## **Requested Commission Action:**

Staff requests Commission approval for the appointment of three nominees to the Irrigator Advisory Council (Council) to replace three members terms that expired on February 1, 2021 and to extend the existence of the Council until February 1, 2027 (*See* 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §5.2 and §344.80(e)). The three nominees are James "Jimmy" Burgdorf (irrigator), James Garvin (irrigator), and Mark Peterson (public member). Once approved, these three nominees will each serve a six-year term expiring on February 1, 2027.

## Council Background:

The Council is established under Texas Occupations Code, Subchapter D, §§1903.151 - 1903.159. The Council coordinates its advice to the Commission on matters relating to landscape irrigation through the Program Support and Environmental Assistance Division's Program Support Section (PSS) Landscape Irrigation Program (*See* 30 TAC §5.14(b)). The nine-member Council has six members who represent licensed irrigators and three members who represent the public. Members should reflect diverse geographic areas of the state, ethnic groups, businesses, government entities, and trade associations (*See* 30 TAC §5.2(2)).

## **Selection Process:**

On February 1, 2021, members' terms expired and created three vacancies on the Council. Two of these vacancies must be filled by licensed irrigators and the remaining vacancy must be filled by a member who represents the public. PSS initiated the process to fill these vacancies by soliciting nominations through a notice sent through the irrigation listservs, publication in the October 30, 2020, issue of the *Texas Register* (45 TexReg 7746), and correspondence to various trade associations and individuals. PSS received nine nominations to fill the three vacancies. For the two irrigator vacancies, PSS considered the professional experience, industry knowledge, subject matter expertise, experience with the Irrigator Advisory Council, and geographical representation of each nominee. For the public member, PSS considered the technical background and knowledge of landscape irrigation of each nominee who met the eligibility criteria (*See* Texas Occupations Code, §1903.152). Based on these criteria, PSS recommends the following individuals to fill the vacancies: James "Jimmy" Burgdorf, James Garvin, and Mark A. Peterson.

#### SUBCHAPTER D. IRRIGATOR ADVISORY COUNCIL

Sec. 1903.151. COUNCIL MEMBERSHIP. (a) The Irrigator Advisory Council consists of nine members appointed by the commission as follows:

(1) six members who are irrigators, residents of this state, experienced in the irrigation business, and familiar with irrigation methods and techniques; and

(2) three public members.

(b) Appointments to the council shall be made without regard to the race, creed, sex, religion, or national origin of the appointee.

Sec. 1903.152. ELIGIBILITY OF PUBLIC MEMBERS. A person is not eligible for appointment as a public member of the council if the person or the person's spouse:

(1) is licensed by an occupational regulatory agency in the field of irrigation; or

(2) is employed by, participates in the management of, or has, other than as a consumer, a financial interest in a business entity or other organization related to the field of irrigation.

Sec. 1903.158. PER DIEM; REIMBURSEMENT. A council member is entitled to a per diem as set by legislative appropriation for each day the member engages in the business of the council. A council member is entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses, including expenses for meals and lodging, as prescribed by the General Appropriations Act.

TCEQ Regional Map of IAC Current Members and Recommended Nominees



**WHEREAS,** Texas Water Code, §5.107 provides the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (Commission) with the authority to create and consult with the Irrigator Advisory Council (Council); and

WHEREAS, the Regular Session of the 73rd Legislature (1993) adopted Senate Bill 383, subsequently codified as Texas Government Code, Chapter 2110; and

WHEREAS, the Commission advisory committees are subject to the Commission's rules regarding such committees pursuant to 30 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 5. The Council's sole duty is to advise the Commission. The Council has no executive or administrative powers with respect to the operation of the Commission, and all such powers and duties rest solely with the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Commission issued and adopted a resolution on March 31, 2021, continuing the existence of the Council until February 1, 2027; and

**WHEREAS,** the terms of the following Council members will expire on February 1, 2021: Micah Reed, Philip Hathaway, and Brooke Furrh; and

**WHEREAS,** the Commission finds that there is need to continue the existence of the Council until February 1, 2027.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY, that the following persons be appointed to fill the vacancies on the Irrigator Advisory Council, with their terms to expire accordingly:

James "Jimmy" Burgdorf, whose term shall be effective March 31, 2021 for a six-year term to expire February 1, 2027; and

James Garvin, whose term shall be effective March 31, 2021 for a six-year term to expire February 1, 2027; and

Mark A. Peterson, whose term shall be effective March 31, 2021 for a six-year term to expire February 1, 2027; and

**BE IT RESOLVED FURTHER,** that the Commission has established the Irrigator Advisory Council, which will continue in existence until February 1, 2027. The Irrigator Advisory Council shall continue to function through the Program Support Section to advise the Commission on matters related to landscape irrigation.
