TEMPORARY ORDER

economic loss to others; and the discharge will not present a significant hazard to the uses that may be made of the receiving waters after the discharge. If the Temporary Order is granted, the unpermitted discharge must comply with all provisions in TPDES Permit No. WQ0014555002 issued on November 1, 2007, whether or not TPDES Permit No. WQ0014555002 is revoked. The Commission will also consider any requests for hearing, as well as any timely filed briefs submitted by the District, Executive Director, Office of Public Interest Counsel, or affected persons on the Temporary Order. (John Williams, Firoj Vahora)

Grant the hearing requests of Suzanne O'Neal and Judith Spencer; refer the Temporary Order application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings for a hearing; remand the PFD on the Petition to Revoke to the State Office of Administrative Hearings; direct the ALJ to consider whether issuance of a Temporary Order is appropriate under applicable TCEQ rules and statutes in Tex. Water Code Chapter 5 and 30 TAC Chapter 35, and include specific consideration of the following: A) Whether the Executive Director's proposed Temporary Order includes appropriate terms and conditions; B) Whether the proposed Temporary Order is appropriate given the requirements of 30 TAC Section 35.303; C) Whether there are feasible alternatives to a discharge under the Temporary Order; and D) Whether suspension of Far Hills permit may be appropriate in lieu of revocation; direct the ALJ to submit a PFD and proposed Order on the Temporary Order application, as well as any supplemental PFD on the Petition to Revoke, if necessary, to the Commission within 3 months; and direct the Executive Director to participate in the hearing. BG/CR; all agree.

The adoption would require applicants to provide additional information and to request input from local government authorities as a part of an application for a land reclamation project using tires (LRPUT) or for a scrap tire facility. Groundwater districts would be added to the list of entities to be notified of LRPUT applications. Applicants would be required to provide proof of notice to local government officials and the executive director would be prohibited from authorizing a facility if a local government provides timely notice that a proposed facility does not comply with local

requirements relating to management of scrap tires and protection of public health and the environment. Other changes include: requiring a demonstration of the seasonal high groundwater level in the area, and authorizing the executive director to request additional information about groundwater levels at the site, prior to approval of a LRPUT; specifying that LRPUTs are subject to annulment, suspension, revocation, denial and motions to overturn; allowing submittal of electronic application documents; clarifying the requirement to split, quarter or shred off-the-road tires before disposal but allowing the executive director to grant exceptions as warranted by circumstance; and, administrative changes including updating references to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality rather than the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission, updating address information, and updating references to the Chapter 50 rules. This rulemaking would also repeal outdated portions of the rules. The proposed rules were published in the April 16, 2010, issue of the *Texas Register* 35 (TexReg 2991). (Brooke Jackson, Steve Shepherd) (Rule Project No. 2008-034-328-CE)

Adopt the amendments to, and repealed sections of, 30 TAC Chapter 328 with the following changes: add the language requiring notice to adjacent counties back into the requirements in 30 TAC Section 328.66(a)(11) and decline to make any change to the newspaper notice requirements for LRPUT applications, as the recommended change exceeds the scope of this rulemaking. Direct the Executive Director to make corresponding changes to the preamble. Amend the language proposed by the Executive Director for adoption in Sections 328.63(d)(2), 328.63(d)(4), 328.66(a)(10) and 328.66(d) with the language circulated to clarify that the Executive Director must consider any local government timely written notice of noncompliance regarding the proposed facility prior to authorizing a LRPUT or scrap tire facility and direct the Executive Director to make corresponding changes to the preamble. BG/CR; all agree.

Item 81. Docket No. 2009-2033-RUL. Consideration of the adoption of amendments to Section 106.4 of 30 TAC Chapter 106, Permits by Rule and Sections 116.110 and 116.610 of 30 TAC Chapter 116, Control of Air Pollution by Permits for New Construction or Modification and corresponding revisions to the state implementation plan. The adoption would amend 30 TAC Chapters 106 and 116: to prevent, with certain exceptions, an applicant for a permit under Texas Health and Safety Code (THSC), Section 382.0518, Preconstruction Permit, from withdrawing that application and immediately using a standard permit or PBR to avoid public notice requirements; and to prevent the use of a standard permit or PBR as an immediate precursor to the construction of a facility requiring a permit under THSC, Section 382.0518. This rulemaking would also clarify rule language to ensure that projects at a site where a PBR was used as an authorization comply with the 25/250 tons per year emission limit unless at least one facility at the site has undergone public notice. The proposed rules were published in the April 30, 2010, issue of the *Texas Register* (35 TexReg 3447). (Blake Stewart, Ben Rhem) (Rule Project No. 2009-016-116-PR)

Remanded to the Executive Director.

Item 82. <u>Docket No. 2009-1978-RUL</u>. Consideration for adoption of an amendment to Section 106.283, Grain Handling, Storage, and Drying, of **30 TAC Chapter 106**, Permits by Rule; and the repeal of Section 106.302, Portable Pipe Reactor. The rulemaking would repeal Section 106.302 in its entirety, and revise Section 106.283 to exclude the authorization of commercial grain handling

facilities. The proposed rules were published in the March 26, 2010 issue of the *Texas Register* (35 TexReg 2503). (Michael Wilhoit, Christine Angeletti) (Rule Project No. 2009-025-106-PR)

Adopt the amendments to 30 TAC Section 106.283 and the repeal of Section 106.302, as recommended by the Executive Director. CR/BG; all agree.

Item 83. Docket No. 2009-1898-RUL. Consideration for adoption of new Section 116.17 and the amendments to Sections 116.10, 116.111, 116.116, and 116.117 of 30 TAC Chapter 116, Control of Air Pollution by Permits for New Construction or Modification, and corresponding revisions to the state implementation plan (SIP). The commission withdraws from consideration the amendment to 30 TAC §116.118. Sections 116.10(5)(F), 116.111(a)(2)(K), 116.116(b)(3), and 116.117(a)(4)(B) will not be submitted as revisions to the SIP. The revisions to the SIP also include a supplementary document submitted as a demonstration under Federal Clean Air Act, 42 United States Code, Section 7410(1). Consideration for adoption of an amendment to Section 330.983 of 30 TAC Chapter 330, Municipal Solid Waste. The rulemaking addresses deficiencies in the definition of best available control technology and the qualified facility air permitting program as identified by the United States Environmental Protection Agency in the April 14, 2010 issue of the *Federal Register* (75 Federal Register 19468). The proposed rules were published in the April 16, 2010 issue of the *Texas Register* (25 TexReg 2978 and 3002). (Beecher Cameron/Amy Browning) (Rule Project No. 2010-006-116-PR)

Adopt the amendments to 30 TAC Sections 116.10, 116.111, 116.116 and 116.117 and 30 TAC Section 330.983; adopt new 30 TAC Section 116.17 and adopt the corresponding SIP revisions in supplementary document to be submitted as a demonstration under Federal Clean Air Act Section 7410(1), as recommended by the Executive Director. CR/BG; all agree.

Item 84. **Docket No. 2009-2046-RUL**. Consideration of the adoption of the amendments to **30 TAC Chapter 25**, Environmental Testing Laboratory Accreditation and Certification, §§25.1, 25.2, 25.4, 25.9, 25.10, 25.14, 25.20, 25.22, 25.24, 25.32, and 25.34; and the repeal of §25.36. The adopted rulemaking would change the applicable standards for accrediting environmental testing laboratories, establish the date on which the change in accreditation standards would become effective, revise fees and fee categories, establish the date on which the revised fees and fee categories would become effective, clarify that laboratories operated by the commission are exempt from fees, clarify when certain miscellaneous fees are applied, remove language in the rules that is no longer needed, and revise language in the rules to make the rules clearer, more consistent, and bring them up-to-date. The proposed rules were published in the April 30, 2010, issue of the *Texas Register* (35 TexReg 3430). (Steve Stubbs, Kathy Humphreys) (Rule Project No. 2010-009-025-CE)

Adopt the amendments to and the repeal 30 TAC Chapter 25 regarding Environmental Testing Laboratory Accreditation and Certification, as recommended by the Executive Director. CR/BG; all agree.

Item 85. Docket No. 2010-0380-RUL. Consideration for publication of and public hearing on: proposed amendments to Sections 334.42, 334.45, 334.49, and 334.50; and a new Subchapter N, Sections 334.601 - 334.606 of 30 TAC Chapter 334, Underground and Aboveground Storage Tanks. The proposed new Subchapter N would incorporate the Underground Storage Tank (UST) facility operator training requirements for on-site operation and maintenance of UST systems as established in federal law. The proposed amendments apply to Subchapter C of existing rules

and would amend various existing technical UST requirements to: provide a more specific description of which existing and new sumps and manways need to be inspected, monitored or tested and kept free of liquid or debris; increase the amount of time allowed for the removal of liquid and debris from sumps and manways from 72 to 96 hours; increase the amount of existing underground line which can be replaced without having to secondarily contain it from 20% to 35%; limit the maximum amount of existing underground line which must be secondarily contained during replacement; clearly specify that submerged metal components such as submersible pump housings which are in contact with water must be protected from corrosion by means other than just coating or wrapping them; and eliminate the requirement for large airports which use extensive fuel hydrant systems to comply with automatic line leak detection requirements because there are no practical methodologies available which will provide this function. (Anton Rozsypal, Cullen McMorrow) (Rule Project No. 2010-017-334-CE)

Approve publication of, and public hearing on, proposed amendments to Sections 334.42, 334.45, 334.49, and 334.50 and new Subchapter N, Sections 334.601-334.606, as recommended by the Executive Director. CR/BG; all agree.
