The rulemaking will also provide for equivalent alternative options to meet the fee obligation. Major stationary sources are subject to paying a fee of \$5,000, as adjusted by the consumer price index, per ton in excess of 80% of a baseline amount of VOC, NOX, or both. The fee will be due annually until the area is redesignated attainment, has a design value of attainment, or other action by the United States Environmental Protection Agency to end the fee program. The rulemaking also includes a provision to allow the executive director to place the fee in abeyance when the area's design value does not exceed the one-hour ozone NAAQS.
