UNCONTESTED (Class 2 Modification to Hazardous Waste 50233)

- Item 1. Consideration of an application by SAFETY-KLEEN CORPORATION Corpus Christi Plant for Class 2 Modifications to Permit No. HW-50233 in accordance with 31 TAC Section 305.69. Safety-Kleen operates a commercial hazardous waste recycling facility. The facility is located at 3820 Bratton Road, Corpus Christi in Nueces County, Texas.

UNCONTESTED (Municipal Solid Waste Permit)

- Item 2. APPLICATION BY CITY OF FLOYDADA for a municipal solid waste permit (Proposed Permit No. MSW2207) to authorize a Type I (landfill) municipal solid waste management facility to dispose of municipal solid waste, special waste and various types of nonhazardous industrial waste. Authorized wastes are to be accepted at an initial rate of approximately 14 tons per day. This rate is not expected to exceed an average of 20 tons per day over the total life of the site. The site is to be on a 48.99 acre site, east-southeast of Floydada, 1.5 miles east of the intersection of U.S. Highway 62/70 and Farm-to-Market Road 1958, and 0.3 mile south of U.S. Highway 62/70 in Floyd County, Texas.

- Item 3. APPLICATION BY RECYCLE WITH KIM COR HAULING, INC. for a municipal solid waste permit (Proposed Permit No. MSW2206) to authorize a Type V (materials recovery facility and transfer station) municipal solid waste management facility to process waste from Llano and Burnet Counties. Authorized wastes are to be processed at a rate not to exceed 10 tons per day. The site is to be on a 0.92 acre site, approximately 150 feet west of Farm-to-Market Road 1431, at a point approximately 2 miles north of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Road 1431 and Farm-to-Market Road 2900, at 167 Industrial Boulevard in the City of Kingsland, Llano County, Texas.

UNCONTESTED (Water Quality Permits)

- Item 4. APPLICATION BY EVANS MEAT COMPANY OF TEXAS for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 03574) to authorize disposal of industrial wastewater and stormwater from a meat packing plant by irrigation on 190 acres of land. Wastewater is discharged

to a holding pond and stormwater is discharged into a retention pond prior to irrigation. Application rates for the irrigated land are not to exceed 0.84 inches/acre/month. The plant site is at 2150 East 37th Street in the City of San Angelo, Tom Green County, Texas.

Item 5. APPLICATION BY TEXACO PIPELINE INC. for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 03530) to authorize an intermittent flow variable discharge of stormwater and treated industrial wastewater. The applicant operates a petroleum products tank station. The plant site is on Old West Port Arthur Road at the intersection of State Highways 73 and 823 in the City of Port Arthur, Jefferson County, Texas.

Item 6. APPLICATION BY THE WOODLANDS CORPORATION for a permit (Proposed Permit No. 13614-01) to authorize a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 610,000 gallons per day. The proposed wastewater treatment facilities will serve the Wood Trace Development. The plant site is approximately 2,500 feet west of the Chicago Rock Island and Pacific Railroad, 1,500 feet northeast of the Missouri Pacific Railroad, 5,000 feet northeast of State Highway 149 (proposed State Highway 249), and approximately 1.5 miles east of Pinehurst in Montgomery County, Texas.

UNCONTESTED (Amendment to Water Quality Permits)

Item 7. APPLICATION BY CITY OF LINDEN for an amendment to Permit No. 10429-03 to authorize an increase in the discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent from a volume not to exceed an average flow of 310,000 gallons per day to a volume not to exceed an average flow of 450,000 gallons per day. The plant site is approximately 7000 feet southeast of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Road 125 and U.S. Highway 59 (Jefferson Highway) in Cass County, Texas.

Item 8. APPLICATION BY BUFORD MOONEY for an amendment to Permit No. 11589-01 to authorize an increase in the discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent from a volume not to exceed an average flow of 50,000 gallons per day to a volume not to exceed an average flow of 153,000 gallons per day. The Country Squire Wastewater Treatment Facilities are immediately west of State Highway 87, approximately 4.5 miles north of the intersection of State Highway 87 and Interstate Highway 10 and approximately 6.9 miles north of the business district of the City of Orange in Orange County, Texas.

Item 9. APPLICATION BY OCCIDENTAL CHEMICAL CORPORATION for an amendment to Permit No. 01539 in order to add a stormwater outfall (Outfall 002). The permit currently authorizes a discharge of process wastewater, cooling tower blowdown, stormwater, washwater, and sanitary sewage at a volume not to

exceed an average flow of 2,150,000 gallons per day, which will remain the same. The applicant operates a chloro-alkali manufacturing plant. The plant site is on the east side of State Park Road 1836 (Vista Road), approximately 1000 feet north of the intersection with State Highway 134 (Battleground Road) in the City of La Porte, Harris County, Texas.

Item 10. APPLICATION BY THE GOODYEAR TIRE & RUBBER COMPANY for an amendment to Permit No. 00519 to authorize an increase in the discharge of treated process wastewater and stormwater via Outfall 001 from a volume not to exceed an average flow of 2,500,000 gallons per day to an average flow not to exceed 3,000,000 gallons per day. The proposed amendment will also add two additional outfalls (Outfall 003 and 004) to regulate an intermittent flow variable discharge of stormwater runoff. The permit currently authorizes a flow variable discharge of stormwater runoff via Outfall 002, which will remain the same. The applicant operates a petrochemical plant producing crumb rubber and other products. The plant site is south of Interstate 10 (between IH 10 and State Highway 124) approximately 10 miles southwest of the City of Beaumont in Jefferson County, Texas.

Item 11. APPLICATION BY CITY OF LAREDO for a minor amendment to Permit No. 10681-03 to receive, process and dispose of wastewater sludge generated from five wastewater treatment plants: 1). the Columbia Bridge Wastewater Treatment Plant (Permit No. 10681-006), 2). Unitec Industrial Park Wastewater Treatment Plant (Permit No. 10681-005), 3). the North Laredo Wastewater Treatment Plant (Permit No. 10681-004), 4). Webb County Detention Center Wastewater Treatment Plant (Permit No. 12271-001) and 5). the El Cenizo Wastewater Treatment Plant (Permit No. 13577-001). The permit currently authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a final volume not to exceed an average flow of 9,900,000 gallons per day, which shall remain the same. The plant site is approximately 3500 feet east of U.S. Highway 83 and 3.2 miles south of the intersection of U.S. Highway 83 and State Highway 20 in southwest Webb County, Texas.

Item 12. APPLICATION BY CITY OF BIG LAKE for renewal of Permit No. 10038-01 which authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 600,000 gallons per day. The wastewater treatment facilities are south of and adjacent to US Highway 67; approximately 1/2 mile southeast of the intersection of US Highway 67 and State Highway 137 in Reagan County, Texas.

Item 13. APPLICATION BY CITY OF CLEBURNE for renewal of Permit No. 10006-02 which authorizes a discharge of backwash water

effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 50,000 gallons per day from the surface water treatment facilities. The plant site is on County Road 1111, approximately two miles southwest of the City of Cleburne in Johnson County, Texas.

Item 14. APPLICATION BY CITY PUBLIC SERVICE OF SAN ANTONIO for renewal of Permit No. 01517 which authorizes the discharge of cooling tower blowdown and previously monitored effluents at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 1,000,000 gallons per day from the Leon Creek Steam Electric Station. The plant site is at 7118 Quintana Road at Pitluk Avenue in the City of San Antonio in Bexar County, Texas.

Item 15.
