Item 1. PRESENTATION OF EMPLOYEE SUGGESTION AND AWARD.

HILARY JOHNS NAMED

Item 2. APPLICATION BY A.J. HOUTSMA DBA A.J. HOUTSMA & SON for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 03158) to authorize disposal of waste and wastewater from a dairy which consists of a maximum of 550 milking head and 140 dry cows. Washdown water, flushwater and stormwater will be retained in six lagoons, where it will subsequently be used to irrigate 90 acres of coastal bermuda. Manure/solids will be disposed of as fertilizer on 95 acres on-site and 362 acres off of Hico Highway which is owned by the permittee. No discharge of pollutants into the waters of the State is authorized by this permit. The dairy is approximately 3 1/2 miles southwest of Stephenville and 1 mile off of State Highway 377 on an unnamed county road in Erath County, Texas. This location is in the drainage area of the North Bosque River in Segment No. 1226 of the Brazos River Basin.

Item 3. APPLICATION BY J.M. HOWLE, JR. AND ALLENE HOWLE for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 03154) to authorize disposal of waste and wastewater from a dairy which consists of a maximum of 750 milking head and 190 dry cows. Washdown water, flushwater and stormwater will be retained in two lagoons, where it will subsequently be used for irrigation on 90 acres of coastal bermuda. Manure/solids will be disposed of as fertilizer on 140 acres of sorghum, 283 acres of coastal bermuda and 100 acres of pastureland on-site. No discharge of pollutants into the waters of the State is authorized by this permit. The dairy is approximately 5 miles west of Stephenville, off of State Highway 8 on an unnamed county road in Erath County, Texas. This location is in the drainage area of the North Bosque River in Segment No. 1226 of the Brazos River Basin.

Item 4. APPLICATION BY HENK KENKHUIS for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 03163) to authorize disposal of waste and wastewater from a dairy which consists of 460 milking head in the interim I phase and 900 milking head in the final phase. Washdown water, flushwater and stormwater will be retained in three containment ponds, where it will subsequently be used to irrigate 82 acres of silage. Manure/solids will be disposed of as fertilizer on 190 acres of pasture and coastal hay. No discharge of pollutants into the waters of the State is authorized by this permit. The dairy is approximately nine miles southeast of Dublin and 1.25 miles south of the

intersection of Highway 219 and Pecan Cemetery Road in Comanche and Erath Counties, Texas. This location is in the drainage area of the Leon River below Proctor Lake in Segment No. 1221 of the Brazos River Basin.

Item 5. APPLICATION BY MONTAGUE COUNTY for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 13513-01) to authorize a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 6,000 gallons per day. The proposed wastewater treatment facilities will serve the county courthouse and jail facility. The plant site is approximately one block south and three blocks east of the intersection of State Highway 59 and State Highway 175 in the City of Montague, Montague County, Texas. The effluent is discharged into a roadside drainage ditch; thence to unnamed tributary of Ritchie Creek; thence to Ritchie Creek; thence to Salt Creek in Segment No. 0204 of the Red River Basin.

Item 6. CITY OF MIDLAND for an amendment to Permit No. 10223-01 to authorize an increase in the amount of irrigated non-public accessible land at irrigation site 2 from 2500 acres to 3100 acres and to authorize the use of treated effluent in livestock watering tanks. The permit authorizes disposal of treated domestic wastewater effluent by irrigation. The disposal volume is not to exceed an average of 15,000,000 gallons per day. Application rates for the irrigated land shall not exceed 4.8 acre-feet/acre/year. No discharge of pollutants into waters in the State is authorized by this permit. The plant site is immediately southeast of the intersection of Interstate Highway 20 and State Highway 307 in Midland County, Texas. The non-public access irrigation facilities consist of two sites. Irrigation site 1 consists of storage lagoons and 2,950 acres of farm land located approximately 7,000 feet southeast of the intersection of Interstate Highway 20 and State Highway 307, and irrigation site 2 consists of irrigation storage lagoons and approximately 3,100 acres of land located approximately 16 miles east of the City of Midland in Sections 2, 3, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, and 15, Block 37, TWP 3-S of the T & P Railroad Company Survey. The public access irrigation lands are located at the Hogan Municipal Golf Course and the Midland Country Club Golf Course. The plant site and irrigated lands are located in the drainage area of the Colorado River in Segment No. 1412 of the Colorado River Basin.

Item 7. APPLICATION BY SOLUTION ENGINEERING, INC. AND BASIC RESOURCES, INC. for a minor amendment to transfer Permit No. UR02157 from Solution Engineering, Inc. and Basic Resources, Inc. to the TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, Bureau of Radiation Control, 1100 West 49th Street, Austin, Texas 78756-3189. Permit No UR02157 was issued to Solution Engineering and Basic Resources in connection with the Falls City Mining Project which has now been terminated and closure operations have been conducted. This property is eligible for remedial action by the United States Department of Energy under the Uranium Mill Tailings Radiation Control Act of 1978, but must be acquired by the State of Texas as a condition prior to such remedial action. The Department of Health proposes to acquire said property for

this purpose. This permit does not authorize surface discharge or mining. The Falls City mill site and tailings pile are located on a site approximately 10 miles southwest of Falls City, Karnes County, Texas.

Item 8. APPLICATION BY TEXAS PARKS AND WILDLIFE DEPARTMENT for a minor amendment to Permit No. 11503-01 in order to add an interim phase to decrease the volume of treated domestic wastewater effluent to conform with the approved plans and specifications of the existing plant. The permit currently authorizes a disposal volume not to exceed an average of 20,000 gallons per day which will be retained as the final flow. The interim volume shall not exceed an average of 10,000 gallons per day. Treated wastewater is disposed of on 18 acres of pasture and wooded land. Application rates for the irrigated land shall not exceed 2.2 acre-feet/acre/year. No discharge of pollutants into the waters of the State is authorized by this permit. The plant site and irrigation site are approximately 16 miles south of the City of Caldwell and adjacent to Park Road 57, at a point about 9 miles south of the intersection of Farm to Market Road 976 and State Highway 36 in Burleson County, Texas. The plant site and irrigation area are in the drainage area of Somerville Lake in Segment No. 1212 of the Brazos River Basin.

CITY OF ARCHER CITY for renewal of Permit No. 10393-02 which authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 165,000 gallons per day. The wastewater treatment facilities are approximately 3/4 mile northeast of the intersection of State Highway 25 and State Highway 79 in Archer County, Texas. The effluent is discharged into an unnamed tributary of the Little Wichita River; thence to the Little Wichita River; thence into Lake Arrowhead in Segment No. 0212 of the Red River Basin. The Executive Director of the Texas Water Commission has prepared a draft permit which, if approved by the Commission, will specify conditions and limitations generally the same as those currently enforced by the existing permit. It is proposed that the expiration date of the renewed permit be specified as midnight, five years after date of Commission approval.

Item 10. APPLICATION BY CHARTERWOOD MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT for renewal of Permit No. 11410-02 which authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent in phases with the final phase being a volume not to exceed an average flow of 1,000,000 gallons per day. The wastewater treatment facilities are approximately 3.5 miles northwest of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Road 149 (West Montgomery Road) and Farm-to-Market Road 1960, on the south bank of Pillot Gully, at 15820 Quill Drive in the City of Houston, Harris County, Texas. The effluent is discharged into Pillot Gully; thence to Cypress Creek in Segment No. 1009 of the San Jacinto River Basin. The Executive Director of the Texas Water Commission has prepared a draft permit which, if approved by the Commission, will specify conditions and limitations generally the same as those currently enforced by the existing permit except that the final flow has been decreased to an

average of 600,000 gallons per day. It is proposed that the expiration date of the renewed permit be specified as midnight, five years after date of Commission approval.

Item 11. APPLICATION BY CITY OF GRUVER for renewal of Permit No. 10751-01 which authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 200,000 gallons per day. The wastewater treatment facilities are approximately 0.8 mile east of State Highway 136 and approximately 0.6 mile west of State Highway 15, southeast of the City of Gruver in Hansford County, Texas. The effluent is discharged into Farwell Creek; thence to Palo Duro Creek; thence into the State of Oklahoma in Segment No. 0100 of the Canadian River Basin. The Executive Director of the Texas Water Commission has prepared a draft permit which, if approved by the Commission, will specify conditions and limitations generally the same as those currently enforced by the existing permit. The wastewater treatment facilities are approximately 3,100 feet north of Spears Road and approximately 5,300 feet northeast of the intersection of Spears Road and Walters Road South in northern Harris County,

The effluent is discharged via pipeline to the Jacintoport Slip; thence to the Houston Ship Channel in Segment No. 1006 of the San Jacinto River Basin.

Wastes managed at the facility are typically spent industrial solvents and degreasers generated from on-site and off-site sources and are ignitable, toxic, and EP toxic wastes. The facility is on the northeast side of Idalou Road, 1.1 miles northeast of the intersection of Idalou Road (aka U.S. 62) and Loop 289, Lubbock, Lubbock County, Texas. This location is in the drainage area of Segment 1240 of the Brazos River Basin (north latitude 33°36'42", west longitude 101°46'49").
