Consideration of the application by the **Moscow Water Supply Corporation** for a major amendment and renewal of Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) Permit No. WQ0011139001 to authorize a relocation of Outfall 001. The existing permit authorizes the discharge of treated domestic wastewater with a daily average flow not to exceed 40,000 gallons per day. The wastewater treatment facility is located at approximately 600 feet southeast of the intersection of U.S. Highway 59 and Loop 177 in the City of Moscow, in **Polk County**, Texas. The Commission will also consider requests for hearing or reconsideration, related responses and replies, public comment, and the Executive Director's Response to Comments. (Claudia Russell/Kent H. Trede)

Grant the hearing requests of the McManus Group on the issues of: 1. whether the proposed discharge violates the antidegradation policy found in 30 TAC Section 307.5; 2. whether nutrient loading will be increased; 3. whether the effluent limits support attainable uses; 4. whether the effluent limits support contact recreation; and 5. whether Applicant's compliance history warrants denial of the application; deny the request for reconsideration and refer the matter to SOAH with a maximum hearing duration of six months.
