Item 1. APPLICATION BY GULF CHEMICAL AND METALLURGICAL CORP. for a permit (Proposed Permit No. HW50204-001) to authorize operation of a Class I industrial hazardous waste storage facility for wastes received from off-site sources. The facility is located on a 33-acre tract of company-owned land at 302 Midway Road in the City of Freeport, Brazoria County, Texas.

Item 2. APPLICATION BY MONSANTO COMPANY - Chocolate Bayou Complex for a minor amendment to Permit No. HW50189-000 in order to reduce the permitted landfill area for its Class I hazardous waste landfill and to modify landfill and monitoring system design. The permit authorizes operation of a regional Class I hazardous industrial waste storage, processing and disposal facility. The facility receives chemical manufacturing wastes from on-site and off-site sources. The Monsanto Chocolate Bayou Complex is located on approximately 3000 acres of land, approximately 7 miles southeast of the intersection of Texas State Route 35 and FM 2917 and approximately 14 miles southeast of Alvin, Brazoria County, Texas.

Item 3. APPLICATION BY ALLEN CANNING COMPANY for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 03385) to authorize a discharge of non-contact cooling water at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 50,000 gallons per day. The applicant operates a vegetable and fruit processing and canning plant. The plant site is at 200 East North Street in the City of Lindale, Smith County, Texas.

Item 4. APPLICATION BY LLANO ESTACADO WINERY, INC. for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 03433) to authorize the disposal of treated liquid wastes from a winery by evaporation. If the tank becomes full, the liquid will be applied to a four acre tract of land on-site. The facility is on Farm to Market Road 1585, 3.2 miles east of U.S. Highway 87 South, Lubbock County, Texas.

Item 5. APPLICATION BY CITY OF BUFFALO for an amendment to Permit No. 10022-01 to authorize the disposal of sludge by means of trench-fill landfilling on 1.6 acre of land adjacent to the wastewater treatment facility. The permit authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 222,000 gallons per day, which will remain the same. The wastewater treatment facilities are adjacent to and east of Marion Boulevard, approximately 3/4 mile north-northeast of the intersection of

U.S. Highways 75 and 79 in Leon County, Texas.

Item 6. APPLICATION BY WOODRIDGE LIMITED PARTNERSHIP for an amendment to Permit No. 13474-01 in order to authorize a variance in monitoring frequencies from once per week to once per month. The permit currently authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 4,000 gallons per day from the wastewater treatment facilities, which will remain the same. The plant site is approximately 1,600 feet southeast of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Road 134 and State Highway 43 in Harrison County, Texas.

APPLICATION BY BAYOU FOREST VILLAGE, INC. for renewal of Permit No. 12259-01 which authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 30,000 gallons per day from the Bayou Forrest Village Wastewater Treatment Facilities. The plant site is at 12500 Aldine-Westfield Road in Harris County, Texas.

Item 8. APPLICATION BY CITY OF CANADIAN for renewal of Permit No. 10072-01 which authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 240,000 gallons per day. The wastewater treatment facilities are northeast of Canadian, about one mile north of Farm-to-Market Road 2388 and 0.5 mile east of U.S. Highway 60, at the east end of the golf course and fairgrounds in Hemphill County, Texas.

Item 9. APPLICATION BY CITY OF CHILLICOTHE for renewal of Permit No. 10639-01 which authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 113,000 gallons per day. The wastewater treatment facilities are located approximately 2 miles north-northeast of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Roads 91 and 924, approximately 2.5 miles north of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Road 91 and U.S. Highway 287 in Hardeman County, Texas.

APPLICATION BY ROY CURLEE for renewal of Permit No. 11260-01 which authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 2,000 gallons per day. The wastewater treatment facilities are on a county road, approximately 3/4 mile north of Farm-to-Market Road 726, approximately 2-1/4 miles east of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Roads 726 and 1968 and on the south shoreline of Lake O'Pines in Marion County, Texas.

The renewed permit has decreased the flow to a volume not to exceed 1,450,000 gallons per day average. The wastewater treatment facilities are approximately 3500 feet east of the confluence of Spring Creek and Cypress Creek, and 9400 feet north of Farm-to-Market Road 1960 in Harris County, Texas.
