The adopted rulemaking would also modify the permitting requirements for new source dry litter poultry CAFOs and expanding dry litter poultry animal feeding operations (AFOs) for consistency with TCEQ regulations regarding existing dry litter poultry CAFOs. The proposed rules were published in the May 19, 2006, issue of the *Texas Register* (31 TexReg 4166). (Beth Helms, Bob Brush) (Rule Project No. 2005-062-321-PR)
