Consideration of the adoption of amended Sections 101.300, 101.302 – 101.304, 101.306, 101.370, 101.372 - 101.374, and 101.376 of 30 TAC Chapter 101, General Air Quality Rules, and corresponding revisions to the state implementation plan (SIP). The adoption would revise the Emissions Reduction Credit and Discrete Emissions Reduction Credit Programs to address implementation issues that were identified with the generation of emissions credits from area and mobile sources. The revisions include: identifying types of area and mobile sources that are eligible to generate credits; defining the eligible SIP emissions for credit generation projects; extending the application deadline to generate credits from mobile sources; defining the years used to determine the historical adjusted emissions for area and mobile sources; specifying the procedure for adjusting the credits issued for an individual mobile source based on its remaining useful life; reducing the amount of credits issued for an individual source based on the quality of the data used to determine the emissions; providing additional means to specify monitoring, testing, recordkeeping, and reporting requirements and to make the emission reduction permanent and federally enforceable; and various revisions providing greater flexibility for the generation and use
