Item 1. APPLICATION BY GATX TERMINALS CORPORATION for a hazardous waste facility closure and post closure care permit (Proposed Permit No. HW50054-000) and compliance plan (Proposed No. CP50054) to authorize remediation of a closed facility which was used for the disposal of Class I hazardous and non-hazardous industrial solid wastes. The wastes which were managed at this facility prior to its being closed were hazardous industrial solid wastes including bottom sediment sludge from the treatment of wastewater, stormwater, tank water draws and chemical spill residues from on-site sources. The facility is located on a 455-acre tract of land at 906 Clinton Drive in Galena Park, Harris County, Texas. This location is in the drainage area of Segment No. 1007 of the San Jacinto River Basin.

Item 2. APPLICATION BY WALKER WOOD PRESERVING, INC. for a Class I hazardous industrial solid waste post-closure care permit (Proposed Permit No. HW-50308) and a compliance plan (Proposed Permit No. CP-50308) to authorize custodial and monitoring activities for a closed surface impoundment. The facility is located approximately 4 miles south of Livingston on a 28.5-acre tract of land which is approximately 1000 feet north of the northeast side of State Highway 146 at a point approximately one-half mile north of the intersection of State Highway 146 and Farm Road 1988, in an unincorporated portion of Polk County, Texas.

Item 3. APPLICATION BY WEST TRAVIS COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 3 & HENRY J. The disposal volume is not to exceed an average of 525,000 gallons per day. Application rates for the irrigated land are not to exceed 3.05 acre-feet/acre/year. The wastewater treatment facility is located approximately 1,000 feet north of Farm-to-Market Road 2244; approximately 3,000 feet east of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Road 2244 and State Highway 71. The storage pond and irrigation site are located approximately 8,000 feet northwest of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Road 620 and State Highway 71 in Travis County, Texas.

Item 4. APPLICATION BY CHEMICAL WASTE MANAGEMENT, INC. for an amendment to Permit No. 02417 in order make changes to the

stormwater management system because the Above Grade Landfill Site 02 is to be constructed where the current stormwater ponds are located. The permit is amended to authorize stormwater discharge from the Below Grade Landfill Site 02 and the Above Grade Landfill Site 02 through Outfall 001. The applicant operates a hazardous waste landfill, disposal, and incinerator facility. The plant is south of State Highway 73 and approximately 3.5 miles southwest of State Highway 73 - Taylor Bayou Crossing in Jefferson County, Texas.

Item 5. APPLICATION BY CITY OF KIRBYVILLE for an amendment to Permit No. 10202-03 to authorize an increase in the discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent from a volume not to exceed an average flow of 460,000 gallons per day to a volume not to exceed an average flow of 930,000 gallons per day. The wastewater treatment facilities are approximately 3/4 mile east of the intersection of U.S. Highway 96 and Main Street in the City of Kirbyville in Jasper County, Texas.

The wastewater treatment facilities are approximately 0.5 mile southeast of the intersection of State Highway 77 and State Highway 338 in Morris County, Texas.

APPLICATION BY TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE-INSTITUTIONAL DIVISION for an amendment to Permit No. 02952 to authorize an increase in the discharge of treated vegetable wash-water, retort water, non-contact cooling water and washdown water from a volume not to exceed an average flow of 200,000 gallons per day to a volume not to exceed an average flow of 250,000 gallons per day via Outfall 001 during Phase II. The discharge point for Phase II will be rerouted to an unnamed lake locally known as Horseshoe Lake. The permit currently authorizes the discharge of noncontact cooling water at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 200,000 gallons per day directly to Oyster Creek. The applicant operates a cannery where vegetables are processed and canned. The plant site is on the east bank of Oyster Creek along FM 655, approximately 9 miles northwest of the City if Angleton in Brazoria County, Texas.

Item 8. APPLICATION BY CITY OF ROBSTOWN for a minor amendment to Permit No. 10261-01 to add Interim I & II phases with an average flow volume not to exceed 2,400,000 gallons per day. The current permit authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 3,000,000 gallons per day from the wastewater treatment plant, which will remain the same. The plant site is adjacent to and just east of U.S. Highway 77, approximately 0.5 miles northeast of the intersection of U.S. Highway 77 and State Highway 44 in Nueces County, Texas.

APPLICATION BY BERWIND RAILWAY SERVICE COMPANY for renewal of Permit No. 12390-001 which authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 5,000 gallons per day. The wastewater treatment facilities are located approximately 1000 feet south of Farm-to-Market Road 1998, approximately 3500 feet east of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Roads 1998 and 2199 in Harrison County, Texas.

The wastewater treatment facilities are located approximately 800 feet north and 5000 feet east of the intersection of Trammel Fresno Road and State Highway 6 in Fort Bend County, Texas.
