Item 1. APPLICATION BY AQUILA REALITY FUND I, INC. for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 13617-01) to authorize a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 4,100 gallons per day. The proposed wastewater treatment facilities will serve four small industrial warehouses. The plant site is approximately one mile north of the intersection of Greens Road and Spears Road; approximately 1,300 feet west of the intersection of Spears Road and Hugh Road in Harris County, Texas.

Item 2. APPLICATION BY SAM ELLIOTT for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 03509) to authorize the disposal of wastes and wastewater from a cattle feedlot. The cattle feedlot will consist of a maximum of 2,600 head. Wastewater will be retained in one (1) storage pond. Wastewater from the pond is to be disposed of by irrigation on agricultural land. Manure and/or solids are to be applied as fertilizer on agricultural land. The cattle feedlot is on the south side of Farm-to-Market Road 1912, approximately one mile east of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Road 1912 and State Highway 136 in Potter County, Texas.

REMANDED TO OFFICE OF HEARINGS EXAMINERS, PG/PR

Item 3. APPLICATION BY THE FISH POND, INC. for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 13601-01) to authorize a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 8,500 gallons per day. The plant site is on Highway 75, approximately 0.7 mile north of the intersection of Highway 75 and Sheppard Hill Road in Montgomery County, Texas.

Item 4. APPLICATION BY FRANK NIESCHWIETZ ENTERPRISES, INC. for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 03465) to authorize intermittent flow variable discharges of stormwater runoff. The applicant operates a chemical fertilizer and herbicide storage and distribution facility. The plant site is on Hugo Street, approximately 500 feet north of the intersection of Menger Street and U. S. Highway 181 in Falls City, Karnes County, Texas.

Item 5. APPLICATION BY MONTECARLO, INC. for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 03470) to authorize the disposal of wastes and wastewater from a feedlot. The feedlot will consist of a maximum of

3,000 head. Wastewater will be retained in one (1) storage pond. Wastewater from the pond is to be disposed of by evaporation and/or irrigation of agricultural land. Manure and/or solids are to be applied as fertilizer on agricultural land. The feedlot is on the east side of Farm-to-Market Road 119 approximately four miles north of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Road 119 and Farm-to-Market Road 1573 in Sherman County, Texas.

Item 6. APPLICATION BY TEXAS PARADISE POINT, INC. for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 13629-01) to authorize a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 24,000 gallons per day. The proposed wastewater treatment facilities will serve a development for R.V.'s and small mobile homes. The plant site is on the north side of Longstreet near the entrance to San Jo Cove, approximately 3 1/2 miles west of the intersection of Longstreet and Interstate Highway 45 in Montgomery County, Texas.

Item 7. APPLICATION BY GREEN TRAILS MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT for an amendment to Permit No. 12289-01 to authorize an increase in the discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent from a volume not to exceed an average flow of 800,000 gallons per day to a volume not to exceed an average flow of 990,000 gallons per day. The plant site is on the north bank of Mason Creek, approximately two miles south of Interstate Highway 10, between Baker and Fry Roads in Harris County, Texas.

Item 8. APPLICATION BY NOR-SHAM INCORPORATED for an amendment to Permit No. 10980-01 to authorize an increase in the discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent from a volume not to exceed an average flow of 20,000 gallons per day to a volume not to exceed an average flow of 50,000 gallons per day. The Best Western Intercontinental Airport Wastewater Treatment Facilities are approximately 2,600 feet west of the intersection of U.S. Highway 59 and Will Clayton Parkway in Harris County, Texas.

Item 9. APPLICATION BY BAYOU COGENERATION PLANT for renewal of Permit No. 02915 which authorizes a discharge of stormwater at a volume variable with rainfall from a Cogeneration (Steam and Electric Power Production) Plant. The plant site is at 11777 Bay Area Boulevard in the City of Pasadena, Harris County, Texas.

RENEWED, PG/PR

Item 10. APPLICATION BY BIG THREE INDUSTRIAL GAS, INC. for renewal of Permit No. 01954 which authorizes a discharge of commingled cooling tower blowdown, wash water, floor drains and domestic wastewater at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 230,000 gallons per day from an air separation plant. The plant site is on the west side of FM 523, near the intersection of FM 523 and State Highway 332, approximately two miles north of the City of Freeport, Brazoria County,

Texas.

Item 11. APPLICATION BY BRAZOS ELECTRIC POWER COOPERATIVE, INC. for renewal of Permit No. 01903 which authorizes a discharge of once through cooling water at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 400,000,000 gallons per day via Outfall 001. The permit also authorizes a flow variable discharge of low volume wastewater via Outfall 002. Plus, Outfall 003 authorizes flow variable discharges of low volume wastewater and previously monitored effluents. The applicant operates a steam electric generating station known as the Randle W. Miller plant. The plant site is on the west shore of Lake Palo Pinto, which is three miles east of Farm-to-Market Road 919, and approximately 11 miles north of the City of Gordon, Palo Pinto County, Texas.

Item 12. APPLICATION BY CANYON REGIONAL WATER AUTHORITY, LAKE DUNLAP TREATMENT PLANT for renewal of Permit No. 02912 which authorizes a discharge of treated wastewater at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 95,000 gallons per day. The plant site is just upstream of Lake Dunlap Dam on the south side of Lake Dunlap (Guadalupe River); approximately 3.6 miles south-southeast of the intersection of Interstate Highway 35 and Farm-to-Market Road 725 in Guadalupe County, Texas.

Item 13. APPLICATION BY CARGILL INCORPORATED for renewal of Permit No. 12231-01 which authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 50,000 gallons per day from the Jacintoport Grain Elevator Wastewater Treatment Facilities. The plant site is at 16150 Peninsula Boulevard, approximately 3300 feet southeast of the intersection of Jacintoport Boulevard and Peninsula Boulevard in Harris County, Texas.

Item 14. APPLICATION BY CONOCO PIPE LINE COMPANY, GREENVILLE STATION for renewal of Permit No. 02875 which authorizes a discharge of stormwater at a volume variable with rainfall from a petroleum product storage and transfer facility. The plant site is adjacent to Farm to Market Road 36, approximately 1-1/2 miles north of the intersection of U.S. Highway 30 and Farm to Market Road 36, and approximately two miles southeast of the City of Caddo Mills, Hunt County, Texas.

Item 15. APPLICATION BY DIAMOND SHAMROCK REFINING AND MARKETING COMPANY, CORPUS CHRISTI REFINED PRODUCTS TERMINAL for renewal of Permit No. 02857 which authorizes an intermittent flow variable discharge of stormwater runoff plus rack wash water and tank bottom from a petroleum products storage and distribution terminal. The plant site is at 2700 Texaco Road, approximately 1/2 mile north and 1/2 mile west of the High Bridge crossing the Corpus Christi Inner Harbor outside the City of Corpus Christi in Nueces County, Texas.

Item 16. APPLICATION BY HOUSTON LIGHTING AND POWER COMPANY, CHANNELVIEW SERVICE CENTER for renewal of Permit No. 02499 which authorizes a discharge of washdown water and domestic sewage at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 1,600 gallons per day from the Channelview Service Center plant. The plant site is immediately north of IH 10 between Dell Dale Street and Penn City Road and further defined as located approximately 7 miles east of Loop 610 in the City of Houston, Harris County, Texas.

Item 17. APPLICATION BY CITY OF MART for renewal of Permit No. 10645-01 which authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 350,000 gallons per day. The wastewater treatment facilities is on the west side of the City of Mart, approximately 2,000 feet south of State Highway 164 and 1,500 feet east of Farm-to-Market Road 1860 in McLennan County, Texas.

Item 18. APPLICATION BY CITY OF ORANGE for renewal of Permit No. 10626-01 which authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 2,900,000 gallons per day from the Jackson Street Wastewater Treatment Facilities. The plant site is at 402 South 10th Street, between Jackson Street and Polk Avenue and approximately 1,800 feet west of Farm-to-Market Road 1006 (Border Street) in Orange County, Texas.

Item 19. APPLICATION BY PABTEX, INC., DBA PABTEX TERMINAL COMPANY for renewal of Permit No. 01702 which authorizes a discharge of stormwater runoff at a volume not to exceed a maximum flow of 2,160,000 gallons per day when the freeboard in the surrounding ditch exceeds one foot and a volume not to exceed a maximum flow of 14,400,000 gallons per day when the freeboard is less than one foot. The applicant operates a marine cargo handling facility that stores and loads soft coal and petroleum coke. The plant site is 1000 feet west of the Sabine Neches Canal, 5000 feet southwest of the Kansas City Southern R.R. and 7500 feet northeast of the Port Arthur city limits, and 0.25 mile southeast of the City of Groves, Jefferson County, Texas.

Item 20. APPLICATION BY QUANTUM CHEMICAL CORPORATION for renewal of Permit No. 02457 which authorizes intermittent flow variable discharges of stormwater runoff from the Deer Park Terminal, which is a bulk chemical storage and shipment facility. The plant site is north of and adjacent to Strang Road, approximately 1/2 mile east of the Miller Cutoff Road/Strang Road intersection, Harris County, Texas.

Item 21. APPLICATION BY REICHHOLD CHEMICALS, INC. for renewal of Permit No. 00662 which authorizes a discharge of treated process, utility and stormwater at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 100,000 gallons per day from their Polyester and Alkyd Resins production units and wastes generated by BLT Specialty

Resins Corporation which manufactures Formaldehyde. The plant site is at 1503 Haden Road in the City of Houston, Harris County, Texas.
