The proposed Water Use Permit No. 5832 would authorize the Applicant to maintain three dams and reservoirs having a combined surface area of 12 acres and impounding a total of 78 acre-feet of water on unnamed tributaries of Wilson Creek, tributary of the East Fork Trinity River, tributary of the Trinity River, for in-place recreational purposes in **Collin County**, Texas. The proposed reservoirs currently exist as exempt reservoirs pursuant to Chapter 30 Texas Water Code, § 11.142. The Applicant would be required to maintain the reservoirs full, at all times, with an alternative supply of water and maintain suitable outlets in the dams to allow for the free passage of State water that the Applicant is not authorized to impound. The Commission will also consider hearing requests, related responses and replies, and public comment. (Craig Mikes, Ross Henderson)

LCRA's Permit No. 5715 allows it to divert water from the Colorado River into Lometa Reservoir, and then use that water for municipal and domestic water supply in **Lampasas, Burnet, Mills, and San Saba Counties**. Special Condition No. 5(b) of Permit No. 5715 establishes minimum instream flow requirements below which LCRA is not allowed to divert water. LCRA is requesting that the Special Condition be suspended to allow LCRA to divert water for 120 days so the Lometa Reservoir may be filled. LCRA states that it needs the requested emergency authorization because it is running out of water in the reservoir, a condition which presents an imminent threat to the public health, safety and welfare, and that it has no feasible, practicable alternatives to this emergency authorization.
