Item 1. Consideration of an application by CROWN CENTRAL PETROLEUM CORPORATION for a Class 2 Modification to hazardous waste Permit No. HW-50112-000 in accordance with 31 TAC Section 305.69. The applicant operates a Class I hazardous waste facility for on-site storage and processing of wastes generated from refinery operations. The facility is located on an 170-acre tract of land along the southern boundary of the Houston Ship Channel, immediately east of the Washburn Tunnel, approximately 0.5 mile north of State Highway 225 in Pasadena, Harris County, Texas.

Item 2. Consideration of an application by NSSI/RECOVERY SERVICES, INC. for a Class 2 Modification to hazardous waste Permit No. HW50269 in accordance with 31 TAC Section 305.69. The applicant operates a hazardous waste management facility which is located at 5711 Esteridge in the City of Houston, Harris County, Texas.

Item 8. APPLICATION BY CLIFTON ALEXANDER DBA ALEXANDERS' SWISS FARM for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 03347) to authorize disposal of wastes and wastewater from a dairy. The dairy will consist of a maximum of 350 head. The dairy is approximately 6.8 miles southwest of the intersection of State Highway 19 and Interstate Highway 30; 2.0 miles north of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Road 3389 and Farm-to-Market Road 1567; on the west side of Farm-to-Market Road 3389, in Hopkins County, Texas.

Item 9. APPLICATION BY BYRON CORY dba Acienda Truck Wash for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 03372) to authorize the disposal of filter backwash from a commercial truck washing facility by either recycling/reusing or by evaporation. The wastewater is treated and 80% is recycled with the balance being directed to the evaporation pond for disposal. The volume of treated effluent to be disposed of in the evaporation pond is estimated to be 1,000 gallons per day. The facility is two miles east of the City of El Paso and two blocks south of Interstate Highway 10 at 1111 Horizon Boulevard, El Paso County, Texas.

Item 10. APPLICATION BY CITY OF EAGLE PASS for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 10406-02) to authorize a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 6,000,000 gallons per day. The proposed permit will also authorize disposal of sludge on 200 acres of land adjacent to the treatment facility by spray irrigation. The plant site is to be on Farm-to-Market Road 1021, approximately 5 miles southeast of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Road 375 and Farm-to-Market Road 1021 in Maverick County, Texas.

Item 11. APPLICATION BY CITY OF EL CENIZO for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 13577-01) to authorize a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 200,000 gallons per day from the El Cenizo Wastewater Treatment Facilities. The plant site is approximately 3.5 miles west of the intersection of U.S. Highway 83 and Espejo Road on Espejo Road, approximately 1 mile west of Cadena

Street in Webb County, Texas.

Item 12. APPLICATION BY GLOBAL OCTANES CORPORATION for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 03375) to authorize a discharge of cooling tower blowdown, boiler blowdown and neutralized demineralizer regenerant wastewater at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 250,000 gallons per day plus flow variable discharges of uncontaminated stormwater. The plant site is at 2621 Tidal Road in the City of Deer Park, Harris County, Texas.

Item 13. APPLICATION BY OWEN SIEPERDA for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 03398) to authorize the disposal of wastes and wastewater from a dairy. The dairy will consist of a maximum of 700 milking head with a maximum of 1000 total. The dairy is on the west side of an unnamed county road; approximately 1 mile west of the Community of Live Oak; approximately 1.5 miles east of Farm-to-Market Road 1702; and approximately 4 miles south of the intersection of Farm-to-Market 1702 and Farm-to-Market Road 219 in Erath County, Texas.

Item 14. APPLICATION BY TED VAN LOON DBA TED VAN LOON DAIRY for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 03410) to authorize disposal of waste and wastewater from a dairy which consists of a maximum of 375 head. The dairy is located on the north side of an unnamed county road, approximately one mile east of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Road 1188 and Farm-to-Market Road 1189 in Erath County, Texas.

Item 15. APPLICATION BY CITY OF DENTON for an amendment to Permit No. 10027-03 to authorize an increase in the discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent from a volume not to exceed an average flow of 12,000,000 gallons per day to a volume not to exceed an average flow of 15,000,000 gallons per day from the wastewater treatment plant. The plant site is east of the City of Denton along Pecan Creek, approximately 5,700 feet east of State Highway 288 and approximately 2 miles upstream from Lake Lewisville in Denton County, Texas.

Item 16. APPLICATION BY HOLLY FARMS OF TEXAS, INC. for an amendment to Permit No. 02064 to authorize an increase in the discharge of treated process and domestic wastewater effluent from a volume not to exceed an average flow of 1,000,000 gallons per day to a volume not to exceed an average flow of 1,500,000 gallons per day. The facility is at 1019 Shelbyville Street in the City of Center, Shelby County, Texas.

Item 17. APPLICATION BY CITY OF PLEASANTON for an amendment to Permit No. 10598-01 to authorize an increase in the discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent from a volume not to exceed 680,000 gallons per day average to a volume not to exceed 980,000 gallons per day average. The proposed

amendment will also add provisions to dispose of treated effluent by lawn irrigation on four acres of land at the plant site with the volume not to exceed 10,000 gallons per day. The plant site is approximately 0.4 mile southeast of the intersection of U.S. Highway 281 and the Missouri Pacific Railroad and 0.5 mile northeast of the intersection of State Highway 97 and U.S. Highway 281 in the City of Pleasanton in Atascosa County, Texas.

Item 18. APPLICATION BY RISING SUN DAIRY for an amendment to Permit No. 03086 in order to increase the herd from a maximum of 990 milking head to a maximum of 1,300 milking head and 300 dry cows. The proposed amendment would also include all expansion projects which have been implemented. The dairy is on the east side of Saint George Road and approximately one mile southwest of the intersection of U.S. Highway 377 and Saint George Road in Erath County, Texas.

Item 19. APPLICATION BY ROHM AND HAAS TEXAS INCORPORATED for an amendment to Permit No. 00458 to authorize an increase in the discharge of treated process wastewaters, utility wastewaters and stormwater via Outfall 001 from a volume not to exceed an average flow of 4,320,000 gallons per day to a volume not to exceed an average flow of 5,760,000 gallons per day. The permit currently authorizes flow variable discharges of stormwater runoff via Outfalls 002 and 003 plus flow variable discharges of tank farm and nonprocess area stormwater runoff via Outfalls 004, 005 and 006, which will remain the same in the amended permit. The plant site is north of State Highway 225 and adjacent to Old Battleground Road in the City of Deer Park, Harris County, Texas.

Item 20. APPLICATION BY TEXAS EASTMAN COMPANY, DIVISION OF EASTMAN KODAK COMPANY for an amendment to Permit No. 00471 which currently authorizes a discharge of treated wastewater effluent via Outfalls 002 and 003 at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 9,920,000 gallons per day plus a flow variable discharge of stormwater runoff and process wastewaters via Outfall 001. The proposed amendment will increase the discharge of treated wastewater effluent via Outfalls 002, 003, 004 and 005 to a volume not to exceed an average flow of 15,900,000 gallons per day. Outfall 001 will continue to regulate the flow variable discharges. The plant site is five miles south of the City of Longview and south of Interstate Highway 20 and east of State Highway 149, Harrison County, Texas.

Item 21. APPLICATION BY CITY OF BAYTOWN for renewal of Permit No. 11774-01 which authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 300,000 gallons per day from the Pinehurst Wastewater Treatment Facilities. The plant site is at the intersection of Bayou Vista Drive and Bayou Woods in Baytown, approximately two miles south of Interstate Highway 10 in Chambers County, Texas. The renewed permit has changed the permit number to 10395-09 in order to conform to the City's other permits.

Item 22. APPLICATION BY CNP UTILITY DISTRICT for renewal of Permit No. 11239-01 which authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 2,500,000 gallons per day. The wastewater treatment facilities are on the south bank of Cypress Creek approximately 2,700 feet west of Interstate Highway 45 in Harris County, Texas.
