

Mandatory Public Notification Language

Notice of a Routine Monitoring Violation for Chlorite

(1) failed to collect the required daily samples for chlorite monitoring of the water entering the distribution system on (2). This monitoring is required by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality's "Drinking Water Standards" and the federal "Safe Drinking Water Act," Public Law 95-523. Failure to monitor or monitoring inadequately makes it impossible to know if there is chlorite in excess of the maximum contaminant level (MCL) requirement of 1.0 mg/l (ppm). Our water system is required to take one sample each day of the water entering the distribution system. Failure to collect all required chlorite samples is a violation of the monitoring requirements and we are required to notify you of this violation.
