Mandatory Public Notification Language

Notice of Drinking Water THALLIUM Violation

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has notified the water system that the drinking water being supplied to customers had exceeded the Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) for THALLIUM. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) has established the MCL for THALLIUM at 0.002 mg/L, and has determined that it is a health concern at levels above the MCL. Analysis of drinking water in your community for THALLIUM indicates a level of mg/L.

Some people who drink water containing thallium in excess of the MCL over many years could experience hair loss, changes in their blood, or problems with their kidneys, intestine, or liver.

You do not need to use an alternative water supply. However, if you have health concerns, you may want to talk to your doctor to get more information about how this may affect you.
