from the 83rd Legislature, 2013, Regular Session, relating to structures that have rainwater harvesting systems (RWHS) and are connected to a public water system (PWS). The adopted rulemaking would amend Section 290.44(j) and its subdivisions to: remove the phrase "for indoor use" from Section 290.44(j); amend Section 290.44(j) (1) to require that a privately owned RWHS with a capacity of more than 500 gallons that is connected to a PWS for a back-up supply must have a backflow prevention assembly or an air gap at the storage facility for the harvested rainwater; remove the word "indoor" from the phrase "for indoor potable purposes" in Section 290.44(j) (2); remove the phrase "for use for potable purposes" from renumbered Section 290.44(j) (3) (existing Section 290.44(j) (1)); and add Section 290.44(j) (4) to require that the PWS used as a back-up supply for the RWHS may be connected only to the water storage tank and may not be connected to the plumbing of a structure.
