2019, Regular Session, which requires rulemaking to revise the title of Chapter 18 from Rollback Relief for Pollution Control Requirements to Voter-Approval Tax Rate Relief for Pollution Control Requirements. Finally, the rulemaking adoption will fulfill the commission's statutory and regulatory requirements to review and update the property included on the Chapters 17 and 18 Expedited Review Lists (ERL) and Tier I Tables.
