adequate of fluid limits to prevent algal growth and eutrophication water bodies downstream from the facility; e) Whether the proposed discharge under the draft permit will negatively impact the unnamed tributary during seasonal flow; and Set the hearing duration of 180 days from the date of the preliminary hearing until the Proposal for Decision is issued. SECTION 46.035 OF THE TEXAS PENAL CODE PROHIBITS HANDGUN LICENSEES FROM CARRYING THEIR HANDGUNS AT GOVERNMENT MEETINGS SUCH AS THIS ONE. THIS PROHIBITION APPLIES TO BOTH CONCEALED CARRY AND OPEN CARRY BY HANDGUN LICENSEES.
