement your drought contingency plan (DCP). In accordance with your DCP, you are required to notify TCEQ when there are changes in your drought response stages. You may notify the agency by using the online form available on the TCEQ drought page referenced above.
