Consideration of whether to affirm, modify, or set aside the Emergency Order issued by the Executive Director (ED) on April 15, 2014, under Tex. Water Code §§ 11.148 and 5.506 to the Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA). The ED's Emergency Order grants LCRA's request for an emergency order by partially suspending a requirement of its 2010 Water Management Plan (WMP), Permit No. 5838 to maintain a minimum streamflow of 500 cubic feet per second (cfs) for six weeks in between March and May from Bastrop to Eagle Lake for the Blue Sucker. Specifically, the Emergency Order reduces the minimum streamflow requirement to 300 cfs. Without the Emergency Order this requirement could necessitate a release of stored water of approximately 21,000 acre feet (AF) by the end of May 2014. By granting LCRA's requested relief, the Emergency Order will prevent approximately 17,000 AF from being released from Lakes Buchanan and Travis. LCRA has the right to divert and use up to 1.5 million acre feet from Lakes Buchanan and Travis, in Travis, Llano, and Burnet Counties, Texas, under Certificates of Adjudication Nos. 14-5478 and 14-5482. These certificates require LCRA to develop the WMP, Permit No. 5838, which provides how LCRA makes water available from these lakes to help meet "firm" water customer needs, downstream interruptible irrigation demands, and environmental flow needs of Matagorda Bay and the Lower Colorado River. Written public comment may be filed with the Office of the Chief Clerk through 5:00 p.m. Tuesday, April 29, 2014. The Commission will not accept additional public comment at the hearing.
